## HALLAWELL'S HYACINTHS

Hyacinths are very fragrant and come in a great variety of colors. They make a magnificent display when grown outside in a bed. They are also very satisfactory when grown in pots. We are listing the single type only, as they are far superior to the double, and more certain to bloom. For outdoor culture, set the bulbs so that the tops will be 3 or 4 inches below the surface and 6 to 10 inches apart. For pot culture use a 4 -inch pot for a bulb or a large pot for two or three bulbs, and leave the tops of the bulbs just above the surface. After potting give a good watering and set away in a cool dark place and cover with coal ashes or sand until thoroughly rooted, which takes from 8 to 10 weeks. During this time do not allow them to become dry. They may then be set in a cool light place until the flower spikes have developed, when they may be placed wherever they are wanted.

## LILIES

Lilies are benefited by shade about the roots and stems, but do not do well with shade about their heads, so should be planted among fairly dwarf shrubs, ferns or herbaceous plants to give the mature stem the protection it craves from the too great heat of the sun and to keep the ground around the bulb more or less cool.

The soil for liles should be fibrous and rooty, to which should be added some leaf mold or peat, and should be deeply dug. Sharp sand placed around the bulb insures good drainage. Charcoal and sulphur sprinkled about in planting tend to ward off attacks of worms and blue mold.

Tulips will grow in any good garden soil, to which may be added a little bone meal. If soil is heavy, place a handful of sand at the base of each bulb. Well rotted cow manure may be used if dug in ten days or more previous to planting.
Plant Tulips so that in light soils the tops of the bulbs are 6 inches below the surface, and in heavier soils, 5 inches. Plant bulbs about 5 or 6 inches, or more, apart. After planting, give a thorough watering; continue watering every week if no rain has fallen in the meantime.

## CULTURE

Dig a wide trench to a depth of 12 inches and after breaking up the bottom of trench fill in with several inches of peat or leaf mold to which add a liberal amount of bone meal; fill in the balance of the trench with good top soil. Tamp the soil down firmly and water thoroughly to the base. Let stand a few days until moderately moist. Never put the seed in too wet soil. Pulverize the surface well by raking, make rows and plant seed about one inch deep, and two inches apart. Do not water until all the seed is up, at least half an inch out of the soil.
