SPECIAL BARGAIN SUPPLEMENT

The increasing flow of inquiries about flowering and evergreen shrubs, has forced me to make arrangements with a local wholesale grower, to furnish me with stock to meet these demands. This is not a preferential arrangement, and the supply is subject to the demands from other dealers.

Both the grower and myself have cut profits to the vanishing point, to move his large stock. Many of these are new, or rare, and in some instances will not be found listed by retailers elsewhere. In many instances the price asked here, is less than half that asked by other dealers, for the same size and quality.

This stock has all been transplanted two or three times, and is top grade in every respect.

Although I am listing only a few with descriptions, I have access to more than sixty others, at prices similar to those listed here. I suggest that you include in your order, anything you want that is not listed. Allowing 35 cents to \$1. according to the size you wish. If I cannot furnish any that you order, your money will be promptly refunded.

I could not grow these shrubs myself, to sell at these prices, so I advise you to get yours before the stock is exhausted.

To simplify matters, all shrubs will be 35 cents each, any 3 for \$1. any 7 for \$2. any 12 for \$3.25. Where more than 12 are ordered, each additional shrub will be 25 cents each. These prices are Postpaid.

Where larger shrubs are wanted, I can furnish Balled and Burlapped stock in most varieties, at prices ranging from 60 cents up, according to size wanted. Prices on Balled and Burlapped shrubs, are F. O. B. Lakebay, and will be shipped by Express, shipping charges collect. Orders received after May 1, take fall delivery.

AZALEA HINODEGIRI-Dwarf, very compact, evergreen azalea, Heavy glossy green foliage. When in bloom the plant is completely covered with bright red flowers, so that the foliage is hidden. One of the most showy and one of the most popular dwarf ornamental shrubs.

AZALEA MOLLIS-Very hardy. Blooms before leafing. Foliage bright green and attractive, turning to gorgeous shades of bronze and red in fall. Flowers are large and borne in profusion. It has an irresistible appeal and is a great favorite to all who know it. Its planting cannot be overdone. Often used in city parks.

CALLUNA VULGARIS, AUREA (GOLDEN HEATHER) Fine golden foliage, taking on beautiful tinges of red during fall and winter.

Lavender flowers. A dainty, attractive plant which appeals to all who see it. New and hardy.

CALLUNA VULGARIS, PYGMAEA (MOSS HEATHER) Dwarf evergreen heather, attaining a height of eight inches. Foliage dark green, dainty. Flowers pink. This is a gem for the rockery.

CASSIOPE MERTENSIANA-This is one of the alpine gems from the Cascade Mts. Seldom seen in nurseries. Branches slender, numerous, densely clothed with scale-like foliage. Flowers numerous, nodding and white. Good for rockeries. Extremely hardy and rare. Slow grower. Enjoys shade. Height about 12 inches.

CYTISUS PRAECOX (WARMINISTER BROOM) Sometimes called Moonlight Broom. Branches are heavy and numerous, long and pendulous.

Hardy, graceful, evergreen shrub. Flowers rich cream in color, completely covering the branches. A most pleasing shrub. Rare.

CYTISUS PURPUREUS (PURPLE BROOM) A dwarf, procumbent shrub growing to 18 inches, and bearing attractive purple flowers. New.

CRYPTOMERIA JAPONICA-A rapid growing shrub with dense plume-like foliage turning bronze in winter. A very desirable addition to large plantings, or where quick results are wanted.

DABOECIA POLIFOLIA, ROSEA (PINK IRISH BELL HEATHER) A splendid dwarf evergreen; Foliage fine, dark green above, silvery beneath. The flowers are large, and resemble little bells nodding from the tips of slender, erect stems. It is one of the few dwarf shrubs which starts blooming in early spring and continues in bloom until cold weather. Very desirable for borders, rockeries and masses. Hardy and new. White flowered form also available.

DAPHNE CNEORUM (ROSE DAPHNE) Evergreen foliage and crowded heads of fragrant bright-pink flowers, during May and June, and again in fall. Has always been very expensive, but this year i have some very fine plants that i can include in this bargain offer.

PYRACANTHA COCCINEA, LALANDI (LALAND FIRETHORN) A tall evergreen shrub of surpassing beauty. In spring it is a shower of white bloom and in the fall it is laden with such enormous masses of brilliant orange-red berries that the foliage is almost concealed. One of the most glorious evergreens known.

RHODODENDRON PONTICUM-Hardy, vigorous grower. Large, glossy foliage. Pink to lavender blooms. The Rhododendron is one of the most satisfactory of all shrubs. Besides its healthy, glossy foliage at all times, it is unsurpassed in beauty when in bloom. Fits into practically all plantings.

TEUCRIUM CHAMAEDRYS-A beautiful evergreen rock plant somewhat resembling Heather. It reaches a height of about 1 ft., with a spread of about 3 ft, and is a bouquet of pink blossoms all summer. Extremely hardy, holding its bright, glossy green color in coldest weather. Has fragrant foliage, and will add beauty wherever low blossoming plants are desired. Almost without a peer as a rockery or border plant. A marvelous ground cover. Drought resistant, and takes the place of Heather in hot, dry sections. Must be sheared back after blooming, for best results.

SOMTHING DIFFERENT IN GLADIOLUS

I have been fortunate in securing a limited quantity of the Florist Pedigreed Blend Gladiolus bulbs, which is a mixture of the newer Florist sorts. If these were bought as named sorts, the price would be several times the price asked here. Most of these are jumbo bulbs and average nine bulbs to the pound.
