Tuberous Rooted Begonias

*Awarded Silver Medals by Massachusetts Horticultural Society
in 1934 and 1935*

These are unexcelled for shady spots in the garden. With proper care—like Dahlias—they last for years. They are not hardy but must be stored inside for the winter, when they go dormant. They are not suitable for house plants.

The most popular and also most beautiful are the Double Camelia, which resemble Camelias or Roses, and the Double Fimbriata or Carnation type. These we have in the following ten colors: White, Yellow, Orange, Salmon, Pink, Rose, Crimson Rose, Scarlet, Dark Salmon and Dark Red.

We also have the following special types: Double Marmorata, a marbled red and white; Double Red Picotee, a creamy white-edged red; Double Rose Picotee, a rose-edged red; Double Rosebud, shades of rose; Narcissi-Flora or Daffodil, shades of yellow, salmon and pink; Single Crested in mixed colors; Single Frilled, in mixed colors and Hanging Basket in mixed colors. These colors are all clear and brilliant, making a superb showing in shady places that are otherwise devoid of color in the garden.
