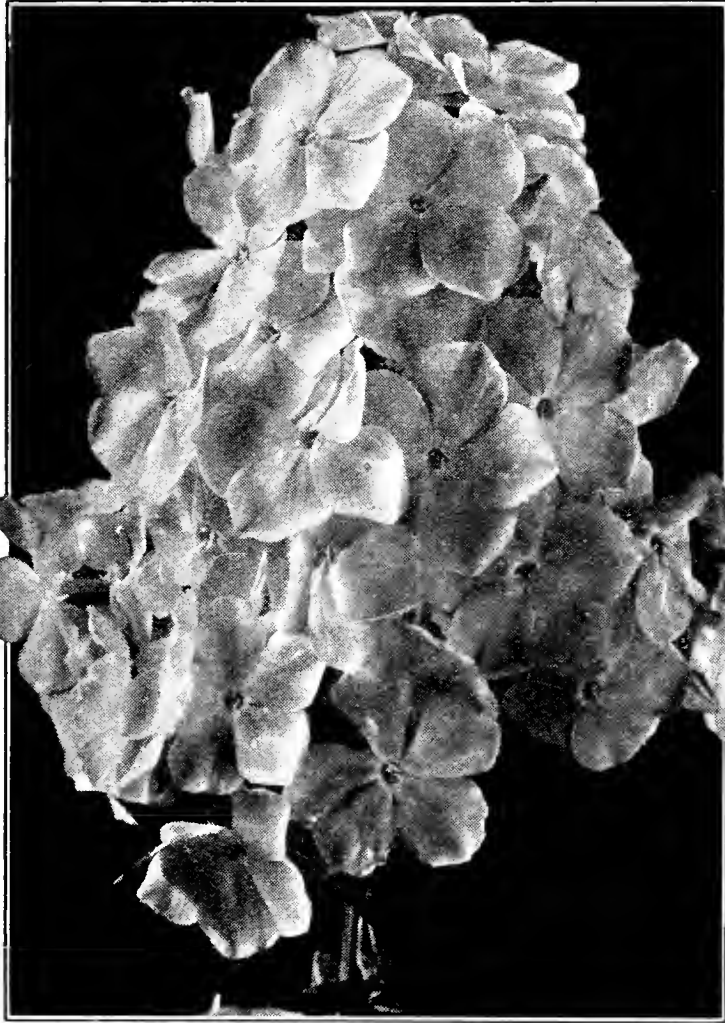

TALL HARDY PHLOX



Columbia.

Six Outstanding Plants of Exquisite Beauty

New Butterfly Bush

ILE DE FRANCE

NOTWITHSTANDING the fact that the color of the older Buddleia or Butterfly Bush was somewhat vague and washed out, giving the shrubs a rather indefinite effect in the border, nevertheless, these plants have been for years the most popular shrubs in cultivation. However, the weak color was a standing challenge to plant breeders. Sooner or later some hybridist would meet the issue and produce a really first class Butterfly Bush.

This has now been accomplished and Ile De France is the answer. Its color is real and substantial, a brilliant russet purple with a violet suffusion that actually stands out and is visible in the landscape. In addition the flowers are fragrant, which is also new among the Butterfly Bushes. The individual flower spikes are very large, measuring 10 inches in length. The shrubs develop into well branched symmetrical bushes 3 1/2 to 4 feet tall. A truly great creation. Pot grown plants 40c each; \$4.00 per dozen.

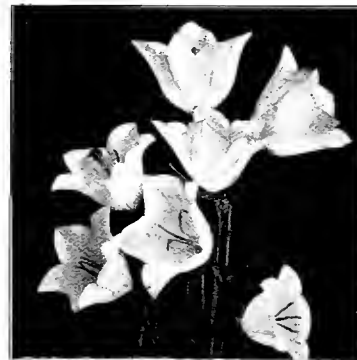

The plants described below are exactly the same plants that we would recommend to you if we were answering your special letter.

In addition to producing gorgeous cut flowers, all of these plants are useful in the perennial garden or border.

Anthemis, New Hybrids. A new race of Anthemis originated by Benary. Lovely shades of yellow and orange. June and July.

Artemisia lactiflora. Sturdy plants with immense heads of lovely, small, white, fragrant flowers blooming in August and Sept.

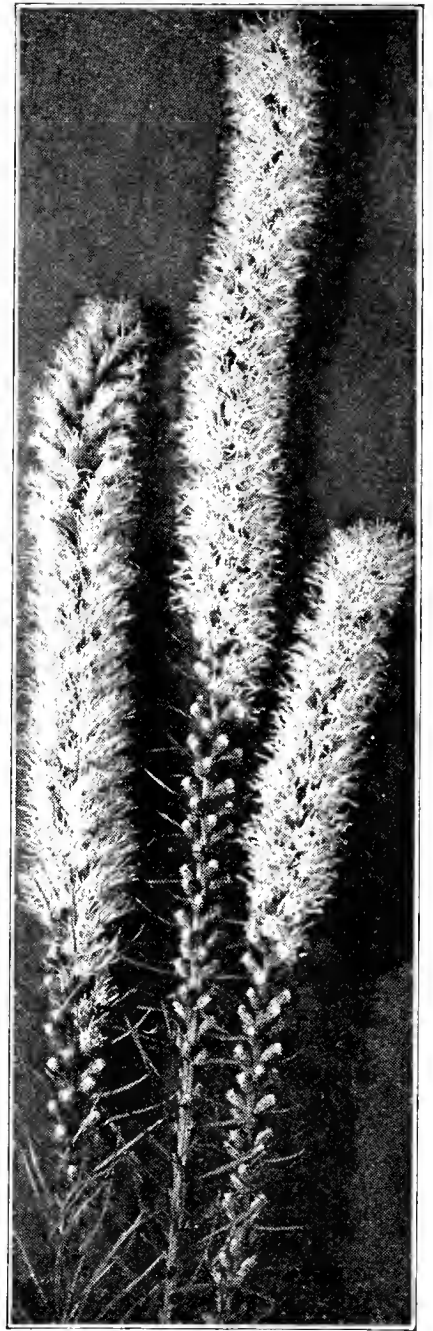

Coreopsis, Mayfield Giant. Gorgeous masses of rich golden yellow blooms in June and July. A real improvement over the older Grandiflora.

Filipendula hexapetala. The foliage makes a low, handsome mound from which spring flower stalks two feet high terminating in foamy corymbs of lovely white flowers.

Gaillardia grandiflora. The standard for forty years.

G., Giant English Hybrids. A new strain from England in lovely shades of red, yellow and orange.

G., Portola Hybrids. The largest flowering of all the Gaillardias.

G., The Dazzler. Giant rich red flowers with brilliant orange tips.

Geum, Lady Stratheden. Double golden yellow flowers on stems a foot or more long. Flowers from May to July.

Geum, Mrs. Bradshaw. The flowers of this variety are vivid brilliant scarlet.

Liatris pycnostachya. Long narrow spikes about four feet tall of rich purple flowers blooming in mid-summer.

Physostegia, Vivid. Lovely dark pink flowers on three foot stems blooming in July.

Pyrethrum roseum. The Pyrethrums are so easily and simply cultivated that they may be recommended to all who possess a garden. They are perfectly hardy and absolutely invaluable for cut flowers through the summer and autumn months. Flowers range from pure white to deep red and are bright and elegantly borne on long stems.

Shasta Daisy. The famous white California Giant Daisy developed by the late Luther Burbank.

Spiraea palmata elegans. Graceful plumes of lovely pink flowers blooming in June on stems three feet tall.

S. ulmaria. Similar to palmata excepting that the flowers are white.

Tritoma Pfitzeri (Red Hot Poker). Blazing heads of orange-scarlet flowers on spikes 3 feet high blooming from August to October.

T., New Hybrids. The colors range from pale yellow to deep orange.

Veronica longifolia subsessilis. Lovely blue flowers borne on two-foot stems in July to September.
