

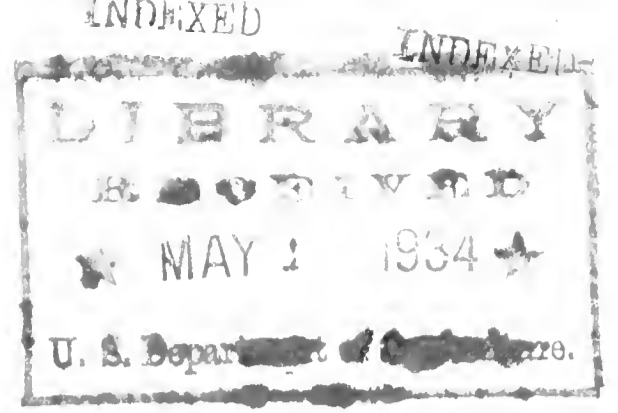

#### **Packing**

These prices include free packing.

#### **Delivery**

These prices include free delivery to such places as can be reached without unreasonable expense.

#### **Guarantee**

We guarantee to replace, free of charge, all plants which fail to grow, providing they have been given proper care, payment has been made when due, and notification of such failures is made before September 1 following delivery. Planting of such replacements will be additional.

#### **Planting**

These prices do not include planting but arrangement for planting can be made at a reasonable cost.

#### **Terms**

A discount of 2% will be made if paid within ten days from date of invoice; thirty days net.

#### **Prices**

Five of a kind at tens rate, fifty at hundreds rate.
