## PLANTING

Plant dahlias May 1 to June 15, two or three feet apart. Lav tuber horizontally, enrout up, in hol? six inches deep. (Never stand a tuber on end.) Cover with three inches of soil; later, as plant prows. fill in the remaining space. If sround is poor, dig deeper. and put rich top soil in bottom of hole under tuber. For large blooms. allow hut one to a branch. removing extra buds while very small. Pompons may be mlanted closer together and need no dis. budding. Remove all fading flowers. Thus cared for they bloom freely until frost.
