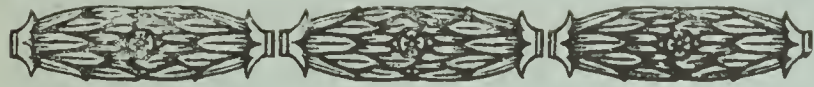

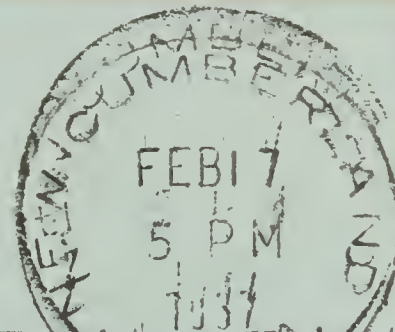

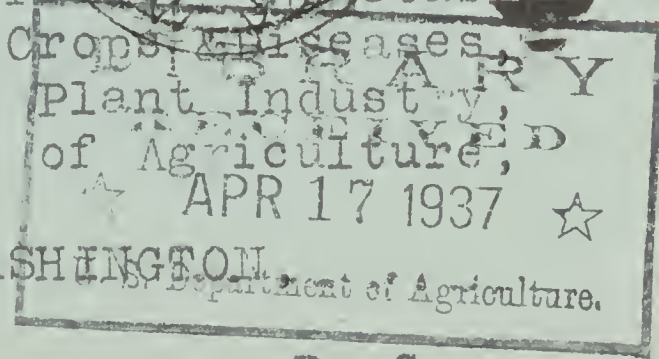

PLANTING

Plant dahlias May 1 to June 15, two or three feet apart. Lay tuber horizontally, sprout up, in hole six inches deep. (Never stand a tuber on end.) Cover with three inches of soil; later, as plant grows, fill in the remaining space. If ground is poor, dig deeper, and put rich top soil in bottom of hole under tuber. For large blooms, allow but one to a branch, removing extra buds while very small. Pompons may be planted closer together and need no disbudding. Remove all fading flowers. Thus cared for they bloom freely until frost.
