Do not think because my prices are low that my bulbs are not high grade. I keep my expenses down, avoid lists adorned with colored pictures which you would have to pay for when buying bulbs. If you have never grown any Gladiolus why not try a few this year. You will be delighted with their easy culture and amazing heauty for a cut flower, often lasting nearly two weeks if cut as the first bud is opening.

## SIZE OF BULBS

Many growers advertise gladiolus bulbs as good blooming size, etc., but do not state the exact size which gives them a chance to sell a lot of small or medium size bulbs at a price equal to that charged by me for large bulbs. Large bulbs make the largest flower spikes, bloom earlier and cost about twice as much to pay the postage on as plant the bulbs. Io not offer small bulbs this year as most of my customers want flowers the same year they package but cannot guarantee bulblets from most of the varieties listed in the Group lots for 10c for a generous from $3 / 4$ of an inch up to $11 /$ inch in diam. Large bulbs will be $11 / 4$ inches or over in diameter, medium bulbs are to expect; anyway if the bulbs do not suit you when they arrive you can you order from me you know what size I guarantee bulbs to be true to name but cannot guarantee growth or production when grown by someone back. No honest grower can. If your neighbor has Thrips in his garden and they fly into yours, do not blame me for that. Thrips can be controlled and eliminated. It's only a matter of cooperation among those who plant gladiolus. My bulbs are all treated before shipping as a preventive measure.

I wish to thank my many friends and customers, who gave me their liberal patronage last year. I have received kind words of praise for the bulbs purchased from me from a large number of you, my friends. I have not become rich selling bulbs from a financial standpoint, but I am rich in the many new friends and acquaintances I have made in the past 15 years I have been growing and selling Gladiolus Bulbs. It is surprising the number of visitors I have at the gardens during the blooming season. Some have come from as far away as New Jersey, and many from all over New England. Come again this year as many times as you can. You are welcome whether you buy or not.
