MONEY on NURSERY STOCK

PEACH TREES

This is the time to plant Peach Trees. Not only because we anticipate higher prices for young trees but because we firmly believe that fruit prices will be much higher when these trees come into bearing. Set Peaches 15 to 18 ft. apart. Plant on northern or western exposures so that they will not bloom too early and suffer from early frosts.

Midsummer Ripening

Elberta (Freestone): The most widely grown commercial Peach. Large, golden yellow. Shaded with deep red. Flesh is firm and of rich yellow color. Ripens about August 15.

Belle of Georgia (White Freestone): Handsome, large, white blushed with red, excellent quality, hardy, best white peach. Good shipper. Ripens August 15.

J. H. Hale (Freestone): One of the most popular peaches. Very large, golden yellow. Skin overlaid with carmine. More highly colored than Elberta. Ripens about August 10 to 15.

South Haven (Freestone): Very popular in Michigan where it was recently introduced. Unusually hardy and very productive. Ripens about August 15.

Late Ripening

Late Crawford (Yellow Freestone): A high quality large yellow peach, scarcely equalled in flavor and adaptable to a wide range of soils and climate.

APRICOT TREES

Apricots are becoming more popular every year. They are as hardy as Peaches and may be planted wherever Peaches grow. Should be planted on a northern or western exposure to retard early blooming.

CHERRY TREES

In recent years, there has been an over-production of Cherries with the result that trees have been neglected and orchards have not been replaced. For that reason we advise planting now. Sour varieties should be planted 15 ft. apart and Sweet about 20 ft.

Sour or Pie Cherries

May Duke: Large, red and juicy. Ripens in July.

Montmorency: The most largely planted of the Sour varieties. Fruit is a beautiful glowing red and does not crack nor rot even in very hot, rainy weather.

Early Richmond: A fine early sour cherry. Fruit is medium size, dark red; tender.

Sweet Cherries

Gov. Wood (Sweet): Does exceedingly well in the East. Fruit is red and amber. Excellent quality.

Black Tartarian (Sweet): Lustrous, purplish-black when ripe. Medium size, firm, excellent flavor.

APPLE TREES



Young apple trees are scarce this year. Despite the scarcity, Sears prices are low and you can save by selecting your trees from the following assortment of varieties. Orchard plantings have decreased during the past few years and trees planted now should come into bearing at a time when you can get the most for fruit.

Late Fall and Winter Apples

Pears, Plums and Rhubarb

Nothing so luscious as the Pear. Every orchard or garden should contain some pear trees. They grow in almost any soil but do best in clay loam. Plant 20 ft. apart.

Freight Orders Save You Most

The rates below which are for your convenience and general reference are estimated rates and are not to be accepted as actual.

The freight rate you actually pay is exactly the same no matter who makes the shipment, as freight rates are not determined by the shipper, or by the railroad. They are controlled by the Interstate Commerce Commission.

If you would like to know what the actual freight charge will be on any article or order, ask your Station Agent, telling him the exact weight as stated in our catalog and where the article will be shipped from, or write to Sears Personal Service and we will gladly figure it for you.

Freight Is Economical

When your merchandise is sent by freight, shipping charges are much less than other methods of transportation. Of course, 100 pounds or more is the most economical freight shipment, because all railroads charge as much for carrying less than 100 pounds as they do for a full 100 pound shipment. When the weight of your order is more than 100 pounds you pay freight charges based on the actual weight, but in no case less than the minimum charge which is 50c.

Build Your Order up to 100 Pounds—or More

Add up carefully the shipping weights of the articles on your freight order, and if the total weight is less than 100 pounds, it will pay you to build it up to 100 pounds or more. Why not have one or two of your neighbors or friends join with you to make up a shipment of 100 pounds or more, as it costs no more to ship 100 pounds by freight than it does less than 100 pounds. The additional saving will be worth while.

Warehouse and Factory Shipments

We ship much of our heavier merchandise direct from warehouses and factories near you to save you transportation costs. The descriptions of this merchandise give you these various points of shipment. These articles must be shipped separately and cannot be included with goods shipped from our store.

How to Estimate Freight Charges

If you want to estimate freight charges and you do not know how far you live from our mail order store, refer to map on the parcel post page for approximate distance. Figure up the total weight of your order from the shipping weights given in the descriptions in this catalog. Then, by referring to the chart below, you can easily estimate the freight charges. The actual charge may be slightly more or less, especially when the shipment weighs less than 100 pounds. In such cases the minimum freight charge applies.

Example: Suppose you live about 200 miles from PHILADELPHIA and order an incubator weighing 125 pounds. The list below shows the freight charges for 100 pounds on incubators to be 64c. Multiply the shipping weight, 125 pounds (1¼ times the hundred pound rate), by 64c and your answer is 80c, the approximate total freight charge.

If There Is a Freight Agent at your station you pay the freight charges when you receive your shipment.

If There Is No Freight Agent at your station, be sure to include with your order sufficient money in addition to the price of the merchandise to cover the freight charges. We always return every penny you send over actual amount required to ship your order.

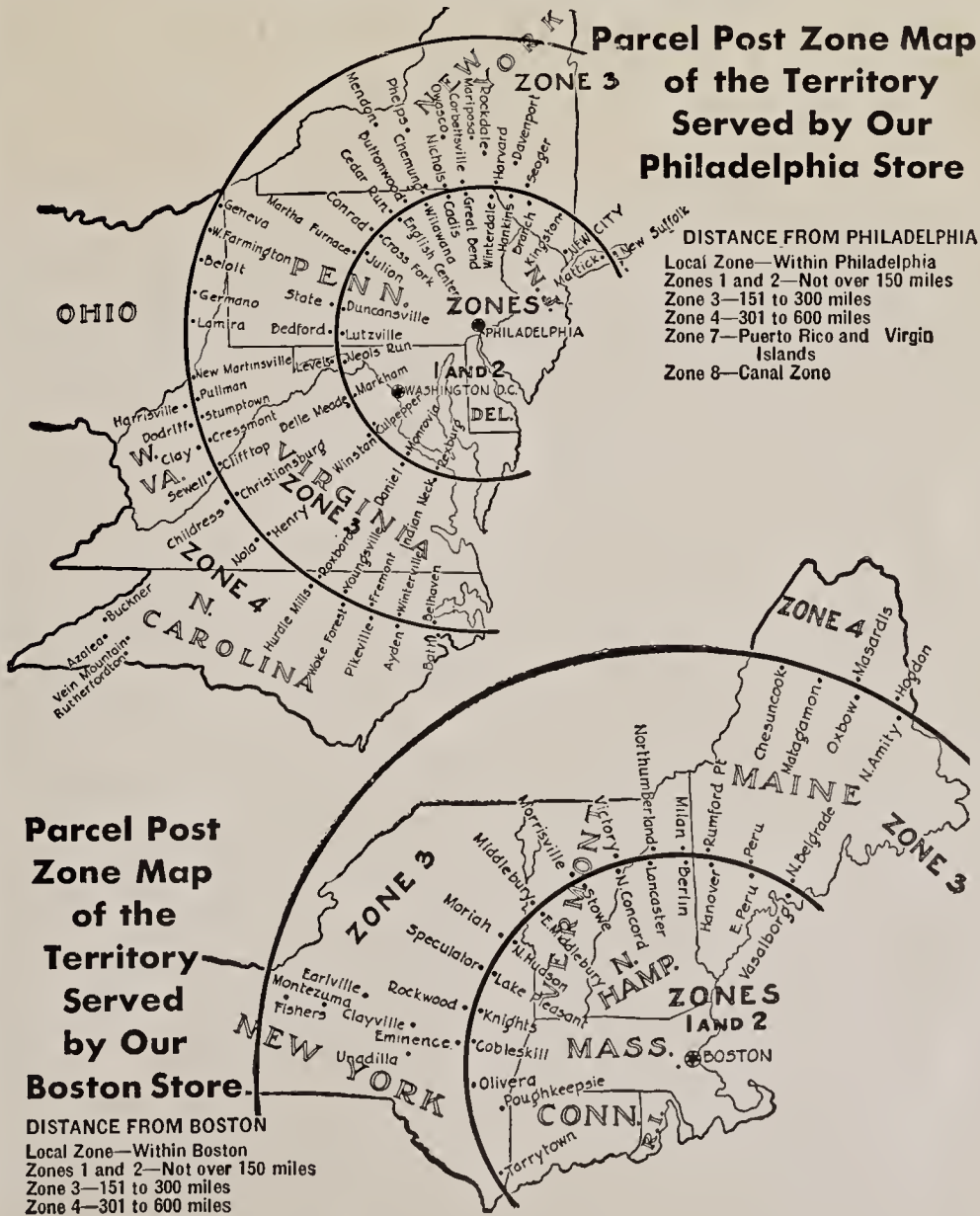

For special delivery or any other information regarding parcel post matters, ask your carrier or your postmaster.
