There will no doubt be an inflation of all commodities and nursery stock will raise in price along with everything else. Our prices are the lowest that they have ever been, and we advise you to take advantage of them now. We reserve the right to change prices anytime during the year.

Our Guarantee.

Our nursery stock is guaranteed for one year with free replacement, where properly planted and given care and attention during the summer. Free planting instructions sent out with each order.

Transportation

We prepay all transportation charges where cash is sent in previous to time of delivery, except on balled and burlapped evergreen stock, which is generally shipped by freight, F.O.B. Rapid City. If left to our judgement we will adapt the best method of transportation.

Payment.

Payment may be made by check, money order, bank draft, or cash. 25% down on C.O.D. orders, ballance at time of delivery.

Tree Trimming.

We are equiped to handle your tree-trimming and tree surgery work. If your trees are not healthy and require attention, call upon us and we will be glad to advise you to the best of our ability.

Spraying.

We are equiped with a barrel spray out-fit and can spray your fruit and shade trees. All fruit trees require one or two sprayings if you expect to have fruit free from worms and scab. Local people get in touch with us and we will advise as to best time to spray.

Leaf-rollers and aphids are very bad on Am. Elm and will injure the trees if not controlled. Trees should be sprayed early, just after leaves open and again later. See that your trees are kept healthy.

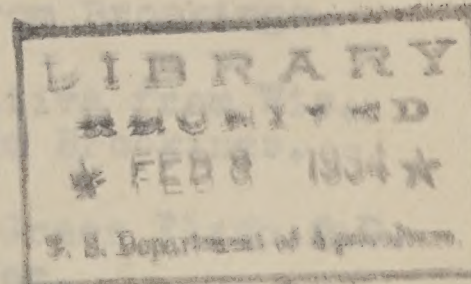
