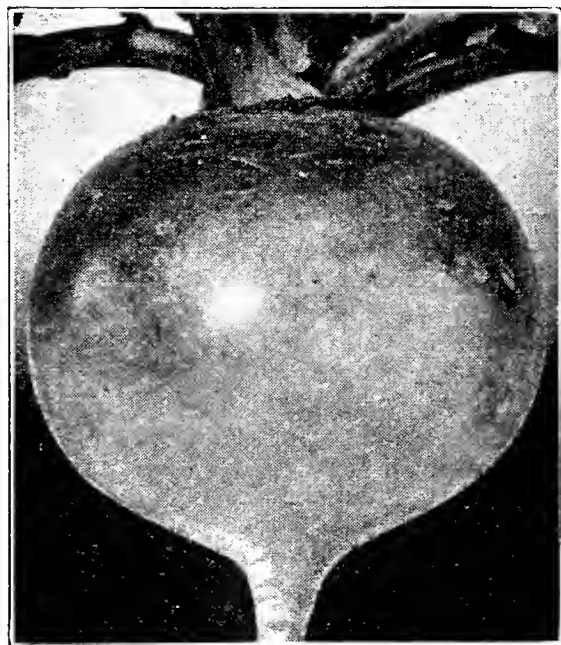

HOW A GOOD LAWN IS MADE

The preparation of the soil in which to plant a lawn is by far the most important step toward success. The surface should be thoroughly spaded or plowed to a depth of ten inches. Well rotted manure, or better still, Archias' "Sure Lawn" fertilizer, should be thoroughly mixed with soil. The soil should be well pulverized and rolled before sowing. It requires approximately one pound of seed to every three hundred square feet or seventy-five to one hundred pounds to the acre. Be sure to sow evenly and rake in, water regularly and carefully. Do not allow seed bed to dry out during germination period. When grass is three inches high cut and roll again. Repeat until grass is firm. The lawn should be kept free from weeds the first season.
