

**DELIVERY.** Postage is paid on all orders with the exception of potted plants and potted shrubs in the first four zones. For shipments farther East, please add 10% for postage. Any excess postage will be returned. On California orders the 3 per cent (3%) tax must be included.

TERMS are cash with order unless otherwise arranged.

**PRICES.** Orders for one dozen are 10 times the single price and six take the same rate as one dozen. For example, 12 plants at 25c will cost \$2.50 or 6 plants at the same price will cost \$1.25.

**WARRANTY.** We exercise the utmost care in shipping reliable stock and guarantee their arrival in good condition. In the event of an error, we do not hold ourselves liable for any amount greater than the original purchase price and reserve the right to replace any damaged stock. Please advise us at once of any complaint, so it can be rectified.

**CORRESPONDENCE.** We are very glad to answer any inquiries about our flowers. We find from past inquiries that there are many who would like to have more natives in their gardens, but, are not sure of what they want and how their garden conditions might meet the need of these plants. In the first place we are located where there is considerable snow and cold weather in the winter months and very hot weather in the summer. This condition is bound to make hardy plants. There are certain plants we can recommend to one wishing to start a natice garden, not alone because they are hardy and of easy culture, but, attractive and representative of the group as well. We will be very glad to give you any information we have acquired from our own experience and from hundreds of our customers.

Just a word about our nursery. We are not collectors. At the present time we are growing and raising over 400 different varieties that are referred to as Natives. They come from the Rocky Mountain and the Pacific Coast States and a few from the East. Our plan is to get sufficient plants for seed and then raise our own plants. We have many plants which we do not advertise as we may not have enough for this purpose or we are not sure of their value. Please do not confuse us with collectors.

When you visit our nursery you will see every plant we offer growing here and thousands of small bulbs, plants and shrubs under cultivation. We are located just seven miles East of Laytonville which is 150 miles north of San Francisco on the Redwood Highway. There are accommodations on the ranch for visitors who are always welcome. However, we like to know ahead of time when visitors are to be expected so some one will be at the ranch house.

### CALIFORNIA WILD FLOWER NURSERY

SEEDS

The seeds listed are the same as we plant here, but, we cannot guarantee their productiveness, as many adverse conditions may arise in their culture. Contrary to general opinion we find the raising of the native plants very simple if care is taken in the planting of the seeds. Many gardeners are under the impression that because a plant is a native that it is only necessary to broadcast the seed and it will grow. Nature is prolific with seeds, but, the percentage that live is very small as the conditions are against them. Sow the seeds as you would sow cultivated seeds. It is best to plant in the Fall especially in the West. Many seeds germinate better if they can freeze in the Winter in the ground. When we are compelled to plant in the Spring we freeze most of the seeds in the refrigerator for two days before planting. This is most effective for all the lily seeds but the Maritimum. We have many lily bulbs that bloom the third year. Quite often all seeds do not come up the first year, but, will the second. As we sow all the perennials in boxes this condition is taken care of as we use the sameboxes the next year. For lily seeds we use a mixture of sand, peat moss and fine dirt. For very fine seeds like Cypripediums and succulents we use mostly sand and peat moss. 90% of our seeds we collect here on the ranch.





#### WESTERN BULBS

If bulbs are planted correctly further care is not needed. After blooming just leave them alone to dry out and Nature provides that they will increase themselves many times in a few years. All of the following varieties will do well in the West and many are hardy in the East and North although certain planting conditions must be considered.

BRODIAEA CALOCHORTUS and Fritillaria must be shipped before January First.

#### BRODIAEAS

Brodiaeas are hardy any place in the U. S. They grow here in many different soils. Plant about three inches deep. Although, some varieties grow naturally in full sun it is a good idea to give them locations where they will have some protection from the hot afternoon sun. They make fine cut flowers.

#### **CALOCHORTUS**

Nature was very prolific and versatile with this family. The variety and arrangement of the colors cannot be surpassed. They are exquisite as cut flowers also. The Globe Tulips are a woodland flower and bloom about the same time as the Star Tulips in March and April. Plant in the Fall 2 to 3 inches deep, in perfectly drained soil. The Star Tulips are also woodland plants excepting the C. Lilacinus which grows in meadows which are wet in Winter and Spring, but, dry up in the Summer and Fall. The Mariposa variety which blooms in June grows in full sun. If possible leave in ground after blooming, otherwise dig up and store.



#### LADY SLIPPERS (Cyprideium)

- The three Eastern Lady Slippers listed below are woodland plants. We have the best results here by planting in a mixture of one third each of sifted soil, leaf mold, and sand. Plant in a protected place which can be kept moist through the blooming period.

#### LILY-OF-THE-VALLEY

Convallaria Majalis. Fragrant white flowers. Prefers partial shade and a soil rich in leaf mold and well rotted manure. Single pips 15c; 6 for 75c. Clumps of several pips 25c



#### TRILLIUM

- Among the earliest of our Spring Flowers there are no plants more charming for shady spots, around pools or in a home garden. They are not particular as to soil and a good garden soil is very suitable.
  - T. Grandiflorum. Snow Trillium. Very large white flowers which turn to rose. This is the finest and largest variety.
  - \*T. Sessile. A large leafed strong plant with white flowers. Fragrant.
  - \*T. Ovatum. Wake Robin. As these plants are native in the Redwoods they require more protection and a soil richer in leaf mold. They open white and gradually turn pink.

#### TRUE LILIES

- The Lilies of the Pacific Coast are known over the world. Lily culture is not difficult if good stock is obtained and some consideration given to planting correctly. All Lilies should have sheltered positions in perfectly drained soil. The Humboldtii group, Bolanderii, Columbianium, Rubescens, Kelloggi and the Washingtonianiums grow under regular woodland conditions. The others are of the bog type. Culture of first group. All lilies enjoy leaf mold, sand and rocks. Plant 5 to 6 inches deep. If possible set the bulb on sand as this will assist drainage. Do not use manure or fertilizers and keep moist through blooming period.

- L. HUMBOLDTII. A very striking Lily. Well established bulb often grows to 10 feet. Rather hard to establish as they do not do much the first year. Large orange red flowers on very stout stems. Large bulbs 45c, med. bulbs 35c; \$4.50 and \$3.75 per doz.



#### **REDWOOD LILY**

\*L. RUBESCENS. Redwood Lily or Chemise Lily. The most fragrant of our Western lilies. It is also very hardy. The flowers open white with purple spots and turns to purple. This is by far the best known of the Western lilies and it deserves to be as they are very distinctive. Large bulbs 40c, medium bulbs 30c, \$4.00 and \$3.50 per doz.

- \*L. KELLOGGII. A most attractive Lily and a very rare one. The flowers are fragrant and pale pink with a light yellow streak through the center of each petal. Large vulbs 85c, Medium bulbs 65c, \$8.50 and \$7.00 per doz.
- \*L. WASHINGTONIANIUM var Purpurem. Mount Hood Lily. Pure white funnel shaped flowers with purple dots, very fragrant and turns to pink purple as they fade. Large bulbs 50c. Medium 40c. \$5.00 and \$4.00 per doz.
- The following lilies belong to the bog type. They grow naturally along the borders of pools, streams, in damp meadows or along the edges of bogs. Naturally they require a soil rich in humus, sand and leaf mold. However, good drainage is just as essential as with the other Lilies. If planted in the garden

make soil as much like the above as possible, give them protection from too hot a sun and winds by planting near shrubbery and keep moist during the blooming period.

- \*L. PARDALINIUM. Hardy lily, very easy to cultivate and also a very beautiful plant sending up stalks often 8 feet high bearing as many as 50 flowers with deep orange petals and crimson tips. Any good garden soil will do. Plant 4 inches deep and keep moist during the blooming period. Lrg. bulbs 25c ea., \$2.50 per doz.
- \*L. PARRYII. The Yellow Lily. Differing greatly in color from our other Lilies this beautiful and fragrant flower is one of our rarest and, also, is considered the finest Yellow Lily in the world. We have had these Lilies in our gardens several years and they have proven very satisfactory. Plant 5 inches deep in sandy loam and keep moist through blooming period. Very large bulbs 75c ea., medium bulbs 60c and flowering bulbs 45c, \$7.50, \$6.00 and \$5.00 per doz.

#### SUGGESTIONS ABOUT LILIES

- It is pleasing to notice the increasing demand for our Native Lilies. For many years the imported varieties were the main lilies in the Nurseryman's catalogue so many gardeners were not acquainted with our Western varieties. The Lilies which you get from us are dug from the gardens here and shipped direct to you. All the varieties we list have done well for us and they will for you if you follow the simple instructions. In regard to size of plants there is a great deal of difference, from 18 inches to 10 feet. Regarding colors, however, there are four classes. The largest class by far has the orange and red Lilies which are generally referred to by the people where these Lilies grow as Tiger Lilies. Then there is a class of Lilies which open up white, one Pink Lily and One Yellow. The four varieties which are the easiest to grow are the L. Humboldtii Magnificum, L. Rubescens, L. Parryii and L. Kelloggii. These varieties also represent the different colors.
- Do not be afraid to use good sized rocks in the Lily Garden. All of the first group like to lie along side of or nestle among rocks. It is surprising how much the moisture in the stones keep the bulbs from drying out too much.
