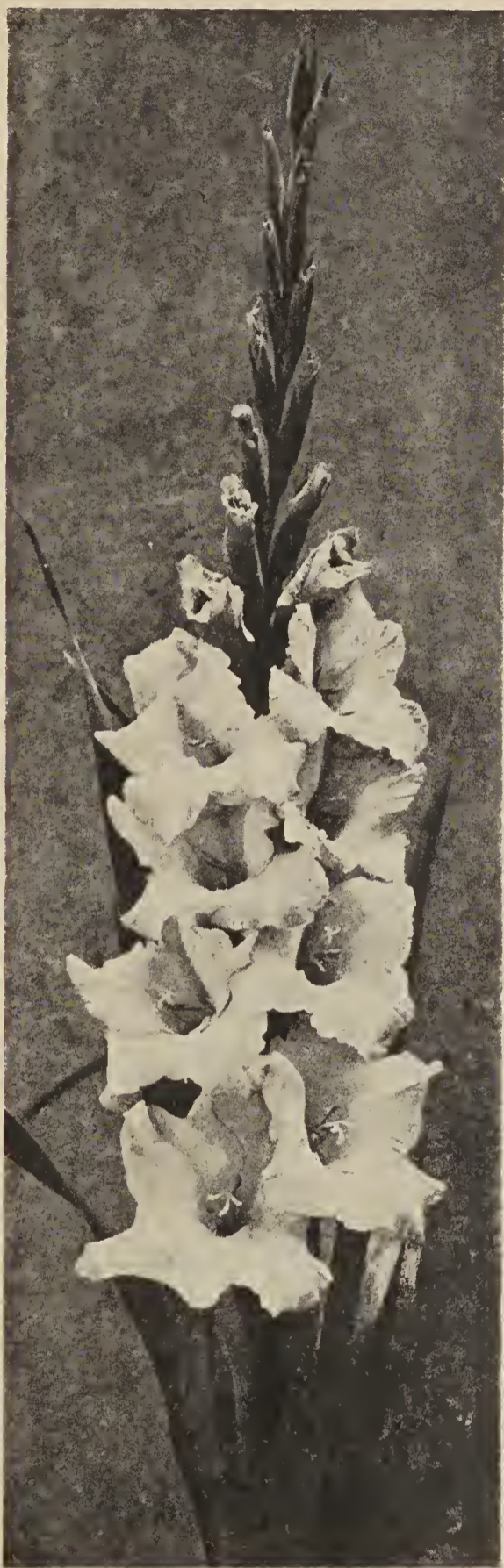

AWATEA (Burns) Peach pink flaked lightly rose and shaded to sulphur yellow throat, small purple feather. L-\$7.50, M-\$5.00, S-\$2.00, B-75c.

BABE B (Sioux) Originated near the Paul Bunyan country famous in legend for the blue snow and blue ox from what the named is derived. The nearest medium blue we have ever seen, being a clear solid color with small purple blotch and no spear points of yellow. Competent judges of gladiolus have stated that they prefer it to Ave Maria. Florets are wide open and large with six open on tall straight spike. Bulbs are all plump and high crowned and keep the best of any blue we grow. Very prolific and bulblets germinate close to 100%. Any sized bulb \$2.00, Bulblets 15 for \$2.00.

CHAMOIS (Mair) Tall growing and vigorous. Buff in color and opens up to 8 large wide well arranged florets. L-\$1.50, M-\$1.00, S-75c, B-15c.

DACHOTA (Enger) This new seedling gives us a fine break in having an extremely long flower head with many buds, with its tall straight spike and up to 26 buds with 10 to 14 open blooms one can still have a balanced specimen for show work. Florets are wide open and arrangement is ideal, individual blooms from large bulbs are six inches or better in diameter and have excellent substance. Foliage wide and deep green with spike breaking well above, giving one a good long stem. The color is pure light cream throat blending beautifully to a rich salmon pink toward outer portions of bloom. Extremely vigorous growth from bulbs and bulblets. Large or Medium Bulbs \$5.00 each; Bulblets 75c, net.

COLIN ENDEAN (Whiteley) Geranium pink with deeper blotch on throat, very husky grower and can be recommended. M-\$2.00, S-\$1.50, B-30c.

DAILY RECORD (Mair) Deep crimson with pure white throat, large blooms. L-\$2.00.

DUPREE (Enger) Deep rose self, florets wide open with edges recurved, producing a beautiful exhibition spike, straight and tall grower, 16 to 18 buds with 7 to 9 open. L-\$2.50 net.

FIDAC (Enger) This one has all the good qualities of Dachota in growth and vigor and will build up a spike of 24 to 27 buds with 9 to 12 open. Style of spike resembles Max Reger. Color is pure white with no trace of cream or other color, stamen dark blue. Large florets of excellent substance and is early. Both Dachota and Fidac should be desirable for exhibition and commercial purposes as they are consistent in producing excellent spikes that do not crook, good propagators, and their clean colors add the desired charm that many are lacking. L-\$4.00 net.

FIREFLAME (Mair) Orange scarlet that builds up a fine spike. L-\$1.50.

FRALANCE (Burns) LaFrance pink with cream blotch, is really an improved *Coryphee*. Bulblets only, \$1.00.

HAKAWAI (Miller) Salmon pink flaked deeper, crimson blotch on white throat, this opens up 14 with ease on a 20-bud spike. Champion bloom Christ church 1934-36. L-\$3.00.

KOMIRI (Burns) This is reported to be one of the best from Burns originations. Ours bloomed at the height of our heat and drouth so are not prepared to state our own conclusions. From bulblets later in the season the color would seem to be a frosted rosy lavender. Spikes are gunbarrel type, opens 8 large 6-inch florets of ideal arrangement. Early. A. of M. New Zealand 1935. L-\$12.00, M-\$8.00, S-\$4.00, B-\$1.25.

MANU (Burns) This variety received the F. C. C. as a decorative in New Zealand. Color is a delightful pink with petals like wax, strong tall grower, blooms from bulblets. Opens up to 8 large florets. L-\$7.50, M-\$5.00, S-\$2.50, B-75c.

MEDALIST (Mair) Crieese with darker edges on white blotch. Best seedling B. G. S. L-\$2.00.

MILLIE PARKS (McFetrich) This variety is a wonderful improvement on D. A. Hay. Color similar being light salmon to flesh pink, penciled and flaked rose with yellow throat. Mid-season. Can recommend this for all purposes. L-\$8.00, M-\$6.00, S-\$3.00, B-80c.

MOANA (Julyan) LaFrance pink throat slightly penciled carmine. Fine spike with many open. L-\$1.50, M-\$1.00, S-50c, B-15c.

MONICA MAGEE. Rose pink deepened to rose with deeper rose flaking on edge, deeper marking in throat, usually 8 open of good size. L-75c, M-50c, S-25c, B-10 for 75c.

OTARA (Whiteley) Tall and straight yellow self with 8 to 10 large florets open at once. The color is a medium yellow and the growth is all that could be desired. Very prolific, looks like a real contender in this class. L-\$1.00, M-75c, S-50c, B-15 for \$1.00.

RAWHITI (Julyan) Pleasing shade of salmon pink, edges of petal slightly penciled mauve that adds greatly to its beauty, carmine lines in throat. 10 to 12 large well placed florets open at once on tall straight spike, excellent for exhibition. A. of M. New Zealand test garden 1931. Champion seedling and best novelty N. Z. G. S. Christ church 1935. L-\$3.00, M-\$2.00, S-\$1.00, B-30c.

REWI FALLU (Fallu) From what we have seen of this variety we think this is the best of the deep reds. Excellent grower showing vigor and health, bulblets show wonderful growth, many will bloom. Opens up to 8 with ease and combined with its fine color and ease of producing excellent show spikes we predict that this will be tops in its class for some time to come. No one will go wrong in including this one in their must haves. L-\$10.00, M-\$7.50, S-\$5.00, B-\$1.00, net.

RONGO (Julyan) Light cerise with throat make up of deeper color, straight spike with 10 open, good healthy grower. L-\$1.00.

SCARLET CANNA (Burns) This appears to be an improved Dr. Bennett, a dazzling scarlet with six-inch blooms of which 8 are open, another super-decorative that will go far. FCC as a decorative N. Z. 1936. Stock very limited. M-\$5.00, S-\$3.00, B-\$1.00.

TANIWHA (Miller) Very large florets of salmon pink slightly tinted slate that does not detract, cherry red blotch, 6 to 8 open, and can be recommended. L-\$1.00, M-60c, S-50c, B-2 for 20c—100 for \$6.00.

WAIKAWA (Burns) F. C. C. New Zealand 1935. Very charming large type, tall growing, delightful color eosine pink with lip on cream throat. Nicely ruffled and many open. L-\$15.00, M-\$10.00, S-\$5.00, B-\$1.25.

GENERAL LIST

AFLAME (H.) A prim grand. Flowers frequently measure six inches across and up to six open. Fine for exhibition. Begonia rose shading to a bright orange flame at edge of petals. L-12 for 50c.

ALBATROSS (Pf.) Large pure white blooms on tall spike, many times winner, good propagator and one of the best whites. L-12 for 70c, M-12 for 50c, S-12 for 30c, B-100 for 25c.

ALIGHT (H.) Pink sport of Aflame, beautiful pink with white throat, this should be in better demand with Aflame. L-12 for \$1.00, M-12 for \$3.00, S-12 for \$2.00, B-100 for \$3.00.

AMETHYST (S.) Large flowers of regular exhibition form, straight spike of a distinct shade of lilac rose with deeper rose bordering, white center line on each petal, constant winner in its class. L-12 for \$1.00, M-12 for 75c, S-12 for 40c.

BEAU BROCADE (Kel.) Large deep mauve, long spike and good propagator. L-12 for \$2.00, M-12 for \$1.50, S-12 for \$1.00, B-100 for \$1.00.

BENTLEIGH (Gil.) A new cream for Australia, well built tall spike with plenty flowers wide open at once. L-12 for 75c, M-12 for 50c, B-12 for 30c.

BEOWULF (Nitchman) Reported to be an improvement on Minuet, being a giant in growth from bulbs and bulblets, late rose pink lavender. M-\$8.00, S-\$4.00, B-\$1.00.

BERICE (Whiteley) Outstanding rose pink, ivory throat with crimson blotch, about six large florets open on tall straight spike. L-40c, M-30c, S-20c, B-12 for 30c.

BERTY MAIR (M.) Lighter in color than Berty Snow, slightly ruffled and seems to be an improvement on that variety. L-12 for 80c, M-12 for 50c.

BERTY SNOW (M.) Medium to deep mauve pink, one of the best ten without a doubt. Frequently has 10-12 immense soft lilac blooms open at once, one that is hard to beat at any time. L-12 for 50c, M-12 for 30c, S-12 for 30c.

BETTY (M.) Bright orange rose with white center, large spike with 6 open. L-12 for 60c, M-12 for 40c, S-12 for 25c, B-100 for 50c.

BILL SOWDEN (F.) One of the best reds to come from down under. Although spike is not overly tall the flowers are large and color is a different red than ours here. Many times winner and rated near the top in Australia. M-12 for 40c, S-12 for 25c.

BLONDE (Gil.) Choice apricot shaded peach and cream, outstanding in decorative and commercial classes and very potent pollen plant in hybridizing. L-12 for 80c, M-12 for 60c, B-100 for 50c.

BLUE DANUBE (Pf.) A fine pure amethyst blue with deeper blotch, 6 to 8 open and arrangement is very good. L-12 for 80c, M-12 for 60c.

CAESAR (Roozan-DeGroot, Ger.) Flat type that sets up well to spike, salmon pink with carmine blotch-petals slightly ruffled. We have found this about the best of the lot sent out in recent years by this firm. Excellent grower and propagator, triumph type but easy to grow and excellent for hybridizing. L-15c, M-10c, B-10c-15c.

CAMLOT (E.) Clear deep salmon pink with edges of petals occasionally flecked with orange, crimson blotch, powdered cream at edges and the large well placed flowers make up an excellent exhibition variety. **L-12 for 60c, M-12 for 40c, S-12 for 25c, B-100 for 60c.**

CARMINEA (M.) One of Mairs that is different in color, being a Tyrian rose base, heavily blushed carmine, white blotch overlaid with carmine. **L-12 for 80c, M-12 for 60c, S-12 for 40c, B-100 for 60c.**

CARRARA (DeG.) Prim grand, pure white with large open flowers, 6 to 7 open, well arranged on tall slender spike, A. of M. Haarlem 1931. **L-12 for \$1.50, M-12 for \$1.00, S-12 for 50c, B-100 for 50c.**

CECIL (M.) Clear salmon scarlet with lemon blotch, many open. **L-12 for 60c.**

CHASSEUR. A bold crimson blotch, set on a rosy salmon ground color, gives a very striking effect to the extra large flowers, eight to ten of which are well placed on a tall spike. The showiness of this variety is also enhanced by the vivid crimson stripes which appear on the outer portion of the flower. **L-50c.**

CHRISTINE (Mair, S.) One of Mair's choice new ones, color is light fleshy rose slightly flecked darker with white blotch, spike and flowers more robust than Mairs average, healthy vigorous grower. **L-12 for \$3.00, M-12 for \$2.00, S-12 for \$1.00, B-10 for 25c.**

COMMANDER KOEHL (Pf.) A Massive blood red, the flowers of this variety are large, the spike is exceptionally long and straight, produces fine spike from small bulbs. **L-12 for 50c, M-12 for 30c, S-12 for 15c, B-100 for 20c.**

CORANGAMITE (Errey, A.) This variety has not received the share of praise due it. Ten or more large flowers open at once on tall straight spike. Color is a bright salmon rose with faint buff and yellow shades in the throat. As an exhibition variety it will be very fine and as a commercial we predict a very great future for it as every spike will be salable, substance and color excellent for all types of work, produces many bulblets that germinate 90%. **L-12 for \$1.00, M-12 for 60c, S-12 for 40c, B-100 for 60c.**

CORYPHEE (Pf.) The color is one of the finest pinks we have ever seen in Gladiolus. When grown well the spike is tall with 8 to 10 large rounded flowers open at once, has secured champion bloom at many shows. **L-12 for 60c.**

DAFFODIL (Mair) Very tall strong growth with many open, very prolific, color is a golden yellow buff that is very attractive. **L-40c, M-25c, S-15c, B-12 for 25c.**

D. A. HAY (Whiteley) Pleasing shade of pink with cream throat, many large blooms open on fine straight stem. Winner of many Championship spike and awards in test gardens, F.C.C. Australia 1936. **L-30c, M-20c, S-10c, B-12 for 25c.**

DANNY BOY (Julyan) Henna to deep plum shaded red shaded to deeper color toward edge of petals, very remarkable color effect set off with throat of tangerine with bright cherry red stipling. **L-40c, M-25c, S-15c, B-12 for 30c.**

DAVID AIRDRIE (M.) Rosy carmine with light center, tall spike with many large flowers open at once. **L-12 for 50c, M-12 for 30c.**

DIGNITY (M.) Soft rose, very long spike, placement and substance very good. **L-12 for 80c, M-12 for 60c.**

DUNVEGAN. The outer portion of the flower is slate, while in the center a large crimson blotch lights up the flower, making it unusual and attractive. Exhibitors will find this variety to be a distinct and reliable one for use on the show bench, as it seldom fails to form a fine spike. **L-60c.**

DR. BUCHAN (Mair S.) This is a new combination of colors, the three outer petals are scarlet while the three inner petals have a distinct violet shade, together with a white center makes a fine color combination. **L-40c, M-30c, S-20c.**

DR. GLADYS MONTGOMERY (Whitely, N. Z.) We would class this variety as a deep lavender, being the same shade as King Arthur. This variety however is a healthy grower and has more open, taller spike and fully as well ruffled with the florets set up close to the spike without crowding. L-12 for \$3.00, M-12 for \$2.00, S-12 for \$1.00, B-100 for \$3.00.

DURBAN (M.) Crimson suffused with violet at edge of petals, light throat, long spike with 8 large blooms open at once. L-12 for \$2.50, M-12 for \$1.50.

EDELFRAU (G.) A choice old ivory colored glad that is a very fine tall spike and placement very good. L-20c, M-15c, S-10c.

EMILE AUBRUN (L.) One of the finest, good spike, striking color combination of salmon, orange, slate which gives it a rich coppery bronze effect, cherry blotch. L-12 for 50c, M-12 for 30c.

ERICA MORINI (Pf.) A bright scarlet similar to Pfitzers Triumph but a week earlier, better spike and more open. L-12 for \$1.00, M-12 for 75c, S-12 for 50c, B-100 for 60c.

ESME DESAILLY (Errey A.) Large round flowers of excellent substance of an attractive salmon pink, the lower petals cream with carmine lines. Tall straight spike with many open and is invaluable as an exhibition variety and commercial flower. L-12 for 80c, M-12 for 60c, S-12 for 40c, B-100 for 40c.

EUIDES (Errey) Ivory white background slightly flushed lilac pink toward outer edge of petals. Cream throat, very consistent in producing excellent spikes for exhibition or cuts. Big winner wherever shown, and being a fine propagator will likely replace some of our good ones in this class, such as R. Pfitzer and Queen Mary. L-\$1.00, M-50c, S-35c, B-10 for \$1.00.

EUREKA (Gil.) A consistent prize winner, color is a salmon, lip deeper, many large round flowers open. L-20c, M-10c.

EVADNE. An exceptionally strong growing variety which is very reliable in the production of good spikes of large flowers, which are of fine form and substance. The color is exquisite, being a bright orange salmon except for the center of the flower, which is a glowing mixture of orange, crimson and yellow. A gladiolus of great merit. L-75c.

EVELYN STINSON (Symons) Pink overlaid chocolate, deeper in the throat, long spike with many fair sized florets open, fine substance and growth. L-\$1.00, M-60c, S-35c, B-3 for 25c.

FAHNEN JUNKER (G.) A deep yellow from Germany that looks very good, the spike is long and flowers of medium size, placement very good. One of the best basket Glads we have. L-12 for \$1.00, M-12 for 50c, S-12 for 25c, B-100 for 30c.

FAUST (M.) A mahogany red with slate lines that surpasses many in this color. Late midseason, up to exhibition standards. L-12 for \$1.00, M-12 for 60c, S-12 for 40c, B-100 for 30c.

FIELD MARSHALL (M.) Another smoky being of dark red, ground heavily splashed with a bluish slate. Many open on long 20 bun spike. L-12 for \$1.50, M-12 for \$1.00, S-12 for 50c.

FRANK J. McCOY (Briggs) Immense tall strong spike of pure pink. A. G. S. winner this season, many other wins in past season wherever shown. L-12 for 80c, M-12 for 50c, S-12 for 30c, B-100 for 30c.

FRILLED CHAMPION (DeG.) Orange scarlet with a dark brownish red blotch on lower petals, beautifully ruffled. Extra early bloomer and good grower. A real champion, large wide open flowers on strong, tall, always erect spike. L-12 for \$1.00, M-12 for 75c.

GATE OF HEAVEN (Pf. G.) The richest yellow from this well known originator. The florets of this deep yellow are large and well spaced and beautifully ruffled. strong grower and a very good propagator. L-12 for \$1.00, M-12 for 75c, S-12 for 50c, B-100 for 60c.

GENERAL MANGIN (L.) One of Lemoine's choice reds, tall spike of 10 open, orange red with deep crimson markings in throat. L-12 for \$1.50, M-12 for \$1.00, S-12 for 50c, B-100 for 60c.

GERTRUDE (M.) This smoky novelty has caused a sensation wherever shown, the blue slate blushed over orange red base creates a wonderful color effect. L-12 for 80c, M-12 for 60c, S-12 for 40c, B-100 for 50c.

G. J. MACKAY (W.) A grand ruffled variety of large size. Tomato red with deeper throat, tall with 8 blooms open. **L-12 for \$1.50.**

GLADYS (M.) Beautiful long straight spike of orange rose, edge of petals striped vermilion which have a faint bluish cast, white blotch. **L-12 for \$1.50.**

GLEN (Mair) Smoky pink large white throat, white mid ribs, many open and fine grower. **L-75c, M-50c, S-25c, B-12 for 40c.**

GLORIA MANDI (Pf. G.) This Prim Grand is being placed in this section on its color alone, being one of our deepest yellows, it will not come up to exhibition in placement but a fine early commercial that is quite prolific and fine for hybridizing. **L-12 for \$1.20, M-12 for \$1.00, S-12 for 75c, B-100 for 80c.**

GLORIOSA (M.) Brilliant scarlet with white blotch, extra lne, large flowers, straight spike and many open. **L-12 for 80c, M-12 for 60c, S-12 for 40c.**

GRAF ZEPPELIN (Pf.) Tall brilliant orange scarlet, big winner where shown. **L-12 for 50c, M-12 for 30c, S-12 for 20c, B-100 for 30c.**

GRIET (G.) Golden yellow, nice straight spike, six open. **L-12 for \$1.00.**

HILDA (M.) Outstanding exhibition variety, light lavender brighter at edge of petals and sometimes flaked deeper, 8 to 10 open. **L-12 for 80c.**

HUNTSMAN (Symons, A.) Exhibition scarlet with light throat, fair size, placement good on long spike. **L-12 for \$4.00, M-12 for \$2.50, S-12 for \$1.50, B-100 for \$3.00.**

HYACINTH (Gilrey, A.) Clear shell pink touched with undertone of mauve, lemon lip, flowers very large, substance could be improved. **L-12 for \$1.00.**

IRENE (Mair, S.) Here is one of Mair's varieties that is coming to the front as growers get acquainted with it. Color is salmon rose sometimes flecked with old rose but usually giving beautiful clear pink. Tall straight spike, 8 to 10 large rounded flowers open and is becoming strong contender for first place in many popularity contests at different shows. **L-12 for 80c, M-12 for 50c, S-12 for 30c, B-100 for 40c.**

IRIS PHILLIPS (Ph.) Very beautiful lavender slightly flecked at outer edge of petals, faint purple feather, up to 10 open, perfectly placed on tall straight exhibition spike, F. C. C. Ballarat. **L-75c, M-50c, S-30c.**

IVERNA (M.) Highly rated variety as an exhibition, opens up to 10 large perfectly placed flowers of a pale pink with flaking of rose at outer portions of petals. Consistent grower. **L-25c.**

JAN VAN WERTH (Gretz, G.) Fine commercial late mid-season lavender that is different. Medium tall spike with ten open, substance excellent and does not fleck or fade, very prolific and fine healthy grower. **L-12 for \$2.00, M-12 for \$1.50, S-12 for 60c, B-100 for \$1.00.**

JESSIE (M.) One of Mair's good ones being a rose with white blotch, blooms well placed on a medium tall spike and is a well known winner as an exhibition variety. **L-12 for 50c, M-12 for 30c, S-12 for 20c.**

JOHN HILL (Mair, S.) Another sensational Scotch variety, brick red flecked deeper at edge of petals with large cream blotch, tall straight spike with many open. **L-12 for \$1.00, M-12 for 75c, S-12 for 50c, B-100 for 50c.**

JOHN RAMSEY (Mair, S.) Deep salmon rose flecked deeper. Ideal exhibition variety and rapidly coming into big demand as such. This will show color on all 20 to 24 buds at once and often before the first of the 10 to 12 that will open at one time, good healthy grower and prolific. **L-12 for \$1.50, M-12 for \$1.00, S-12 for 75c, B-100 for 75c.**

KING ARTHUR (A. A. A.) Considered as the best lavender originated in the U. S. The petals are beautifully ruffled and massive florets are beautifully formed. We find this variety a little moody in growth, opens 4 to 5 at one time. **L-12 for \$1.20, M-12 for 60c, S-12 for 40c, B-100 for 40c.**

KYLE (M.) Dark rosy lilac flowers of good size on a tall spike that opens 10 or more, a wonderful exhibition variety but does not increase rapidly. **L-12 for \$1.50, M-12 for \$1.00.**

LADY ALICE FERGUSON (Wiltshire, N. Z.) A new bright orange scarlet with white blotch, 8 to 10 flowers open on tall spike, is ideal for exhibition. L-12 for \$1.50, M-12 for \$1.00.

LA VICTORIA (Roozan, Degroot, G.) Purest blood red self, massive flowers that open flat, immense size and fine substance, rugged grower. L-20c, M-15c.

LESCHI (Kaylor) This rich maroon red seems to be winning at the shows very consistently wherever shown. The velvety sheen and almost black blotch together with 8-10 well placed blooms open on a fine tall spike makes this variety quite outstanding. You will not go wrong in having this to fill in your dark reds. L-40c, M-35c, S-25c, B-12 for 40c.
