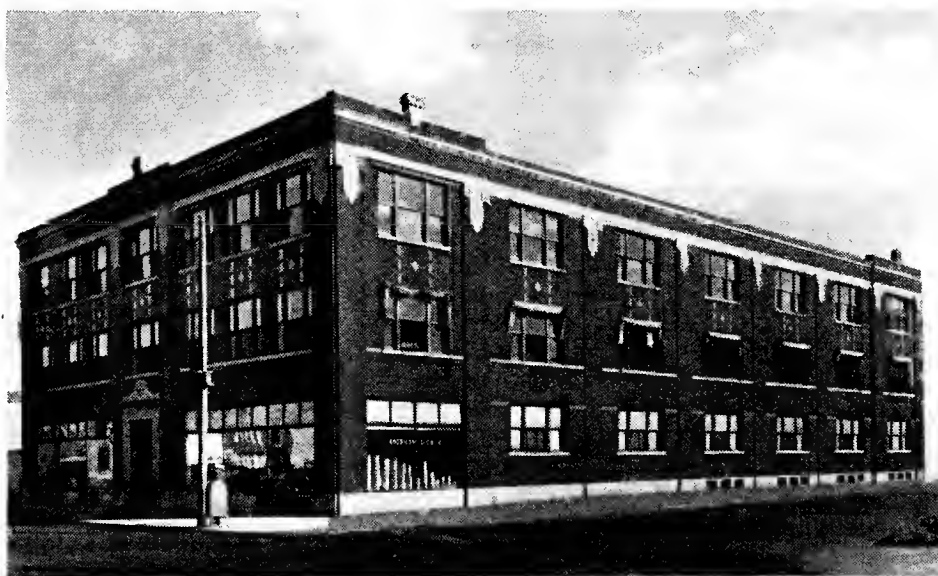

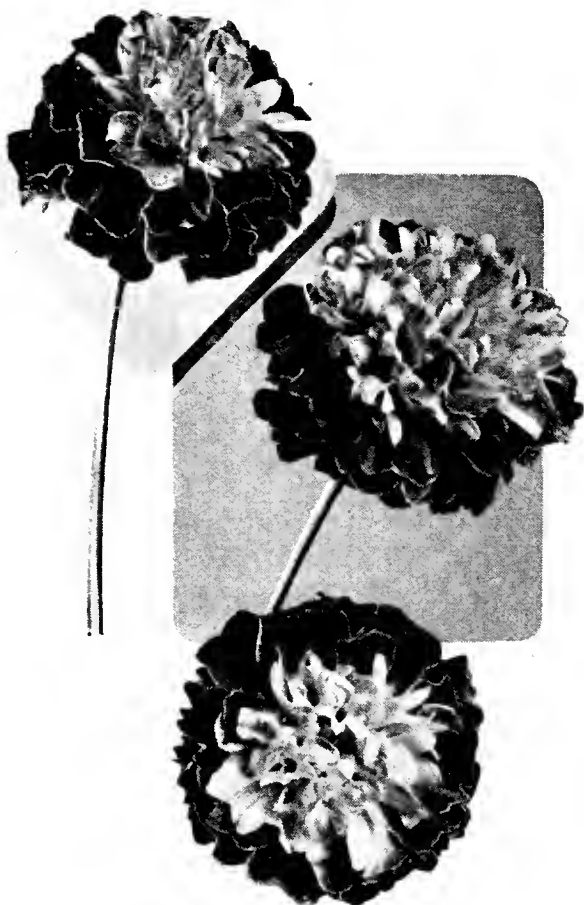

ANNUALS USEFUL FOR CUTTING

An annual must have more than pleasing form and color to be a good cutting flower. There are two other points to consider: its keeping qualities and length of stem. Attractive foliage is desirable in a good cutting flower, but not essential. Fragrance is more or less of secondary consideration. Nevertheless, it is better to have flowers entirely lacking in smell than possessed of "garden halitosis." The marigolds have been objectionable to many persons because of their strong, pungent odor. Now Nature and the plant breeders, working co-operatively, have virtually eliminated that racial fault in such new and greatly improved forms of African marigold as "**Guinea Gold**" and "**Yellow Supreme**." Every cutting garden or list of annuals for cutting purposes really should have one or both of these novelties. "Yellow Supreme" is the latest—All-American gold medalist for 1934. Both "Yellow Supreme" and "Guinea Gold" are splendid for bouquets, particularly when used with blue flowers. (The new marigold "Harmony" illustrated on this page is also recommended.)

Which introduces the questions of blue-flowered cutting annuals, never very plentiful. There are the Giant Imperial Larkspur, **Blue Spire** and **Lilac Queen**, marked advancements over the old stock-flowered type; Nigella, **Miss Jekyll**; there is a lovely azure blue newcomer in the large-flowered **Scabiosas "Azure Fairy"**; and last, but not least, there is the annual **Anchusa, "Blue Bird."** If no other blue flowers were available, this glorious introduction from Old England would be sufficient. The blooms resemble giant sprays of forget-me-nots of the most vivid indigo blue. They last an exceptionally long time and the oftener they are cut, the more new flowers appear.

Annual Chrysanthemums

Easily grown, blooming from mid-summer on and possessing a charming compatibility when used with other flowers, the French marguerites or annual chrysanthemums merit greater consideration than they have received from many Canadian gardeners. Two varieties of especial value are "**Morning Star**," pale prim-

rose, and "**Northern Star**," white with yellow center and dark disc.

With the annual chrysanthemums might be grouped the "**Gaillardias**" and "**Rudbeckias**," ensuring an abundance of long-stemmed, showy flowers for use in bold decorative effects.

If perennial **Gypsophila** or Baby's Breath is not available in a garden, the annual variety is almost another indispensable. A few airy sprays of Gypsophila simplify the arrangement of other flowers. As one writer has said, the other flowers only require to be inserted among the Gypsophila sprays to make a pretty bouquet. The annual Gypsophila may be had in white, rose and cream.

"**Stalice**," or Sea Lavender, is invaluable also in flower arrangements, lending grace and freedom to a bouquet.

In Zinnias, the chrysanthemum-flowered variety, "**Fantasy**," another all-American selection for 1934; the "**Scabious-flowered**" form introduced a few years ago, and the "**Crown o' Gold**" strain are recommended for cutting flowers. The flowers of "Fantasy" bear a resemblance to shaggy, bright-colored chrysanthemums. They get away from the stiff, rather woody appearance of the more orthodox types of Zinnias.

Poppies are useful; the "**Shirley**" variety will last well if care is always taken to burn the ends of the stems before placing them in cold water. The Shirley poppy is one of the loveliest of all annuals; a sowing as late as July 10 will give plenty of flowers. In fact, three sowings a season may well be made. For shipping, none of the poppies are to be recommended, but for local selling they are fine. All annuals, of course, prefer a generous soil and constant cultivation and in extremely dry weather watering is helpful. It is easy, however, to overdo this, especially on Zinnias and Calendulas.

A perusal of the following pages will no doubt suggest many other desirable cutflower annuals as well as PERENNIALS.

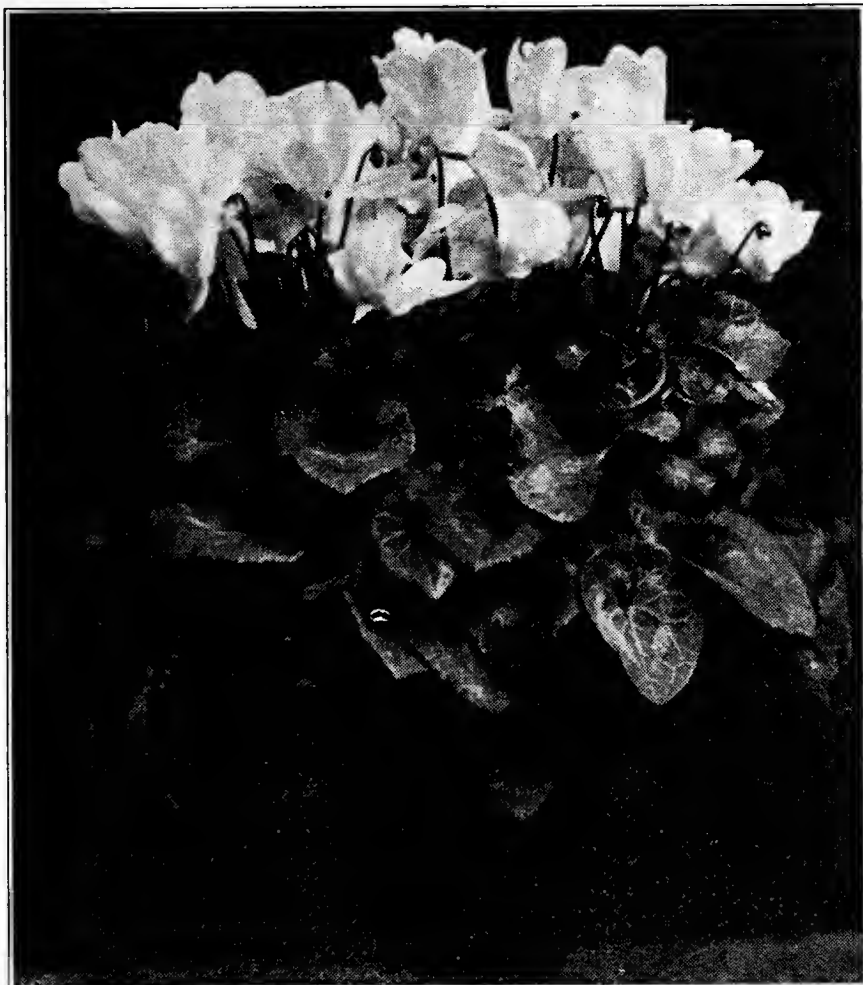

How to Improve Germination of Fine Seeds Especially During Hot Weather Season



Type of Fischer's Giant Cyclamen
Preferred by the Particular Grower

Mix "Sorbex". (The Finest Peat Organic) with soil in seed flats and pots.
Soil for Seed Flats. A perfect mixture for the tender germinated seedlings is one part "Sorbex" to two parts screened garden loam—by volume. Prepare this mixture several days in advance of sowing seeds to allow the "Sorbex" time to absorb some moisture. If time is a factor, moisten the "Sorbex" somewhat before mixing with the soil.

What Causes Damping-Off? Few growers realize that such diseases as "Damping-Off" and rots of seedlings are caused by living germs. Disease producing germs live normally in the soil and on seeds. The only successful way of preventing these diseases is to sterilize the soil and disinfect the seed.

(Excerpt from Florists' Review, issue of January 24, 1935)

Formaldehyde for Damping-Off. "Dr. C. E. F. Guterman, of the department of plant pathology (Cornell University) told of recent developments in the control of damping-off of seedlings. The use of formaldehyde for treating soils for seed planting was recommended where it is not possible to use steam as a means of sterilization. It was shown that two scant teaspoons of commercial (forty per cent) formaldehyde mixed with about ten teaspoons of water make sufficient solution to treat one average-size flat of soil. The soil is spread out on the bench and sprinkled with the formaldehyde solution. It is then thoroughly mixed and placed in the flat. After the soil has stood twenty-four hours, the seeds may be planted. One pint of formaldehyde is ample to treat fifty flats of soil.

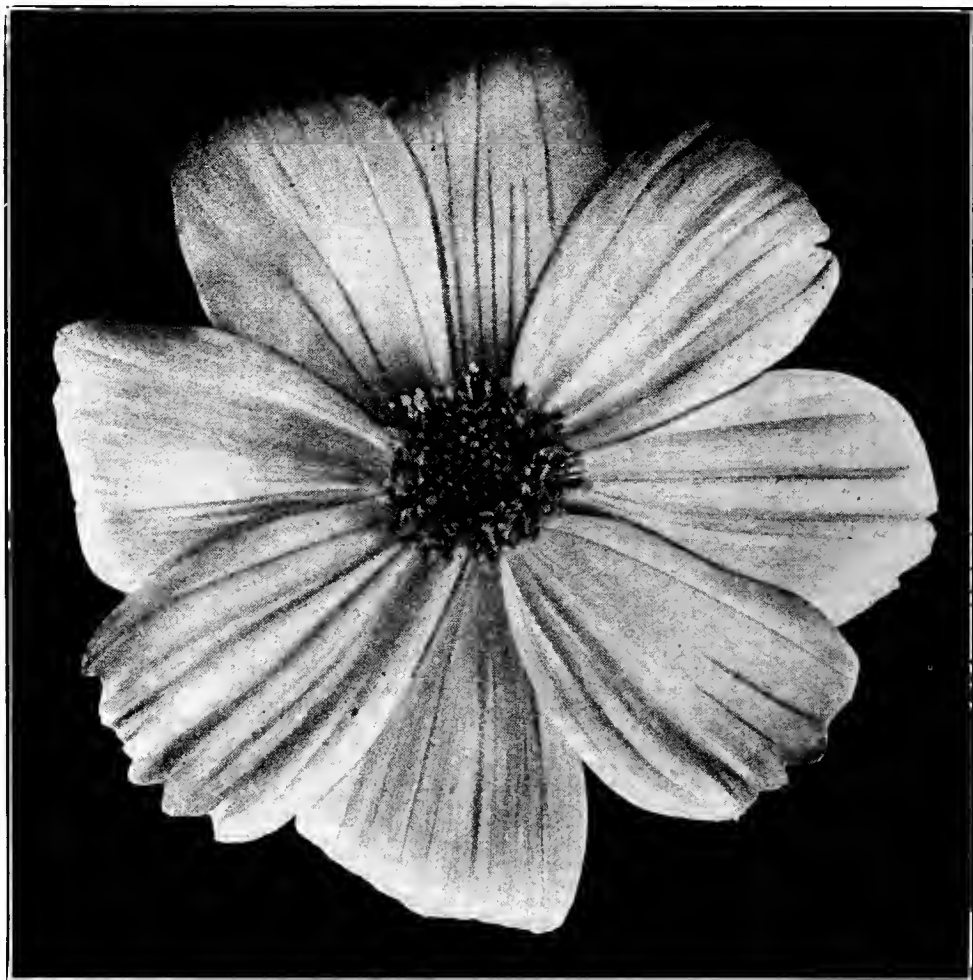

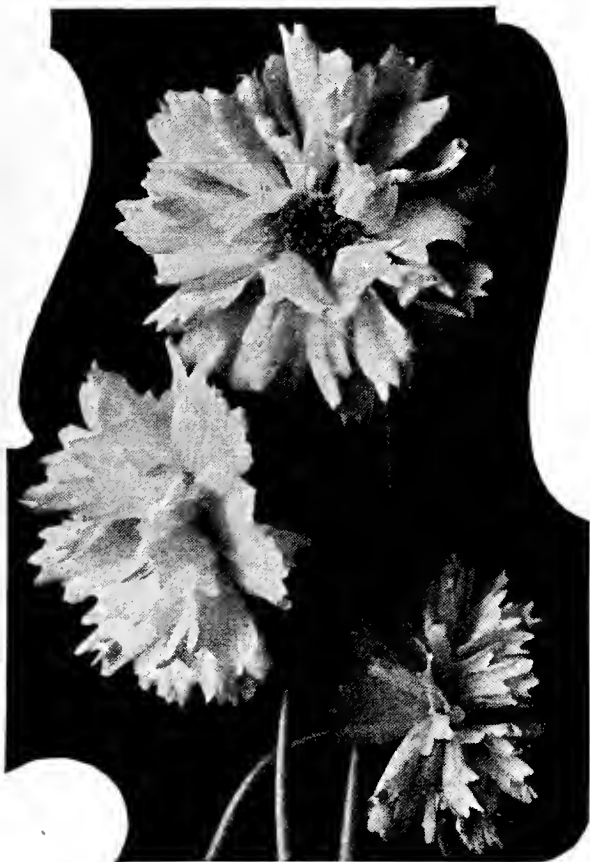

NEW DIANTHUS DELIGHT

This is a hybrid between Dianthus Sweet Wivelsfield and Dianthus Roysii. The growth of the plant is about 9 inches high and like a glorified Dianthus Roysii. A neat erect habit of growth which is continuous flowering out of doors from June until October, producing flowers about half an inch in diameter, not in trusses, but in alternating spikes in great profusion.

There is a bewildering range of colors from the palest pink down to the deepest purple, the predominating shades are velvety rich reds, many having the eye of a Sweet William, there is usually a definite color at the reflex of the petal like Dianthus Roysii, and the magenta shades are very subdued. EXACUM AFFINE "ATROCOERULEUM"

This is a beautiful counterpart to the light mauve flowering species "affine", which is well-known as a most useful pot plant. Numerous small dark lavender flowers with golden yellow stamens contrast wonderfully with the light green leaves. Seedlings sown January-February flower in June and continue uninterruptedly until the autumn. To obtain the best results, plant two plants in each pot. Rich soil of leaf mould and turfy loam in equal parts with some sand added is most suitable for its cultivation, which from the end of March must be carried out either in a cold frame or a well ventilated greenhouse with the minimum of shade. Exacum affine is a fragrant and charming indoor plant. As a cheap market plant it is worthy of notice. This new Exacum harmonizes wonderfully well with most of the red and pink Begonias in made up combinations and the plants stand the heat equally well.

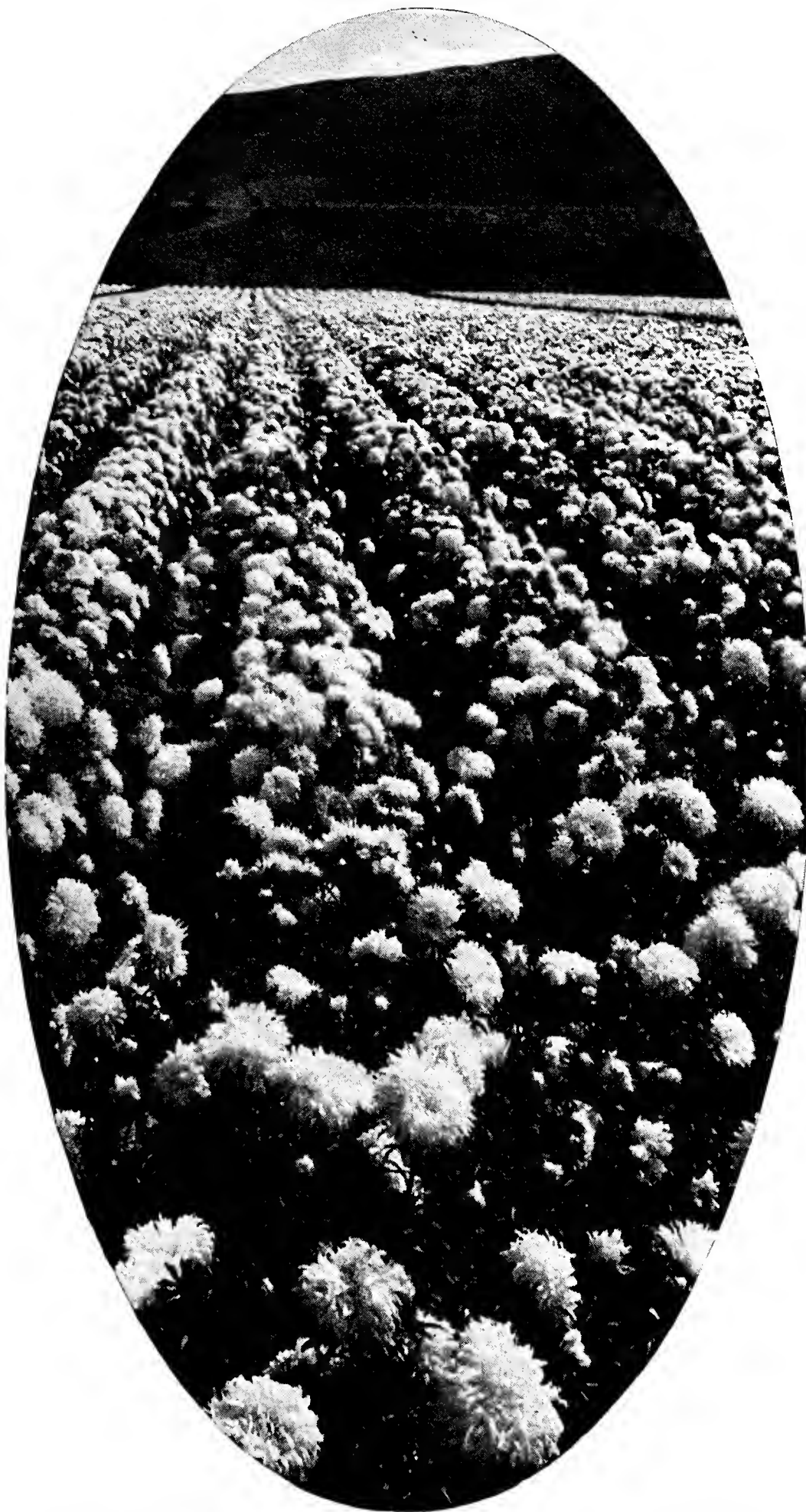

**Use of "Wilt-Resistant"
Strains of Asters
Effective Disease Control**

(Excerpt from the Florists' Review, 1935)

The suitability of recently developed wilt-resistant strains of Asters has been tested at Cornell University (New York) during the past three years. A report of the results of the trials is made available here.

By C. E. F. GUTERMAN

Mr. Guterman states, as a result of his trials at Cornell University, that the use of wilt-resistant strains of asters is by all means the most economical and effective method of control of aster wilt.

"Wilt or stem rot, caused chiefly by fungus, is one of the most wide-spread and serious diseases to which the China aster is susceptible. Plants may become infected at practically any stage of growth. With young seedlings damping off usually results, while in older plants the first evidence of infection is a slight yellowing of the foliage followed by sudden wilting.

Closer examination will reveal a partially or completely decayed root system, dark brown necrotic areas on the stem and discoloration of the woody elements within the stem. In advanced stages, the stem may be entirely rotted away at the soil line.

Use of Same Soil

The casual fungus lives in the soil from year to year and, in many cases, is introduced initially on infested seed or diseased transplants. Continued use of the same piece of ground for aster culture serves to increase the amount of fungus present in the soil, with the result that the disease becomes severer each succeeding season.

The development of wilt-resistant strains of asters by plant pathologists, in cooperation with commercial seedsmen has made possible an economical and effective means of control for the disease.

Prior to the availability of these wilt-resistant strains, measures of control, such as seed sterilization, sanitation, rotation and disinfection of or changing the soil, were used by florists with little success.

Soil "Aster-Sick"

Accordingly, representative types of commercial wilt-resistant and nonresistant asters donated by seedsmen have been grown for the past three years in experimental plots on the Cornell University campus, Ithaca, N. Y., in cooperation with the department of floriculture of the university. The land used in these tests has been planted continuously with asters for at least eight years, thus assuring a heavy infestation of the wilt fungus. That the soil was thoroughly "aster-sick" is evidenced by practically 100 per cent losses with the nonresistant strains over the three-year period."

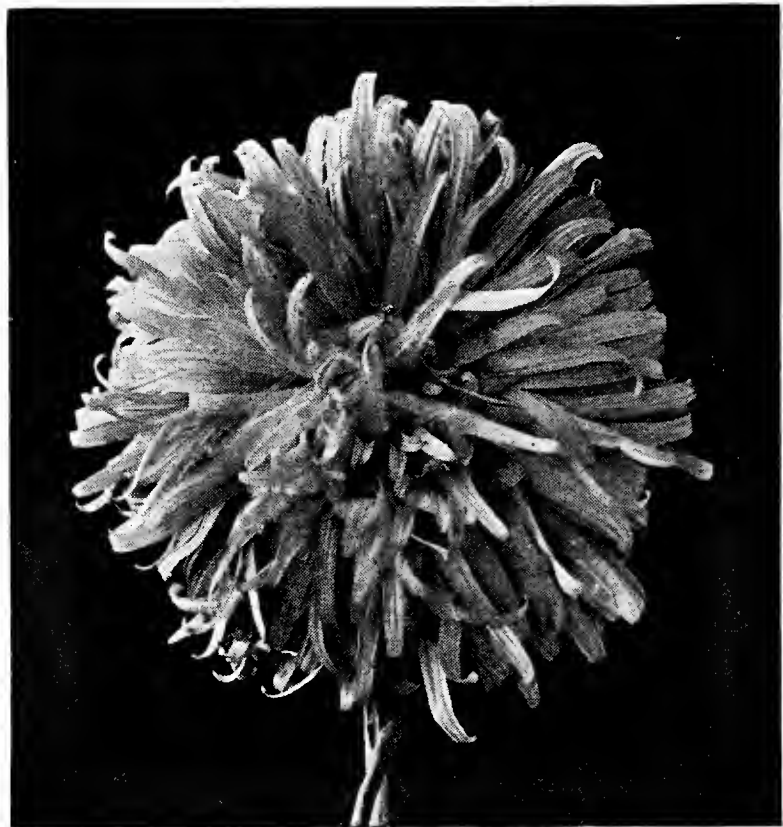

A good time for one planting is soon after the winter holidays as space becomes available. Some growers sow the seed singly, planting out later at the distance of a foot apart.

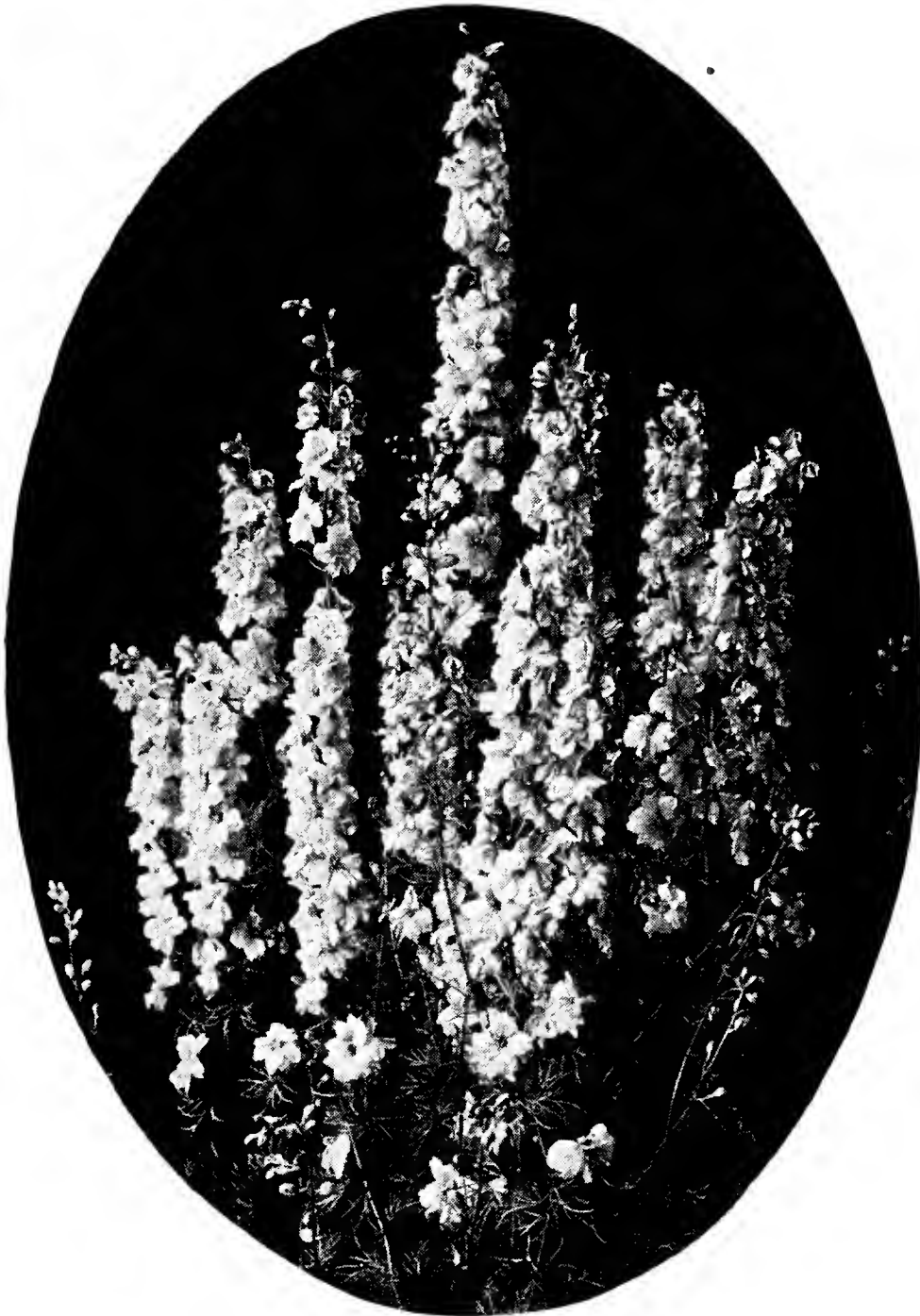

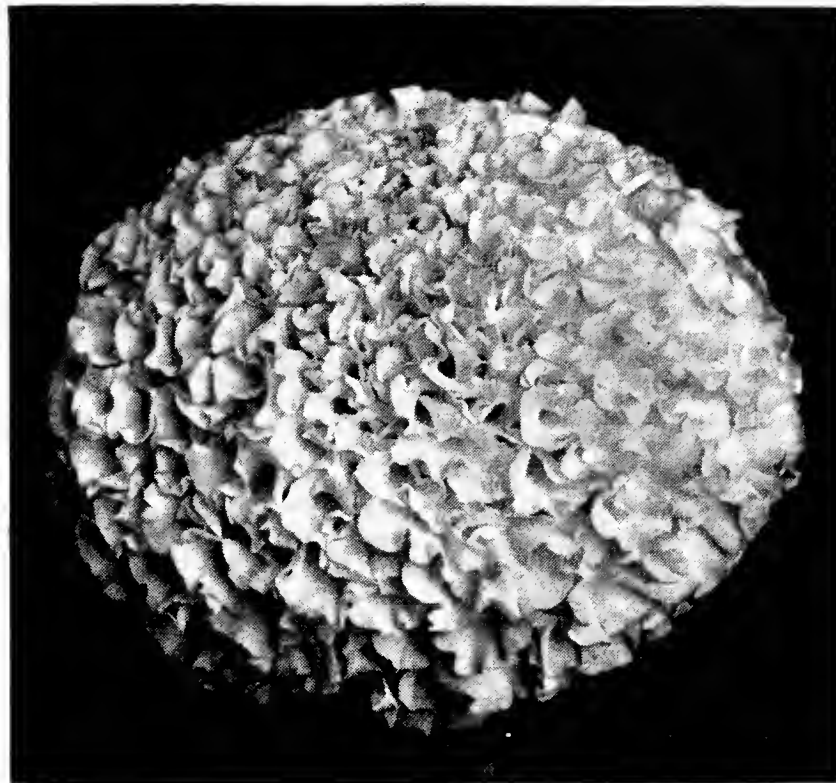

LIEB'S MARIGOLD

By FRITZ BAHR, Prominent Grower and Horticultural Writer

(Excerpt from The Florists' Exchange)

The better you become acquainted with this Winter-flowering Marigold, which is really indispensable to the retail grower, the better you will appreciate its value as a cutflower during the Winter and Spring months. With 2¼ in. or 2½ in. stock planted during September or October on benches about 10 in. apart in a 50-deg. house, you will start to cut during December and continue well into May. There isn't a retail grower who can't realize 50c per doz. for the flowers during the Winter months, and many are sold at 75c or \$1 per doz.; even at the lower price, this Marigold will pay for itself as well as almost anything you can carry in a 50-deg. house. The plants will simply insist on flowering and should be at their best during January and February, when other flowers are not too plentiful, and at the same time you probably have to call every day for inexpensive flowers suitable for the table. They are good for a week after being cut if given any care.

All this need not make us think less of Calendulas or anything else we grow on for cutting, but I don't know of anything that persists in flowering as this Marigold does. By disbudding one can obtain long stem, large flowers, but every little side shoot will produce a blossom, and those too short-stemmed will come in handy for funeral work. Of course not all your customers would care for them, but the writer has seen some most attractive wreaths made up with them. The cuttings root freely almost any time of year; those rooted during Fall and the plants grown on in 2½s will be in full bloom by Christmas, fine for made-up dishes and pans.

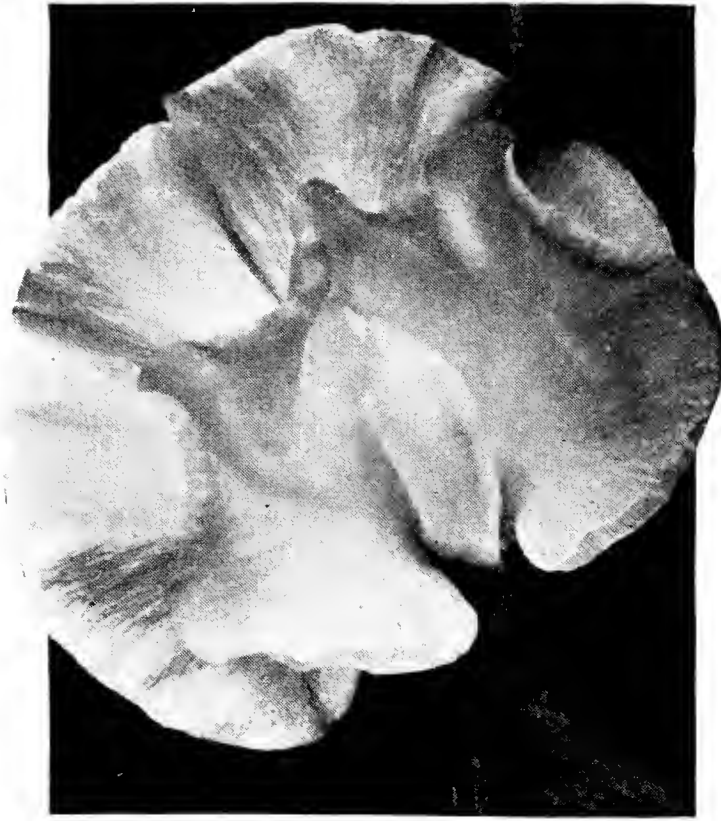

Every florist that grows bedding plants and material for porch and window boxes and is not now handling any of the Torenias should investigate the possibilities of these plants. That they are not well known is shown by their absence from so many gardens. And that they deserve far more attention than they now get, is evident from their good behavior under average garden conditions. The genus Torenia is made up of some 30 species in the tropical regions of Asia and Africa. It is composed of annual and perennial herbs.

CULTURAL HINTS — For "Fancy" Types of Petunias

THERE is a great difference in raising ordinary Petunias from seed and those of a high-bred strain such as "World Beauty," "De Luxe," "Portland," etc., varieties. The former kind will almost come like weeds with little or no attention, but an altogether different story must be told about the so-called fancy types. Their germination is very much slower and precarious. Great care is imperative in watering and in choosing a rich but porous soil. Temperature may vary between 60 and 70 degrees, and seed pans or flats ought to be near the glass in bright light as soon as germination has taken place. Do not let them suffer for lack of water, but the slightest excess of moisture may cause sudden damping off, especially during the early winter months when houses are but little ventilated and the days are short. Poor soil means certain failure in Petunia culture at all times. (Sterilize soil with "formaldehyde" as suggested on page 3 of our catalogue. This will have killed all weed seeds, worms and fungi contained in the soil.)

Beware of ants, snails and sawbugs in Petunia seed flats. Put them on shelves out of their reach or cover them nights with screen door wire netting. A night inspection with flashlight and a pair of scissors is very effective in eradicating this costly pest from a house if repeated several times.

Transplant as soon as large enough to handle into flats, and bear in mind that those seedling plants growing most vigorously are the ones least desirable, while the weaklings in the lot are the real darlings that need your utmost care and attention and will reward you for it with the most charming flowers ever

seen. The culls are invariably the first to bloom, and the grower not familiar with the above mentioned Petunias will pass unfavorable judgment right there and then instead of awaiting the blooming period of the slower but choicest types. The experienced grower can and will often discard the culls when the young plants are ready to pot into two inch in order to save space for the choicest only if bench space has to be economized.

To let the young plants become pot-bound may produce early flowering but will stunt the plants in such a manner that they never will attain their finest size. A pinching back of the leading shoot before blooming will cause free branching and produce fine potted or exhibition plants if kept growing on for specimen display. Liberal use of fertilizer in the soil is beneficial, especially when shifting into larger pots. Light, airy houses are best to start Petunias in, but when they reach the flowering stage it is preferable to break the strongest sunshine by a light trace of shading, very light, however, or it will produce spindly plants.

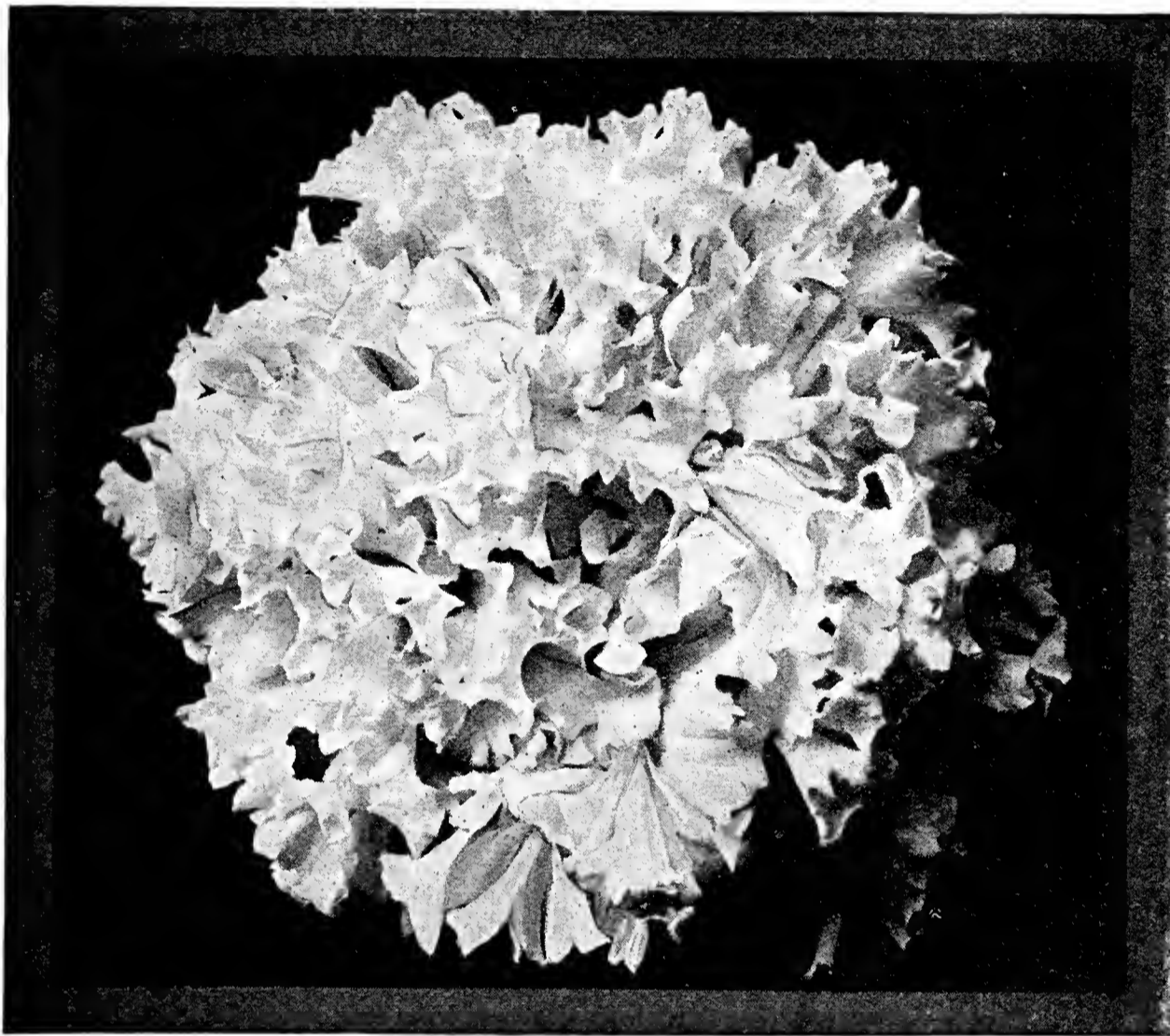
WATERING—That is an art when well understood, and in raising Petunias is of greatest influence. It is particularly important not to over-water, especially in early spring and during cloudy weather, also when the young plants have just been potted up. When plants have attained flowering size avoid as much as possible wetting the foliage or flowers. In growing Petunias for potted plants, soil should be made very rich and doses of liquid manure will improve them when they are becoming pot-bound.

Special Note: When transplanting Double Petunias it is very important to plant the very smallest plants, as these, as a rule, produce the best double flowers.

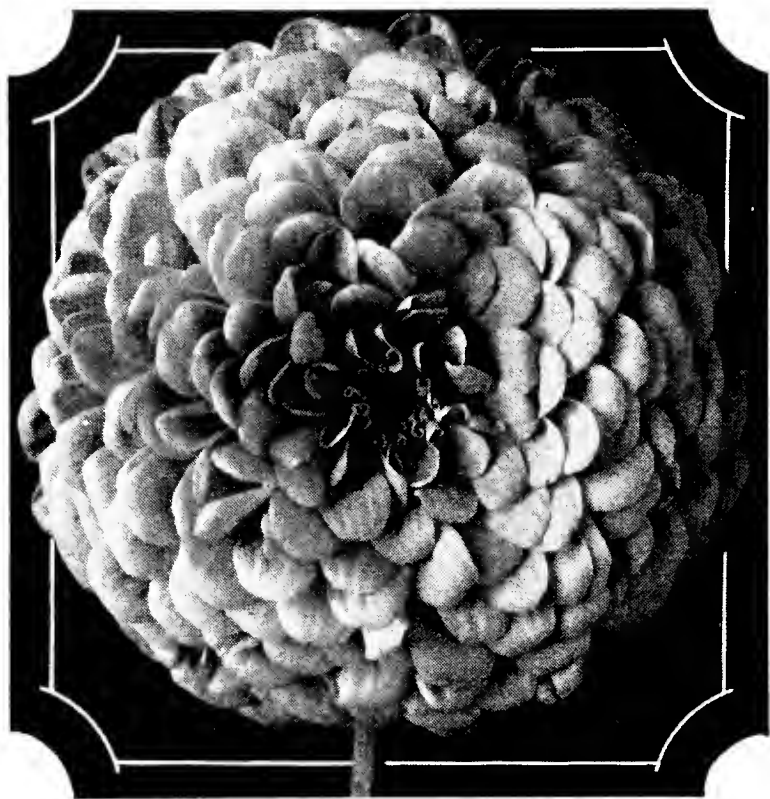

Delphinium (Hardy Larkspur)

Late Delphiniums. As every grower knows, it is necessary to keep sowing Delphiniums each year to maintain a regular supply of plants. Old plants will give a fair second crop, but it is from the seedlings that we get results late in the season. From seeds of the choice hybrids sown in January and February in heat, later potted off singly and planted out when the weather becomes settled, excellent flower spikes are produced from early August onward. Such plants give much finer spikes than are seen on the second crop on the

older stock, and it is a simple matter to dispose of a large proportion of these while they are in flower. The same holds true of the older varieties like Belladonna and Bellamosum, while Chinensis is easily flowered in a few months from the seed and may be treated as an annual or biennial, being really not a true perennial at all. All of these Delphiniums demand a well drained and sweetened soil. Bone freely used is an excellent food for them. Sprayings of Bordeaux mixture with nicotine sulphate and soap will do much toward keeping plants clean; this is especially true of the choice hybrids.

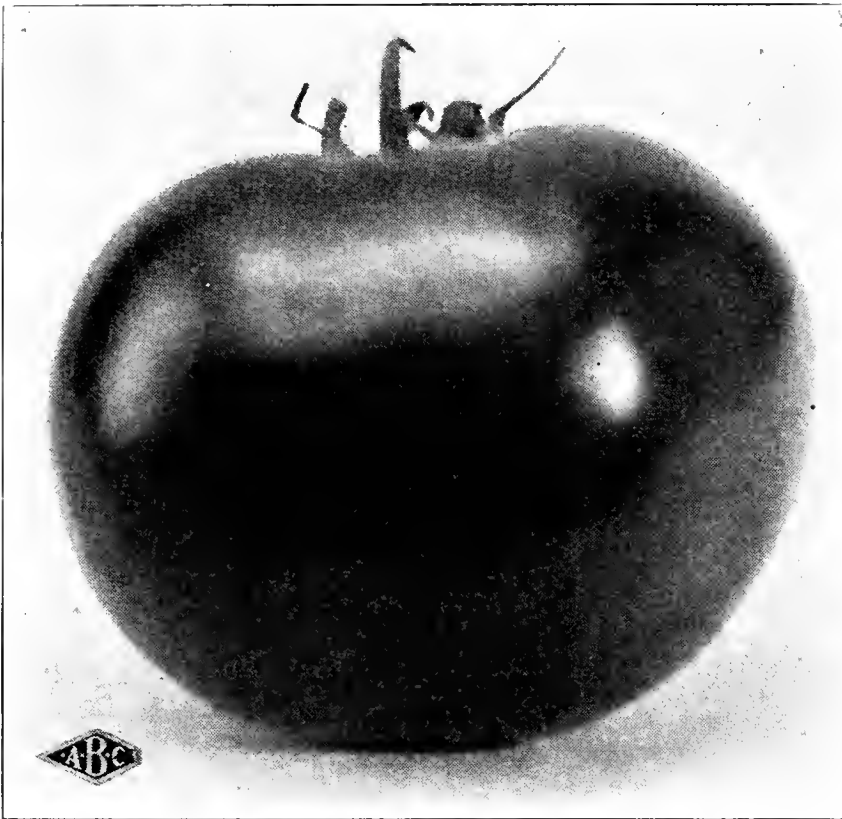

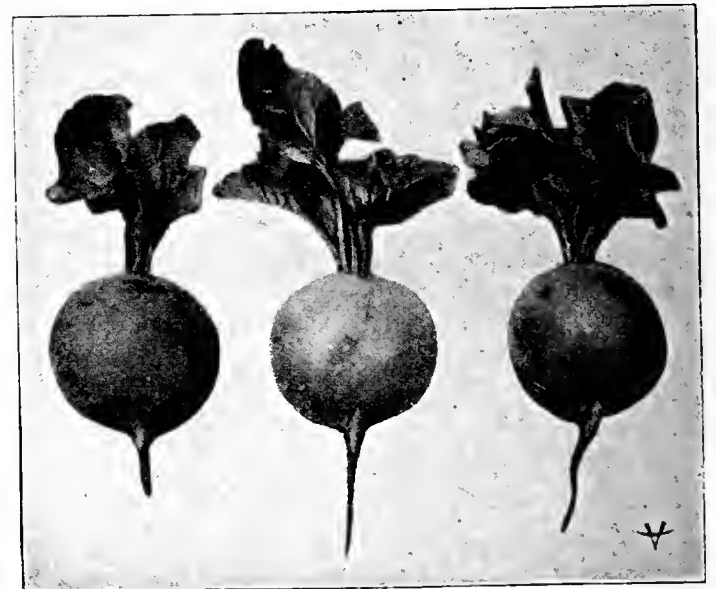

An early-flowered batch of the showy Tuberous-Rooted Begonias will always be appreciated. And as the tubers are offered either in separate colors or in mixture at reasonable rates, there is no reason why every country florist doing a retail business should not handle a few of them. Both double and single-flowered types may be had. The tubers when received may either be potted at once in a mixture of loam, extremely old manure and sand or placed in peat moss on a bench and lightly sprayed until the top growth and roots start. Usually 4-inch pots will answer well for the tubers, although if larger plants are desired, they can later be given a shift.

These Begonias will grow better if kept fairly warm at this season, 55 degrees at night not being too much. Avoid wetting the foliage as much as possible, and later in the season, as the sun grows in power, some shading during the hottest part of the day will prove beneficial. Not only are the large-flowered Begonias useful as potted plants, but later they are excellent to plant in window or porch boxes where there is considerable shade, as well as for bedding out in positions that are so shady other bedding plants will flower little if at all.

Florists on the West Coast recently found a profitable outlet for Double Tuberous Begonia blooms by utilizing them for corsages and table decoration (the stems being wired). This new fashion is now sweeping the country, the flowers commanding a price on a par with that of Orchids and Gardenias.
