Plant Tulips and Daffodils this fall for a blaze of beautiful color in your garden next spring.

Your spring garden is not complete without the radiant beauty of these gloriously colored spring flowers, with their rich clear colors, that add a bold brilliance to your landscape.

They make a wonderful display when massed in large beds, and beautiful color patches are provided when planted in clumps of a dozen or more bulbs here and there along the border of shrubbery and among perennials or in the rock garden, and a bizarre effect not surpassed by any other flower may be had by planting Tulips in mixed colors.

Tulips and Daffodils or Narcissus will grow and bloom to perfection in any good garden soil that has been thoroughly loosened by deep spading. But for the very largest and finest blooms it will be best to enrich the soil with some kind of fertilizer. Steamed bone meal is an ideal fertilizer for bulbs. Apply about two double handfuls to the square yard and if possible, mix with the soil a good supply of leaf mold or old rotted manure.

In regions where the ground freezes some kind of mulch should be provided. Right after the first heavy frosts or before winter sets in, cover the ground with 2 or 3 inches of leaves or straw or any other light cover to prevent the ground from alternate thawing and freezing which is injurious to bulbs.

In the spring after danger of hard frosts are over, remove this cover carefully so as not to break the tops or leaves of the new growth. Plant 4 to 6 inches deep by 5 to 8 inches apart each way.

Note — Daffodils or Narcissi and the Lilies should be planted in September or early October for best blooming results next spring.

Tulips are best planted in late October or November for best blooms in spring. Tulips if planted too early may make a top growth this fall, which if frozen will check the growth and consequently the stems will be shorter and the blooms smaller.


