Periods of Bloom and Suggestions

Varieties are annuals unless marked "P" for Perennial or "B" for Biennial.

Periods of bloom: 1 Early, 2 Mid-Season, 3 Late. Periods for perennials apply to the year after planting.

Plant some flowers from each group for a succession of bloom in your garden.

Ageratum (Floss Flower)	Small, fuzzy, azure blue flowers for borders.	1	2
Alyssum , Gold Dust (P)	Basket of Gold. A popular rock garden variety.	1	1
Anchusa , Blue Bird	Vivid blue flowers like giant Forget-Me-Nots.	1½	2
Arabis , Rock Cress (P)	Nothing better for rock gardens. Early blossoms.	½	2
Aster , American Branching	Last long after cutting. Best all-around Aster.	2	3
Aster , Giant of California	Very large, full flowers with broad, graceful petals.	2½	3
Aster , Giant Comet (Crego)	Long, wavy petals. Often called Ostrich Feathered Asters.	2	3
Aster , King	Large quilled flowers with unusually long stems.	2	3
Aster , Sunshine	The improved Giant Sunshine. A new Aster.	2	3
Aster , Queen of the Market	The most suitable Aster for Southern planting.	1½	3
Bachelor's Button (Cornflower)	An old favorite. In blue or in mixed colors.	2	2-3
Balsam , Camellia	Splendid background for low annuals.	1½	2
Blue Bells of California	Dainty little flowers of gentian blue. Excellent for rockery.	½	2-3
Butterfly Flower	Botanically, Schizanthus. Commonly, Poor Man's Orchid. Artistically superb.	1½	2-3
Calendula (Pot Marigold)	Your choice of Sunshine, Orange King, and all colors.	1½	2-3
Calliopsis , All Shades	Rich colors of autumn foliage. Fine for cutting.	1	2

Canterbury Bells (B)	A good mixture including double and cup and saucer strains.	2½	1
Canterbury Bells , Annual	At last! Canterbury Bells that bloom the first year.	2½	3
Cardinal Climber	A rapid climber. Beautiful fern-like foliage.	20	2-3
Carnation , Marguerite	An annual Carnation in all its beautiful colors.	1½	2-3
Chinese Lantern Plant (P)	Brilliant orange pods for winter decorations.	1½	3
Chrysanthemum , Eldorado	Bright yellow flowers. An All American honorable mention.	1½	2-3
Clarkia	Colorful flowers for borders and for bouquets.	2	2-3
Cockscomb	Formal, stiff plants of unusual shapes. Attractive shades of red.	1	2-3

Coreopsis , Mayfield Giant (P)	A new Coreopsis. Larger flowers, longer stems, brighter yellow.	3	1-2
Cosmos , Early Flowering	Beautiful colors. Excellent for backgrounds.	5	3

Cypress Vine	Like fine moss sprinkled with red and white stars.	8	2

Delphinium , Blue Shades (P)	Without which no perennial border is complete.	3	1
Double Daisy (English Daisy) (P)	Dainty little flowers. Often sown in the lawn.	½	1
Forget-Me-Not (P)	Excellent for borders and rock gardens.	¾	1
Four O'Clock	Showy plants. Attractive for temporary hedges.	3	2-3
Foxglove (Digitalis) (P)	Stalks of little thimble-shaped flowers. Colorful.	3	1
Gaillardia (Blanket Flower) (P)	Large daisy-like flowers in brilliant sunset colors.	2	2
Gypsophila (Baby's Breath)	Dainty sprays that add to bouquets. Pure white.	1½	2-3
Gourd	Develops interesting pods shaped like dippers, bottles, spoons, etc.	12	3
Hollyhock (P)	Bright colors, high along a fence.	6	1-2
Kochia	Commonly, Mexican Firebush. Excellent temporary hedge.	2	2-3

Lobelia , Crystal Palace	The richest blue in the rock garden.	½	2-3
Lupine , King	The new Lupine. Giant flowers in brilliant colors.	3	3
