

The blooms also have the added attraction of fragrance and bloom June-July.


Auratum Lilies

The individual blooms of AURATUM offen measure up to 10 or 12 inches across. Pure white sprinkled with reddish-brown speckles and a broad gold band runnig down the centre of each petal. Deeply and deliciously fragrant. Blooms in August. We call this truly superb Lily "THE WONDER OF WONDERS FROM THE ORIENT." Here is probably the showiest thing to be found in the Lily family. These bulbs should be planted 12 inches deep.

RUBRUM LILY



Tobacco Mulch Your Flower Beds

GROUND TOBACCO STEMS make a very valuable Mulch for your flower beds and borders during spring, summer and fall and we suggest that you try it this season. In addition to having a certain amount of fertilizer value it is also an insecticide and, in addition, its use materially lightens the back breaking labor of hoeing and cultivating. This valuable and useful by-product is simply the coarse stems of the cigar leaf put through a grinding process and it reaches you with the nicotine content intact. For your information we name here eight excellent reasons for your use of this material on your flower beds and borders this spring.

1. It saves you much hard labor for, after the ground has been hoed or dug in the spring, no further cultivation is necessary for the balance of the season If you apply a mulch or coat of tobacco stems 1/2 inch

deep.

2. Keeps down weeds and, if one does succeed in straggling through here and there, it is but the work of a moment to quickly remove it by hand.

3. Conserves moisture by retarding evaporation from the soil and consequently,

4. Keeps the soil cool and moist in even the heated days of midsummer.

- 5. Keeps down Insect pests and drives out ants, moles, worms, snails, etc.
- 6. Provides humus or organic matter in the soil when dug into the ground the succeeding season before applying a new mulch.
 - 7. For its value as a fertilizer.
- Gives a neat, orderly appearance to the beds and borders by hiding the stark, bare earth and providing a neat warm appearing blanket of tobacco-

Pulverized Poultry Manure

Apply the material broadcast at garden digging time and watch results. At monthly intervals during the summer you may give additional applications of liquid manure with excellent results. To make the manure liquid you simply place a half bushel or so of the dry manure in a tight barrel and fill it up with water. Stir the mixture occasionally and apply around the plants but not on the foliage with an ordinary sprinkling pot. Giant American Hybrid AMARYLLIS



Giant Amaryllis

The truly gorgeous colorings and the giant size of the magnificent blooms and the free blooming habit of this Giant Amaryllis make it very much sought after and highly admired. Amaryllis are exceedingly easy to grow by following a few simple directions. The colors range from purest white, through various shades of pink, to the deepest scarlet; many of their with beautiful markings and motthed throats.

Plant each bulb in a 5 or 6 inch pot with the top well out of the soil; set the pots away in the cellar or in a dark closet and water sparingly until top growth has begun; then bring out to light and warmth to bloom. After flow-ering sink the pots to the brim in a sunny garden spot and leave them there until the middle of October; then take up the pots and lay them on their sides in a shady place to dry off and ripen, after which they are stored again in the cellar until about the middle of February or until new growth begins. Do not remove the old soil; flower them again just as they are. Application of weak manure water twice weekly at the growing stage however will be found of great value. Slightly larger pots may be substituted as the bulbs increase in size.

HYACINTHS CONDICANS

These pendulous lily-like white flowers are clustered on tall 3 to 4 ft. stems and they bloom profusely in the summer. They make an especially good showing if planted in the border or amongst evergreens or shrubbery and are quite inexpensive. Not hardy; they are taken up and treated much the same as a Gladiolus.

WHITE WATER LILIES

Native hardy white lily suited either for growing in ponds or lakes; in lily pools or in tubs or barrels sunk in the lawn. In planting the roots just lay them flat in the mud at the bottom and weight down one end with a small flat stone.




Hyacinth Condicans

This unusual and lovely flower is also called Peruvian Daffodil but it really is a member of the Amaryllis family and suitable either for growing in pots or in the garden. Treat it the same as you would in Amaryllis or Calla Lily and it will bloom very quickly after it is planted. The blooms are very odd in form; snowy-white and exceedingly fragrant. The tall spikes each bear several large flowers. A delightful flower, having a peculiar grandeur and it will delight you surely. We suggest trying a few Ismenes in pots and others in the garden.


