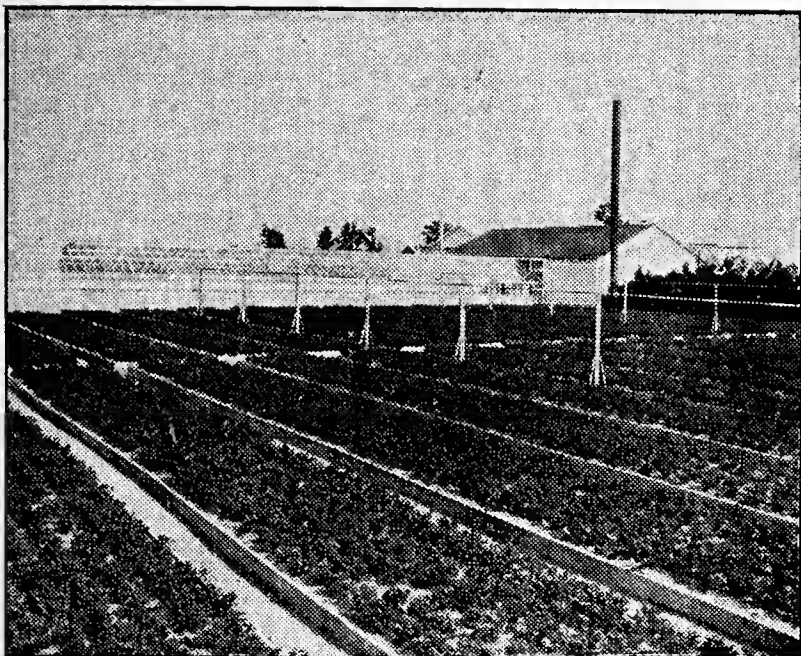
Prices are f. o. b. Hampton, Va. We make no charge for packing.

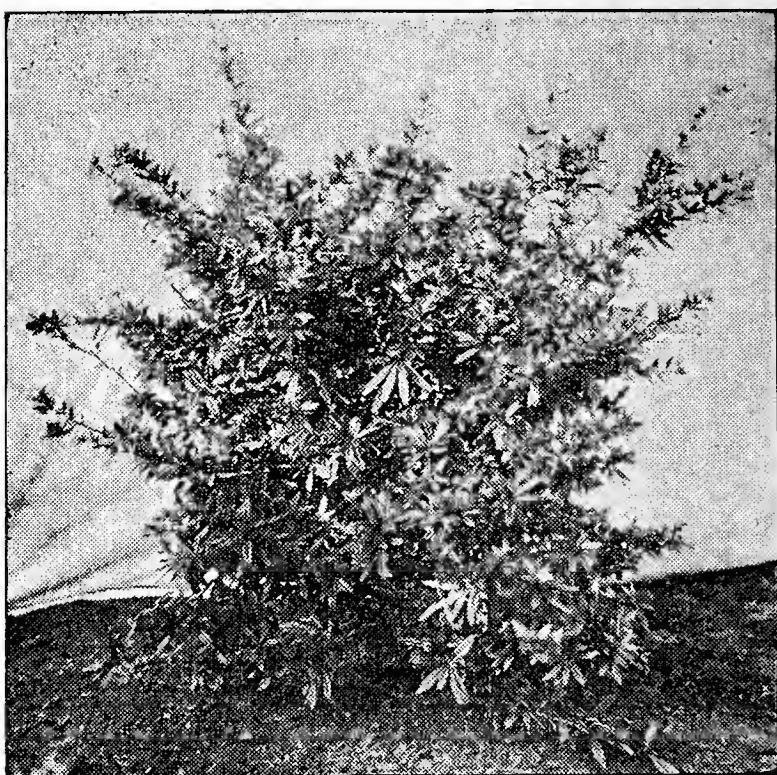

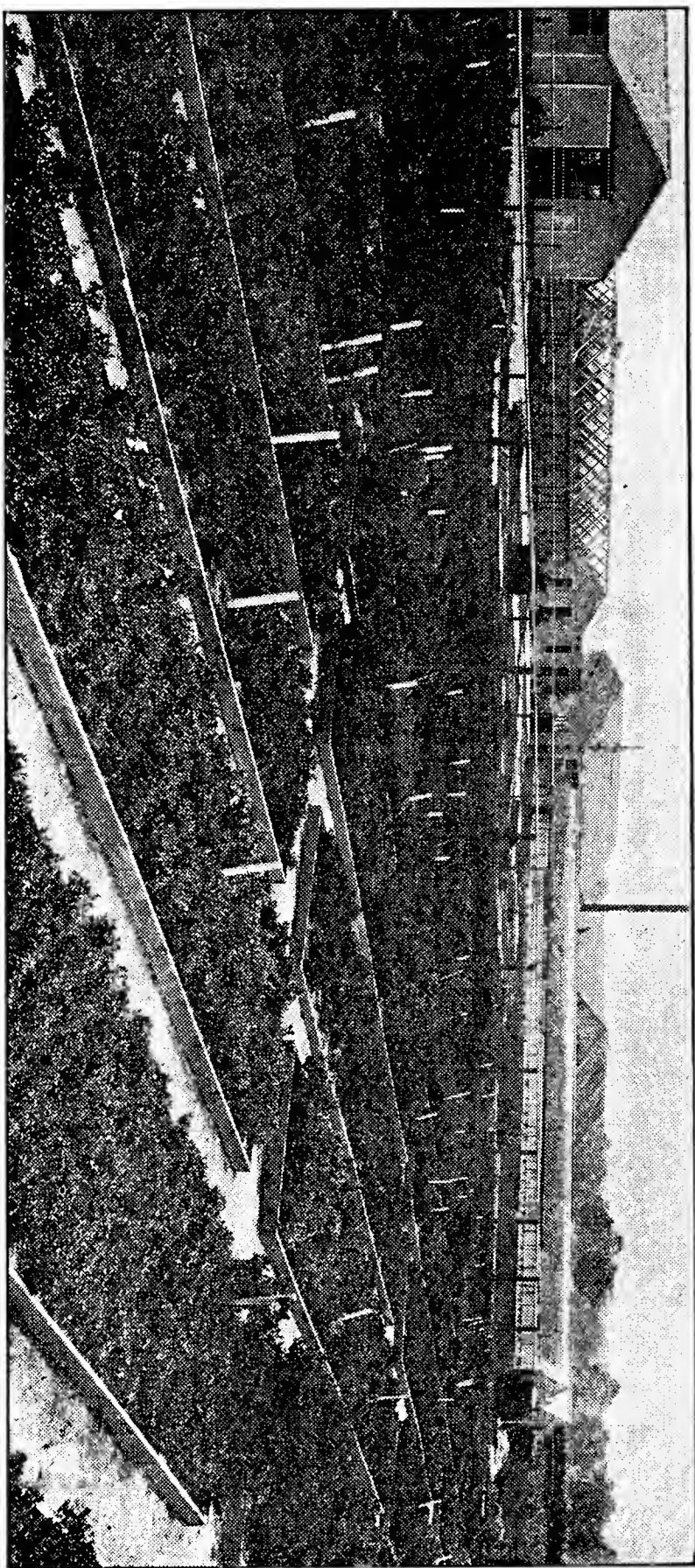
