If not satisfactory they **Must Be Returned At Once Carefully Packed**, and your money will be refunded. Shipments damaged in transit **Must Be Shown At Once To Postmaster** and report damage to us immediately. No allowance if report is made after 24 hours.

TO THE TRADE:

We are preparing for a big season and expect there will be an unusual demand, which we will try to meet as far as possible. If you want to be sure to get **What You Want When You Want It**, you must give us your order as early as possible. Many orders can be filled when received, but we can be sure to give better satisfaction if we have orders early.

BLOOMING DATES

Dates for blooming are quite misleading. This depends almost entirely on the way the crop is grown. If grown cool, the crop will be retarded, and if given heat, it will be hurried along. The date of planting also makes some difference.

In arranging our list this year we are listing the varieties in the order of blooming with us.

ADVANCE ORDERS

If possible place your orders early—and then we can either propagate especially for you or can mark your order (sold) in the regular cutting bench so when time for shipment comes your stock is ready.

Many of our customers do this and find it greatly to their advantage. We try and have reserve stock we can call on to provide advance orders.

Always give us as much time as possible on your order.

We cannot guarantee a crop, as growing depends entirely upon the grower.

MIDGE

FumeTobac will control Midge and is very easy to handle. It may be had from most supply houses or direct from the Uniform Products Company, Inc., 111 Fifth Ave., New York. The company furnishes tins for hanging in the house for burning the powder, and

for our use we consider this the most practical of anything we have found to control Midge. We also sometimes have to spray with **Nicofume Liquid** and sometimes we use **Cyanogas**, both of which are good but not so pleasant to handle as FumeTobac.

You need not fear Midge if you use preventatives. Our stock is clean and we keep it clean.

We will furnish brief cultural directions for the asking. Elmer D. Smith of Adrian, Mich., has an excellent book on Mum growing.

SNAPDRAGONS

Follow your Mums with Snaps. Now that Rust can be completely controlled, many find this a very paying crop. Snaps and Mums are the only crops we grow, and by putting all our energies and thought into these two crops we think we can give you as good or better service than you can get elsewhere. We try to treat our customers as we would want them to treat us if we were buying, and we will expect to supply you regularly. Our Rust circular is free.

The best fertilizer we have used is Smith's Mum Manure from Henry F. Michell Co. of Philadelphia, Pa. Always use some rotted manure in soil.
