On all orders sent C. O. D. customer is required to pay for the actual transportation charges and the amount charged by the Express Company or Post Office Department for handling C. O. D. shipments.

Orders for less than \$1.00 not accepted as these can only be filled at a loss.

Send bank draft, express or postal money order, or if more convenient for you, we will accept your personal check.

Where not indicated, the dozen price is 3 times the three rate. Hundred price is $7\frac{1}{2}$ times the dozen rate. 50 bulbs of a variety at the 100 rate.

GUARANTEE... We guarantee safe arrival of all shipments. All our bulbs have been inspected by our State Department of Entomology and have been given a certificate as FREE FROM GLADIOLUS THRIPS and DISEASES. We also guarantee that each variety will be true to name.

QUALITY... We exercise great care in growing and caring for the bulbs at all stages. All bulbs sent out are strictly young stock. Our curing and storing methods are also superior. TRANSPORTATION CHARGES . . . We prepay shipping charges on all retail gladiolus orders forwarded during the regular shipping season which begins soon after February 15th. Earlier shipments can be made if desired, but these go forward express charges collect to insure against freezing.

CLAIMS FOR SHORTAGES... These should be made immediately upon receipt of goods.

SUBSTITUTION... From many years experience, we have found that when out of certain varieties ordered, the customers prefer the substitution of a similar or better variety, rather than a refund. Please state choice of colors, varieties you have grown and amounts you wish to buy.

CANADIAN SHIPMENTS... Because of the regulations of your Government, please obtain a permit for the importation of bulbs from the Destructive Insect and Pest Act Advisory Board, Ottawa, Ont. They will furnish you with the shipping label which you will please forward to us for affixing on your order.

IRIS and PEONIES... We grow approximately 35 acres of peonies and iris of the WORLD'S FINEST VARIETIES. We can make early spring delivery if requested although the regular iris shipping season begins last of June and the peony shipping starts in September. If interested write for our quotations.

Gladioli are Easy to Grow

Any good garden soil is suitable for gladioli although they do like a sandy loam best. In preparing the soil follow only such methods as you would give a fine crop of garden vegetables. However you will be rewarded for any special care given them in the way of cultivating, fertilizing and watering.

It should be remembered that Gladioli enjoy sunshine and should not be planted in very shady places. Plant

in rows, beds, borders, among shrubbery, roses, other flowers, etc., or in separate groups.

Planting should begin any time after early garden-making, followed by successive plantings at say ten day intervals until early July. Set the bulbs four inches deep and from four to eight inches apart. The very finest blooms come from the earliest and the latest plantings. These gladioli have the opportunity of coming into flower when the days are somewhat cooler and they really make much nicer flowers than in the terrific hot summer days.

Complete cultural instructions including information on insect and disease control will be included with each order. You will find this information very much worthwhile for it tells you just how to care for your bulbs throughout the entire year, including the harvesting and storing of the bulbs so you will have fine gladioli for the next season.
