1934 - - WHAT?

This seems to be a question receiving much attention. Undoubtedly prospects are much brighter than those of the season just past; which to many has proven much better than expected at this time last year. The principle need for the present however, is better stock, well grown and priced right. It is to this end we dedicate this little Annual, and trust that you will find it of both interest and value.

Harrold's Pedigreed Pansies, in both seeds and plants, have been outstanding in their field for years and 1934 finds them facing the most advanced development of their career. As this is written, seed production is advancing almost a month ahead of our usual season and the quality of the mother plants is very high. Rigid reselection of all varieties, plus breeding advances and improved cultural methods tend to grow into our Harrold's Pedigreed Strain seeds that vitality for which they are famous.

Our practice of grading our Pansy seeds to very close limits, which has proven so successful in the past two years is being continued this season. While this reduces the actual number of seeds you may receieve in a given weight quantity. Experience has shown that a larger number of the seeds you do receieve grow, so that in reality under actual planting conditions that are at all favorable plant production runs quite high. This is illustrated by the fact that ordinary commercial quality seeds are seldom expected to produce more than 5 to 7 thousand plants per ounce. Eight thousand plants per ounce from Harrold's Pedigreed Strain seeds are the rule rather than the exception, and often many more are obtained. As many as 18,000 have been reported from a single ounce, and one large wholesale plant grower using our seeds reports an estimated production of 10,500 plants per ounce from 27 ounces supplied to him in 1933.

In spite of the fact that we have for years stored our seeds under the most favorable conditions; during 1933 tests were concluded as to the effect of the various methods of storing Pansy seeds. These tests definitly show that Pansy seeds should not for any great period of time be stored in tightly sealed containers. A moderate amount of ventilation seems essential. The ideal storage container is cloth bags. In these the seeds may be kept indefinently with little deterioration at regular room temperature. While economey and convenience dictates the use of paper packets as shipping containers, seeds should not be left stored in these for any prolonged period. Storage in tightly sealed paper packets has been known to result in a viability loss epualing that of 3 to 4 years when proper care is taken, in periods as short as 6 months. We have successfully under test stored seed in cloth containers for four years with losses not exceeding 10 percent of its original viability. Size grading and the general high quality of our Southern Oregon grown seeds of course may be a contributing factor to such long life. Storage in subdued light seems advisable.

Due to the above conditions, we are discontinuing the placing of our Pansy seed stocks with dealers as in the past. Hereafter dealers can supply Harrold's Pedigreed Strain Pansy seeds as usual; with the exception that seeds will be shipped direct from our warehouse to you. This not only assures proper storage and packeting, but permits us to keep the same close check on viability of all seeds sent out that has prevailed on direct orders in the past. It is also double assurance that you receive genuine stock. Should you wish to order Harrold's Pansies through your dealer rather than direct, he may procure them for direct shipment at our usual dealer discount.

Every packet of Harrold's Pansy seeds are accompanied by a complete data sheet which in case of correspondence will permit immediate identification of the stock contained therein. Be sure seeds you receive as ours are so identified and retain this identification card or packet as your record in case you should wish to write regarding the stock.

In closing we should also like to call your attention to the several items of Florist Flower seeds and bulb specialties that have been added to this Annual The greatest care has been exercised in the selection of these for the highest possible quality, and every item not actually grown in our own gardens comes from an outstanding specialist in the industry. Modest overhead and the devotion of personal attention to supplying your fine seed needs enables us to offer quality at very reasonable prices. Our north-western grown bulbs of course need little praise as they have built their demand on performance.

SEED GRADES

It will be noted that in most cases, two grades of seeds are offered in the Harrold's Pedigreed Strain line of Pansies. As in the past, these two grades differ in the following respects.

HARROLD'S STANDARD GRADE SEEDS.

These are the striaght commercial stock of which about 98 per cent of cur seed production consists. It will be found in every case strictly of the highest quality. It is suitable for all growing compared with any other commercially available seeds and is the best grade for your regular planting

HARROLD'S PEDIGREED GRADE SEEDS.

As the name implies, these are a super-select segregation from our breeding work. It is from this grade of stock that selections are made for next years seed production plants. These seeds are all saved from the first seeds to set on the plants which have been selected for this particular purpose. Color blending is done after curing and cleaning, and in every way this grade should represent the ultimate in available quality. Highly recommended to those who want the absolute cream of the crop, or wish to keep in advance of the usual commercial strains. The supply of this grade is necessarly limited and can be supplied only so long as available.

THE ABOVE QUALITY GRADE

Should not be confused with our grading of seeds to size mentioned elsewhere in this catalogue. ALL Harrold's Pedigreed Strain Pansy seeds are size graded for added production. Costing little if any more than ungraded seeds, the increased viability values brought about by this process adds value for you in the form of higher production levels.

This is one of our outstanding developments. It is we believe, the first definent step toward development of a Pansy suitable for culture as pot or box specimens. Under proper culture they will produce a short compact plant which bears large, well formed flowers. Flower size consistantly developed is between 2 1-2 and 3 1-4 inches, and coloring is sufficently varied to be of highest value for early spring pots and use in porch boxes. Robust foliage, and early flowering habits makes a combination suiting this sort for consideration when growing Pansies for these purposes.

HARROLD'S PEDIGREED CUT-FLOWER PANSIES

This is another development exclusive to the Harrold line of Pansies, being so far as we know the only commercially available sort which has been bred definently for this purpose. While when grown indoors as a cut flower subject, they do not develop extreme super sized flowers, but large quantities of flowers from 2 to 3 inches are produced, with long stiff stems ranging from 6 to 11 inches on well grown stock. Past experience leads us to believe that this variety is not as desirable for outdoor culture for cut flowers as our Harrold's Pedigreed Giants, as the outdoor growing tends to restrict the advantage of this variety. They come in a wide range of colors, both of the zoned and blotched type, selected to produce flowers that will meet best the average cut flower demand.

Separate Color Pansies

Pansies in separate colors are in but moderate demand, and, while a wide range of these are available in the old fashioned Teimardeau strains, demands have been so limited that commercial segregation to color from modern super-giant varieties have been necessarly limited. Also, due to the fact that the growing of mixed colors permits a heavier production of hybrid types, it is seldom that segregated colors are equal to simular color types selected from mixtures. We offer here three exceptionally fine separate color types from the Harrold's Pedigreed Strain Line, and the popular separate color Swiss types will be found listed on page 14.

Due to the fact that nearly all of the modern super-giant varieties are the results of long lines of hybrid breeding, trueing up a separate color is a long task and few of these varieties have been available long enough to have been segregated sufficently to come completely true to color and type from seeds. Variations of as much as 20 per cent may occasionally occure, so if plants of strictly true color and type is required, by all means select blooming plants or be prepaired to reset any rogues that may appear. This condition is not only prevelent in our stock, but all other seeds we have tested to date.

HARROLD'S GOLDEN GIANTS

Introduced as our 1933 novelty, this variety has receieved much attention from our trade. Being a fitting companion for our well known Azure and Ruby Giants, it fills a need in a most popular color class. The ground color is an intence golden yellow, and as much "Swiss" blood is in the breeding of this variety the large center blotch predominate. Usually the blotch is of a deep brown or velvety black covering about half of either 3 or 5 petels. A habit of flowering early and over a long period makes this sort desirable. And, as flowers are of large size and heavy texture, almost round in form they are most desirable. Plant habit is compact and sturdy, and they are very hardy.

Here is a variety that has indeed made an outstanding showing in many sections. We submit below comments by one of the several growers who have written us praising this variety, and it is typical of the comments made.

While this sort is not restricted to a single shade of red, it derives its name from the many deep ruby colored flowers produced. At least part of the flowers however are the most beautiful red bronze, orange, wine, maroon, and salmon shaded flowers ever produced in Pansies. And, as "Swiss" blood is the basis of this varieties breeding, most flowers have attractive blotches of contrasting color. These are not quite as hardy as some varieties, but with a little care they may be wintered alright in the open. Due to the rareness of the colors produced, and their appeal they are one of the most valuable varieties for retail sales.

Beautiful Pansies Fine Example of Alluring Blossoms.

A box of beautiful pansies of the Harrold's Ruby Giant variety was brought to the Riverside Press-Enterprise office today by Mr. Robert J. Shine who grew them in his garden at 4230 Central Avenue.

Unusually large and brilliantly colored, the Pansies were made beautiful by a bronze tinting to many of them. Mr. Shine had ingeniously arranged them in a two decked box in which the heads of the flowers lay evenly on top while their stems extended through holes to a layer of wet peat moss in the lower part of the box. The Shine home is a show place for its beautiful garden and lawn, having won honors in the city's yard and garden contest. in the city's yard and garden contest.

COMMENTS MADE BY MR. SHINE:

December 12. 1933.

You will nodoubt care to know how your Pansies came out with me this year. The enclosed clipping will speak for its self. Hot weather held the bloom back somewhat but they are coming along fine now. The display bed where I picked these blooms contained 200 plants and they are coming Have started to sell plants from the seedlings I bought from you and they are bringing 50c a dozen with me while the market is flooded with the ordinary kind at 20c and 25c a dozen.

December 26, 1933.

Am just about sold out of plants. Generally they do not plant many Pansies here after January 15th., as they blow up as soon as the weather gets hot.

March 26. 1934.

I am sending on to you the attached letter which I think will be of interest to you. - Letter is one of apprecation and praise for a box of Pansies sent by Mr. Shine to the Mayor of Riverside. Limited space does not permit its reproduction. Ed. note. This box of Pansies was 2 by 3 feet and I inch deep; lined with florist green waxed tissue. The blooms were uniform in size and long stems arranged face up in a single layer, completly covering the bottom of the box. I arranged the colors so they blended very nicely. I have grown pansies a long time but never anything to compare with these. I applied all I knew to this bed but really success starts with the proper strain of seeds.

I have cut the plants back, fertilized with blood meal and put a heavy mat of peat moss on the bed, soaking well. Our garden contest starts April 20th., and maybe they will be back into bloom by then. I am not entering the contest this year having won it three times in succession, but will open the gardens for the Garden Tours which they have in connection with the Flower Show at that time.

Our Harrold's Pedigreed Giants as supplied to the trade since 1929, have been outstanding in the super-giant class; unsurpassed, if not the absolute finest. Many growers in other countries as well as the U. S. A. have attested to this assertion through the many unsolicited letters received in praise of this variety.

Breeding and improving work has been going on apace every since its introduction as is usual with all of our stock. Four years ago however, one exceptionally outstanding mutation appeared in this variety which showed great promise. Segregated for breeding purposes, and subsiquently developed, this mutation has resulted in the most outstanding advance of our more than 30 years work with Pansies. We offer here the resulting seeds.

Now here is the newness in the method of introduction. Although this variety is sufficently improved and outstanding that it would undoubtedly be offered by many as a new variety or at the least a "SUPER" strain yet we are going to place it at the disposal of our patrons as superceeding our regular Harrold's Pedigreed Giants as supplied last season. And, instead of placing a high introductory price on them, we are pricing them so you can't afford to overlook them. Prices are advanced only \$1.00 per ounce over last seasons, and are in direct competition with all high quality specialist grown sorts. This is being done in appreciation of the valued wide acceptance accorded the parent variety, and the result of having withheld introduction until we could offer our patrons the advantage of mass production and distribution.

SIX POINTS OF IMPROVMENT

EARLINESS: The 1934 series is at least a week earlier flowering from seeds than any other socalled early variety which has been tested against it here in our gardens.

FLOWER SIZE: Is at least 20% larger on an average than the 1932-33 series, with a 10% increase in maximum size produced by the former series. Flowers $4\frac{3}{4}$ inches across have been produced by this variety.

PLANT IMPROVMENT: These are numerous, but the most valuable is a more compact, upright form; with an increase of 25% in foliage size and texture. Of less spreading habit it fulfills our belief that increased flower size must be accompanied by stronger plants to be of value.

LONG STEMS: More robust plants have naturally produced heavier stems; but, unlike usual expectation, the more compact plant habit has not resulted in a shorter stem. In fact stems average about 15% longer than in the parent, with 5 to 10 inch stems when well grown.

COLOR RANGE: This has been greatly brightened by the addition of many new hybride types bringing about a 20% increase in the past color range.

FLOWER FORM: Retention of the round well placed form of heavy texture of the parent, with a higher per-cent of ruffled and frilled forms leaves little to be desired.

HARROLD'S SUNSHINE PANSIES

While not of super-giant size, this variety has become moderately popular owing to its novel coloring. The zones of color instead of being in concentric zones about the center of the flowers, radiates at right angles to the center giving a novel ray effect. See illustration above. The colors are mostly lavender, purple, apricot, orange and cream shade contrasted by many poly-chrome combinations in each of the flowers. This variety prefers semi-shade as some flowers tend to sunburn if planted in full sunlight. Don't plant these in too large numbers as they are not a general purpose variety. About 10 or 15% of your planting is enough.

How Many Seeds Will Be Needed?

It is quite safe with reasonable care, and our Harrold's Pedigreed strain seeds that are size graded to estimate your requirments on a basis of 7,000 plants per ounce of seeds planted. This may seem rather high in view of recommendations made by many specialists and seedsmen, but in our own commercial plantings our production is usually much above this figure. Allow more seeds for a given production in July and August than later in the season. Harrold's Pedigreed Strain seeds offer the maximum value for your seed dollar.

HARROLD'S ALL-AMERICAN BEDDING MIXTURE

In accord with its name, this mixture is we believe the cream of all types of Pansies now being grown by American specialists. About 80% of this mixture is composed of original Harrold Pedigreed Strain varieties; while the rest is seeds harvested each year from our test gardens wherein is grown principal varieties from all over the world for that purpose. Without question, this mixture offers the widest range of color and types found in a single mixture. To be highly recommended where but a single variety is grown.

This Question Of Size

We have bred into all our Harrold grown seeds the maximum in ability to produce exceptional flower size. This is not a baseless assertion but a fact proven by continued checking of all commercial varieties and strains right along side of Harrold's Pansies under identical conditions, and the most expert attention.

Size range, and other sizes mentioned in this Annual are all based on our own personal experience, and have all been produced here in our own gardens. With equal care and suitable soil fertility and moisture, there is no reason why simular results can not be duplicated by the seeds we supply.

It may be well however, to point out here that even with seeds of known and tested quality, outstanding results can not be obtained without reasonable care on the part of the grower who handles the seeds after it passes from the seedsmans care. So, for this reason we say that if you wish the maximum results from Pansies you must carry out your part of the success by supplying fertility, moisture, and care necessary for proper growth. If you are not certain about these points, we shall be glad to offer any suggestions on any point about which you have had trouble, or uncertain In asking for such information, please give complete data on all points that might have any bearing on the questions asked.

Due to the fact that Pansies are one of the most profused and longest flowering plants in your garden, it is essential they be supplied fertility to sustain such habits. While they may be grown successfully in any good well drained garden soil, seldom is a soil found that is not the better for added fertalization. Clover sod produces wonderful Pansies as does liberal application of cow manure. These are things not always available however, so that commercial fertalizers are often neccessary. Liberal use of peatmoss for humus and good soil texture, with Swift's Vigoro for active fertility elements will work wonders in producing fine Pansies. according to directions supplied by the manufactuer, economical to use, and the resulting growth is robust and firm. It is also a fine "pick-me-up" for occasional treatment of beds during the season of heavy flowering; adding new life to plants in such cases. For such use apply 1 to 2 pounds to the 100 square feet of bed, working it into the soil on each side of the plant. With plants that have bloomed out so much they would ordinarily be taken out of the bed, a trimming back accompanied by an application of Vigoro will usually bring them back into late flower closely riveling that of the plants when they were young and at their

Many commercial growers use blood and bone meals with excellent results, while lime can also be used with great benifit on some soils.



HARROLD'S IMPROVED SWISS

The popularity of the "Swiss" types has been wide owing to the difference of type and colors which it produces. We find however, that it is late flowering, of plant habit not always ideal for American retail markets, and seldom found exceptionally true to type. Through strict breeding we have endeavored to eliminate these faults in the strain offered here, and we can say this year that we have more nearly reached our goal than ever before. We believe more nearly than in any other commercially available "Swiss" strain.

Both 3 and 5 blotched types have been bred into this mixture, and it will be found pleasing in the proportion of each type to the commercial grower. Flower size is as large, if not larger than the original variety, and through our Harrold method of producing hybrids, many new colors have been added to its color range. Inclined to be a little on the dark side of the color chart, it however produces some very lovely light shades. Tests this spring show this strain a full 3 to 4 weeks earlier flowering than "Swiss" strains obtained from 3 other well known seed growers. Plant habit has been drawn down to a more compact form and they winter exceptionally well.




