These odd, exquisite, lovely flowers should be in every rock garden. Few realize the number of varieties available for use in the garden nor the ease with which they can be handled and established. All these listed are hardy anywhere; while all like shade and moisture, some, like Hab. Ciliaris, Calapogon and the Spiranthes, will endure full sun and most of them make good cut flowers.
