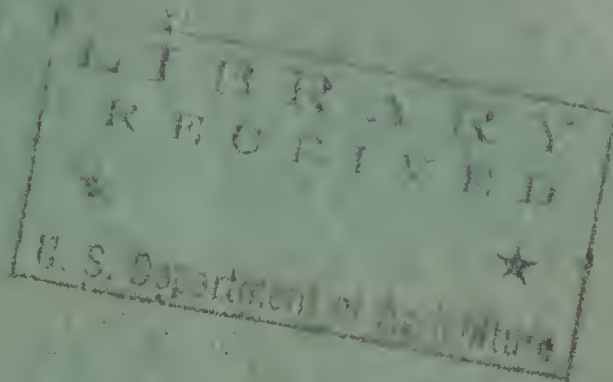

Azaleas thrive best in a well-drained, loamy, acid soil and require very little attention; however, they should not be allowed to become over dry.

The Kurume varieties are excellent for Winter forcing and the plants we offer are especially well budded and shapely, grown for the Florist trade, and force very easily.

Our Azaleas have a wonderful root system with the soil intact and are shipped with a ball of earth.
