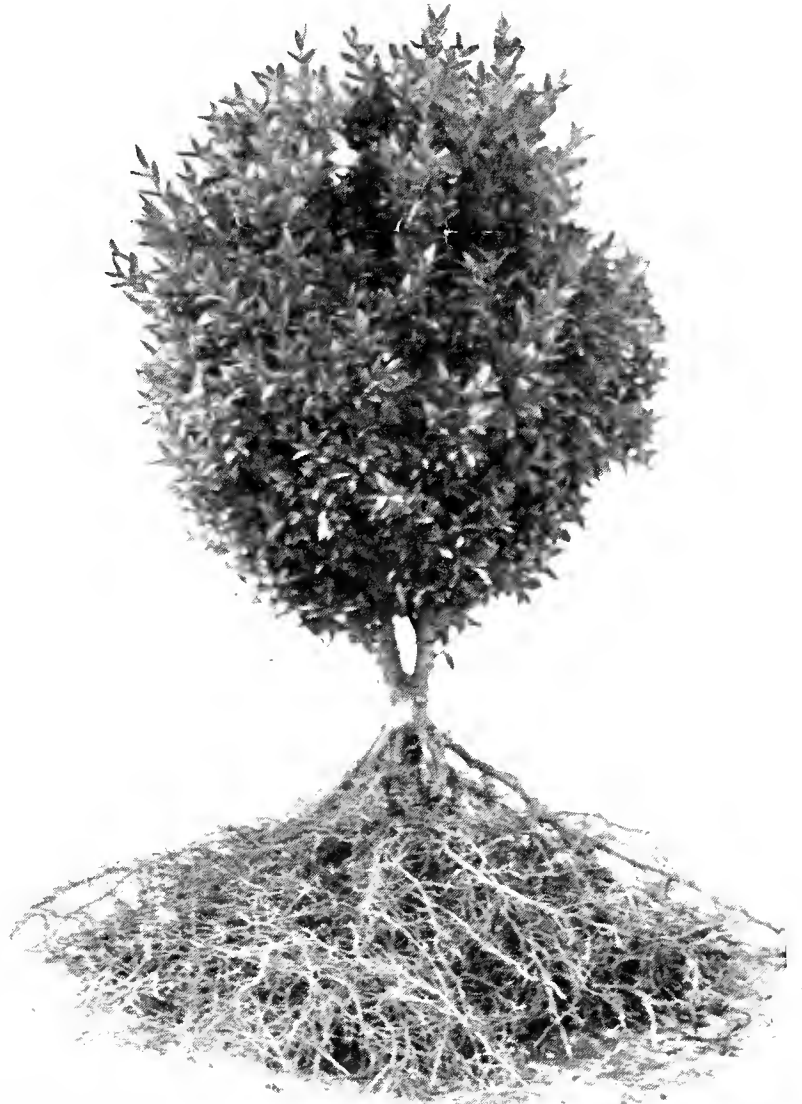

Buxus sempervirens

(BUSH BOXWOOD)

THESE beautiful, dark-green, heavily-foliaged plants are steadily gaining in popularity year by year. They have the richest color of all varieties of boxwood. They grow quite rapidly and branch heavily if they are properly clipped. This type of boxwood is the ideal hedge plant, particularly if it is permitted to grow freely. In mixed or foundation plantings, its dense foliage of rich green color throughout the year provides a uniform, harmonious background to accentuate some beautiful architectural effect or a piece of garden statuary. During the last few years, a more general appreciation of the landscaping possibilities of this magnificent plant has greatly increased the popularity of *Buxus sempervirens*.

Topiary Forms

THESE are sheared forms of *Buxus sempervirens* and are not to be confused with the light green, western-grown *Buxus japonica*. These are of the rich, deep-green color and heavy foliage characteristic of all Canterbury *Buxus sempervirens* plants. These plants have had very careful and expert attention; they are heavily foliaged to the center of each plant; their shapes are true and sizes are most accurate. Topiary forms of *Buxus sempervirens* are most effective in large jardiniere plantings or in formal lawn or garden arrangements.

Buxus suffruticosa

(OLD ENGLISH OR DWARF BOXWOOD)

B *uxus suffruticosa*—Dwarf or Old English Boxwood—is unrivaled for low hedges or edgings. Its slow growth makes it easy to hold these plants to small dimensions and a minimum of trimming makes them branch heavily to form a solid mass of foliage. *Buxus suffruticosa* is widely used for walk borders, garden edgings, porch or window box planting—and if this plant is permitted to grow freely without pruning it gradually becomes a magnificent mass of billowing foliage. In all formal garden arrangements, *Buxus suffruticosa* is the ideal shrub to form the sharp, close-cropped outline of a geometric pattern.

Boxwood has a greater historical background than practically any other decorative shrub. It was thought to have been used in the gardens of the Near East long before the birth of Christ. Roman Emperors and patricians had its dense, compact foliage clipped to form living statues. Landscape architects of early France and Spain made beautiful use of boxwood in the elaborate formal gardens, made famous by romantic and historic novels. To its very general use in the gardens of England, one form of this splendid old plant family owes the name by which it is usually known—Old English Boxwood . . .
