# Following of Simple Instructions Will Result in Success

Amaryllis (a classic name) the variety really grown and so popular, is A. Hippeastrum Vittata Hybrids and are part of the Amaryllidaceae Family. They are of the easiest culture, can be grown in a city or country home having a sunny window. For best success they should be grown in pots the year around, 6 or 7 inch pots for the large blooming size bulbs. A good garden soil with a little rotten cow manure, some moss peat and a dash of sand is best.

Upon receiving your bulb, pot same immediately, have good drainage and leave top of bulb exposed. Place same in sunny window, keep well watered (but do not let stand in water) until it blooms after which you must keep same growing until the weather is warm enough to plunge outside in a sunny place. Remember—keep watered during growing period. They usually bloom in winter when flowers are most appreciated.

If your bulb is exposed as it should be, plunge same, pot and all, so that bulb is covered at least one inch and keep growing until September when you take pot up and store in frost-proof basement or any other dry place. About January bring same up to the light and begin to water it. Blooms will appear shortly. Repotting should be done before plunging out doors. Do not disturb at other seasons of the year.

Our Hybrids are of the most beautiful and classic flowers that grow. They are of the easiest culture known. They are even more beautiful in coloring than the orchid and much larger in size. The colors in our Hybrids range with self-colorings from the darkest of red, all shades of pink, down to the purest white, also many are striped with several shades of red and pink while others are dotted throughout.

### Schaefer's Hybrid Amaryllis

#### Clivia

Amaryllis, Imontophyllium. Beautiful evergreen house plant during the winter. Easy to grow but very scarce. Orange colored bloom in trusses of 20 to 40 blooms. Flowers in February and March stays 3 to 6 weeks. Grow in partial shade. Do not dry off like Hypeastrum, water sparingly during resting period, September to January.

Zepheranthus

Zepheranthus—Amaryllis, Carinata, also called Fairy Lilies or Zephr flowers. Summer flowering. Rose, pink. Usually planted 6 bulbs or more in pans.
