

SHIPMENTS—Our normal period of forwarding bulbs begins about August 15th and continues until October 15th. However by special arrangement we can make shipments as late as November 15th. Bulbs will be forwarded by freight or express as desired. Safe arrival guaranteed.

TULIP BULB SIZES—"Top Size" or No. 1 (11/2" Up) tulip

bulbs are primarily for the Florist trade for forcing under glass. The No. II size  $(1\frac{1}{4}"$  to  $\frac{1}{2}")$  are ideal for outdoor use or for cut flowers.

**TERMS**— 2% discount 10 days from date of invoice; 60 days NET. No charge for packing and cases. Where satisfactory credit arrangements have not been made—cash with order or C. O. D. All bulbs listed berein are sold f.o.b. Canby.

**SPECIAL**—5% discount for remittance with order.
