## Terms and Information

SOIL CULTURE-The wild flowers in this list grow in well drained, gritty soil in full sun. Nost can stand some shade. They should never be ailowed to diy out the first yoa, yet they cannot ive with water standing around the roots, they must have drainage. The height specified indicates the approximate height of each plant as found in wild state. All plants listed " $R$ " are good for rock gardens altho rocks are not necessary for their growth.
HARDINESS-All plants listed have been subject to ten degrees below zero weather and with protection should stand much more.
PACKING-We pack all our plants with utmost care and guarantee them to reach customers in good condition. Any failing to do will be replaced if report is made at once.

SHIPPING DATES-Shipments are made from October 1st to May 1st except Caeti, they can be shipped any time.

SEEDS-We do not have seeds, but for acecmmodation to the ones who prefer seed to plants we will accept your order at 25 e per package to be collested the following summer providing the order reaches us not later than April 1st. R. Androstephium Coeruleum - Wild EyacinthBulbous plant 4 to 6 inches high, fleshy leaves and stems. Waxy light blue flowers an in th of more across in early spring. Tops die
down soon after blooming.
Allionia Linearis - Umbrella Plant - Slender stems c p to 3 feet high. An odd plant that many times in fall bears two entirely di furant blossoms at one time.
R. Aster Oblongifoling Rigidulus -- Pink-Flowered Aster - A rare plant. Bushy to maks the plant appear a!most round, small lcaves on th? slender stiff stems, pink fowers on inel ois more accross that nearly hide the plant when they bloom in the fall. Fine for rock carilens or border. Scarce. 50c each or 3 for $\$ 1.00,6$ inches high.
R. Aster Patens - Blue Asters - Bushy, sicnter stemed plant with small leaves. 6 to 8 inches high, blue flower in fall.
R. Aster Maltiflorus - Whits Asters - Wtite stems, bushy with small leaves, heatis of small white flowers in fall, 12 to 14 inches. Goo.? for larger rock gardens.

Asclepiss Veríicillata - Whorled Milkweed Erect 18 inch stems, narrow dars green 1:av. s, ciuster of white fiowers in summer followed by long slender secd pods.

Asclepias Tuberosa - Rutier?lyweed - Dard green leafy stems ,terminal flowerheads of bright oramge. Booms in late spring. 2 foct. 35 c each or 4 for $\$ 1.00$

Baptisia Rracteata - Wild Indigo - Stout stems a toot high. Drooping racemes of creamy flowers. A very showy plant hat is nice for larger rock gardens. Tops die down in summer after flowering. $35 \mathrm{c}, 4$ for 81.0 ?
Baptisia Vespertina - Blue Wild Indigo - A good campanion for above, grows a little tailer as the blue flowered racemes are ero.t. Very showy. 35c each or 4 for $\$ 1.00$
R. Bellis Integrifolia - Western Daisy - This is a fine plant for the rock garilen or for sro.rd cover. Small basal leaves, slender fllower stems that after blooming bend to root in the ground forming a cover. Flowers with golden centers, white rays with a pink edge on 4 in in stems. Blooms in spring and carly summer Attractive all season. 35 c, or 4 for $\$ 1.00$
R. Allium Murabile - Wild Onion - Bulbous plants 6 inches high, fleshy leaves and stems. Tlowers in umbels white or pink. Elcoms in spring.
R. Cooperia Drammondii - Rain Lily - Bulbous plant with fleshy grass like lcaves. Flower
stems 4 to 6 inches bearing large, wayy wiita flowers that appear after the fall rains start. Very fine. 50c each.
R. Capmoides Rontanim - Mountain Corydalis A very useful annual for carly boom. Masess of light green fathery foliage and loose clusters of bright yellow flowers. Starts to bloom when 4 inches high and continues until is reaches a height of 10 inches.
R. Comandra Pallita - Tondfax-Flower stems 6 inches high with lieads of sreenish flowers in early spring.
R. Craeca Virginica - Calico-pea - A buahy plant with pinnate leaves 10 inshes high bearing many flowers of unusual combination. The pea-form flowers are of nice size, standard petals and keel are cream to deep yellow, wings are bright rose pink.
R. Casgia Fasciculata - Partridge-pea - Sensitive leaves of feathery form. Large yellow, flowers with black stamens. 10 inch amual blooming most of summer.
R. Chryscpsis Villosa - Goldon Aster - A bushy plant with smail gray-green lcaves 8 inchoz high, yollow flowers in late summer and fall.
R. Commelina Crispa- Dayflower - Semi-creeping plant, jointed stems, bright blue flowers all summer.
R. Callirhoo Involucraia - Poppy Mallow Trailing plant with long thick roots, deeply cleft leaves, red flowers with white center in spring and summer.
R. Callirhoe Alceoides - Light Poppy Mallow Erect, 6 inches her?, branching at the base from a thick wocdy root, most of the leaves deep'y lobed, flowers pink or white, blooming nearly all summer.
Coreonsis Tinctoria - Tickseed - Anmual with branching stems and few leaves, bright yollow flower with rich crimson centers in late fall.
Dolphinium Virescens - Prairie Larkspur Erect stems up to 3 feet, bluish-white flowers in terminal racemos. If cut back when flowers fade it will bloom again, blooms in spring an:l early summer.
R. Evolvulus Nuttallianus - Several leafy stems 6 inches high with small pink flowers, belong to the Morning Glory family altho it is nontwining and is not weedy. Blooms in the spring.

Enhimacea Ancustifclia - Coneílower- Rough satiy gotound leaves, foot high flower stems bearing iarge foowers with dark centios and long purpic rays in summer.

Gutierrezia Sarofima - Broomweed - Slender, much bianched sirubby piants winh emall alternate liner Leaves and numerous small heads of bright yellow flowers neariy all summei. Up to ton inches tall.
F. Gcomrumnon Crassicarpum - Ground Plun Low traiing pant with odd-pinnate leaves and clusters of purple flowers in early spring. The inflated seed-pods are very attractive.
R. Gaillardia Pulcheita - Blankeflower - Ann. ual 8 inches higin, braching freely from the base and bearing many bright fowers throug : the summer.
T. Galpinsia Laventulaeiosa - Evening Primiost Woody branching stems 10 inches high, smail green leaves and large showy yellow flower:; all season.

Gilia Longiflora - White-flowered Gilia Branching stems, pimately divided narrov: leaves, many phlox-form pure white flowers from spring to fall. Biemial
Geura Villesa - Erect stems up to 3 fee high, terminal racemes of white or pink flowers in spring and summer.
R. Gaura Coceinea - Branching plants 3 inches high, small leaves and dainty white flowers turning pink.
R. IIClintonia Angustiforia - Erect branching stems 6 to 8 inches high, white flowers in dense torminal clusters in spring and summer a fine rock garden plant.
Ipomoea Leptophylia - Bush Morning GloryPlants 3 to 4 feet broad, about 2 feet high, extra large handsome flowers of bright pink. This plant has an enormous root and is difficult to transplant. We suggest seed. (See seeds.)
R. Ionoxalis Amplifolia - Violet Wood Sorrel Bulbous plant 4 inches high, rose-purple flowers in spring. Tops die down after blooming.
R. Lathyrus Ornatus - Wild Sweet Pea - Plants with slender branching 8 inch stoms, large rose-purple flowers in spring and summer.
R. Lithospermum Hirtum - Hairy Puccoon Stout, erect stems, thickly set with narrow dark green leaves, 6 to 8 inches high, large
heads of orange flowers in spring and eurly summer. Finc.
is Lithospermum Angustifolium - Namow Leaved Puccoon - Narrow gray-green leaves, branching stems 6 inches high, bright yeliow flowers in spring and carly summer.

Linum Sulcatum - Yellow Flax - Anm:al, with slendor branching stems up to 1 foot hiigh yellow flowers with darker centers.
R. Liatris Punctaia - Dwarf Gay Feather One to several leafy stems 8 inches high, dense spikes of purple flowers in late summer and fail. Give this full sun and poor soil to see it at its best.

Liatris Squarrosa - Blazing Star - Mostly single stems except in cultivated plants, uip to 18 inches high, purple button like flowers in late summer and fall.
R. Malvasirum Coccineum - False Mallow Erect branching stems 6 inehes high, lobed gray-green leaves, light scarlet flower all summer.
R. Meriolix Serrulata - Prairio Primiose- Small leaves, erect woody stems up to 8 inches high, inch and one-half flower:s that stay open all day. Blooms from early spring to frost. Very nice.

Meganter:um Missouriensis - Evening Primrose - Stems decumbent or ascending, long narrow leaves, large yellow flowers up to 4 inches broad all summer. Plant up to a foot high and as wide. 50c each.

Mintelia Decapetalta - Prairic Star - One to several stout stems up to 30 inches high, branching at top and bearing many very large cream-white flowers in late summer and fall. 35 c each, 4 for $\$ 1.00$

1. Oxytropis Lambertii - Puxple Loco - Low plant with odd-pinnate leaves, 4 inche flower stem bearing cluster of purple flowers in spring and early summer.

Petalostemum Villosus - Pink Prairie Clover Several erect stems 10 to 14 inches high, the odd-pinnate leaves and stems are covered with a soft white down, terminal spikes of soft pink flowers. Fine.
Petalostemum Purpureum - Purple Prairie Clover - Branching slender stems thickly set with small dark green leaves up to 18 inches high, fragrant purple flower-balls.

Petalostemum Candidus - White Prairie Clover - Much like the above but bearing white flower-balls.

Parosela Aurea - Golden Parosela - Velvety divided leaves, stems up to 14 inches high terminal balls of yellow flowers all season. Rare. 35c each.
R. Pulsatilla Patens - Pasque Flower - Low plant with bulb like root, divided ground leaves, erect flower stems up to 6 inches high bearing showy white or blue flowers. Tops die down in summer after flowering.
R. Polygala Alba - White Milkwort - Several slender stems 6 inches high with small narrow dark green leaves and terminal racemes of small white flowers.

Pentstemon Cobaea - Stout erect stems up to 18 inches high, large dark green leaves, very large light colored flowers with dark mark ings. Fine.

Pentstemon Grandiflorus - Stout erect stems up to 30 inches high, large light green leaves, very large lavender-blue flowers in spring and early summer. Fine
R. Ruellia Occidentalis - Wild Petunia - Several leafy stems 6 to 8 inches high, large violet flowers in the axils of the leaves. Blooming most of the summer.

Ratibita Columnifera - Cone Flower - Up to ten inches high, pinnately parted alternate. leaves, showy flowers with yellow drooping rays from a dark disk, blooming most of the summer.

Senecio Riddellii - Groundsel - Green pinnately divided leaves, 18 inch stems witia heads of yellow flowers in late summer an:l fall.

Solidago Wardii - Fragrant Goldenrod Several erect stems with smooth green leaves and spikes of yellow flowers in late summer and fall that rival the grape for fragrance.

IR. Soldago Glaberrima - Dwarf Goldenrod Low herb with stout erect stems and thick lance-like clusters of golden florets in fall. This make a nice rock plant if given very poor, rocky soil, otherwise it will grow too large.
R. Sisyrinchium /Varians - Blue-eyed Grass Slender grass like plants with numerous erect stems, 6 inches high, bright blue flowers in spring and summer.

Sideranthus Spinulosus - Several stout ster.s up to ten inches high, small toothed green
leaves, heads of yellow flowers in summer and fall.

Salvia Pitcheri - Blue Sage - Several stont stems up to 3 feet high, narrow green loaves and terminal spikes of blue flowers in summer and fall.
R. Scutellaria Resinosa - Skullcap - Severa! erect leafy stems 6 to 8 inches high, blue flowers with white dotted throats all seasou. Very fine.
R. Tradescantia Occidentalis - Blue Spiderwort Erect stems, narrow elongated leaves and showy flowers in terminal umbel-like cymes, shades of blue and purple. Blooming in spring and early summer.
R. Tradescantia Occidentalis Rubra - Pink Spiçerwort - Much like the above except thos flowers are pink to red-rose. 35 c each, 4 for $\$ 1.00$
R. Tradescantia Virginica - White SpiderwortBroader leaves and larger white flowers.
R. Townsendia Exscapa - Easter Daisy - Thiek tufts of narow green leaves, large stemiess flowers with pinkish-white rays, buds set in winter and bloom in early spring. A very in teresting rock plant.
R. Talinum Calycinum - Fame Flower - Thick tufts of fleshy leaves, 6 inch smooth wiry branching flower stems bearing many large bright pink flowers all summer. This is a fine plant, likes a fairly dry sandy soil and full sun.
R. Tetraneuris Stenophylla - Yellow Daisy Narrow green basal leaves, disk flowers with? yellow rays on slender, erect 4 inch stems. Bolongs to the sunflower family although it is not weedy.
R. Viola Missouriensis - Violet - Large light blue flowers in early spring. Some shade and moisture.

Vernonia Interior - Ironweed - Leafy stems and large heads of purple flowers.
R. Verbena Bipinnatifida - Prostrate herbs with pinnately lobed leaves and terminal heads of lilac flowers nearly all season.
R. Verbena Canadensis - Large Flowering Vëbena - Plant and habit much like the above but with larger flowers of bright purple.
Verbena Hastata - Erect, stout stems with large leaves up to 2 feet high, dense spikes of purplish-blue flowers in summer.
R. Xanthoxalis Stricta - Yellow Wood Sorrel Leafy stems 3 to 4 inches high, yellow flowers
in umbel-like cluster
Yucea Tenuistyla - Narrow sharp-pointed leaves with white edge, stout flower stems up to 4 feet high, large greenish-white flowers in summer. 35c each, 4 for $\$ 1.00$

## Shrubs and Trees

Amorpla Canescens - Shoestrings - A summer blooming shrub 2 ft . high, deep blue flower with golden stamens in ierminal spikes, the pinnate leaves and stems are covered with a soft, silvery down. 50 c each, or 3 for $\$ 1.00$. Ailanthus Glanduiosa - Tree of Heaven - A quick growing shade tree with a tropical appearance. It is a native tree of Eastern Asia. 50c each or 3 for $\$ 1.00$

Artemisia Filifolia - Sagebrush - Silvery foliage forming neat clumps, fine low hedge. 35 c each or 4 for $\$ 1.00$

Ceanothus Ovatus - Redroot - A neat shrub up to 18 inches high, heads of a small fragrant white flower in spring and often again in the fall. 50 ceach or 3 for $\$ 1.00$

Ceris Occidentalis - Redbud -Small tree, large heart shaped leaves, branches are covered with purple flowers in early spring. 50c each.

Cornus Asperifolia - Dogwood - Shrub up to 8 feet high, clusters of creamy-white flowers followed by white berries. 50c each or 3 for $\$ 1.00$

Prunus Gracilis - Low Plum - Dainty little shrub bearing many fragrant white flowers in spring followed by edible fruit. 50c each.

Quercus Havardii - Shinoak - A low shrub rarely reaching more than 3 feet high, lobed lea ves that in fall turn many colors, often bearing acorns when a few inches high. 50e each. The acorns ripen about August and sprout at, once so they can not be held long. We can furnish them at $\$ 3.00$ per lb. pustage pre paid, providing the order reaches us not later than June 1st.

Ribes Odoratum - Golden Currant - Shruo 3 to 4 feet high, green lobed leaves and very fragrant yellow flowers in spring followed by edible fruit.. 50 c each or 3 for $\$ 1.00$

Rhus Glabra - Prairie Sumac - Erect shrub, large cluster of red berries all summer, leaves turn red in fall. 50 c each or 3 for $\$ 1.00$
R. Rosa Foliosa - Fairy Rose - Small stems 4 to 8 inches high, small dark green leaves and large fragrant white flowers. 50c each.

Rosa -? - Prairie Rose - Stout erect stems up to 16 inches high, large fragrant pink flowers dotted red. 50 c each or 3 for $\$ 1.00$ Salvia Greggei - Scarlet Sage - Small shrubs up to 16 inches high, slender erect stems small glossy leaves and bright scarlet flowers all summer and fall. 50c each.

Sambucus Canadensis - Elderberry -. Strubs up to 8 feet high with pinnately compound leaves and clusters of smail white flowers int early spring followed by black berries. 50c each. 4 for $\$ 1.00$
Sapindus Drummondii - Chinaberry - Small tree with thick green folage and clusters of large translucent yellow berries lasting through the winter. The hard black seed; ais. often used for beads. 50 c each. Seed, $\$ 3.0$ o per lb. post paid.
Symphoricarpos Vulgaris - Corralberry Low branching shrub with soft green leaves, slender stems bend with the weight of red berries in the winter. 35 c each or 4 for $\$ 1.00$
Schmaltzia Trilobata - Branching shrubs :3 feet high, clusters of creamy flowers in spring followed by bristly red berries. 50c each.

## Hardi Cacti

Echinocereus Baileyi - This cactus comes from the Wichita Mountains and we believe we are the only ones listing it. Cylindric plants, many ribs covered with short spine;, very large bright pink flowers. As its home is in the mountains it should stand more moisture than some but it must heve good drainage. 75 c each.
Mamillaria Montana - Small short cylindric plants, chestnut spines, pink flowers. .30e each. Mamillaria Decipiens - Much like M. Montana in shape, gray spines, tan flowers and red berries during the winter and spring. 30c each
Opuntia Vulgaris - Green flat joints, large yelow flowers, centers sometimes red. 25 each.
Opuntia Leptocaulis - Small cylindric joints, straw colored flowers and red frult. 40c each. Opuntia Arborescens - Tree Cactus -Cylindric stems 6 feet or more in height, flowers deep rose. 40c each.
Opuntia Echinocarpa - Buckhorn Cactus Cylindric stems 2 to 3 feet high, long sheathed spines, flowers greenish-yellow. 40 c each.
Opuntia Opuntia - een flat joints without large spines, yellow flowers. 25 c .
Opuntia -? - Baby Opuntia - Green flat joints seldom as much as 2 inches across. yellow flowers. 30c each.
