Offer the following tuberous begonias for delivery in January and February 1936:

New Types (double):

New Marmorata Hybrids - having large camellia-like flowers with variegated edges. Colors--red, white, pink, salmon.

Camellia-flowered Type - in colors of white, blush, pink, rose, crimson, cardinal red, light salmon, and dark salmon.

Fimbriata Plena (or carnation type - frilled) - in shades of white, pink, rose, crimson, salmon, red, yellow, apricot, orange, scarlet.

Rosebud Type - as its name implies, resembles a rose in the bud. In mixed colors only this year.

Giant Singles; Single Frilled; Single Crested: Colors--white, pink, salmon, yellow, orange, rose, scarlet, and crimson.

Narcissiflora Type, resembling the trumpet daffodil. Colors--yellow, orange, salmon, and scarlet.

Lloydi Type (for hanging baskets). Colors--white, pink, rose, crimson, scarlet, yellow, salmon, apricot, and orange.

Orders will be accepted up to the middle of February for any of the above types. After that date we cannot guarantee types but always have a stock of mixed ones on hand.

Tubers are 1 to  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches.

Prices: All types \$10.50 per 100. Fifty at 100 rates. Per dozen - \$1.50. All prepaid. (Orders for less than one dozen not accepted).

Terms: Small orders, cash with order; otherwise 50% cash with order, balance C.O.D., or on notification that tubers are ready for mailing, thus eliminating C.O.D. charges. Tubers will be shipped in February.
