



TERMS AND DISCOUNTS

TERMS: 2 per cent discount for payment within 10 days from date of invoice. Accounts due 30 days from date of invoice. These terms are offered to those who establish credit, otherwise cash or satisfactory references are required.

C.O.D. Shipments: In order to insure acceptance, orders for C.O.D. shipment should be accompanied by one-third of the amount of the order.

We reserve the right to reject orders which call for unusual items only. We expect that a reasonable quantity of the commoner items will be included in your order. This compensates in part for the high cost of producing varieties that others do not grow because they are too difficult or unprofitable.

EXTRA CHARGE FOR BALLING

We recommend that all varieties marked with an asterisk (*) be lifted with a ball of earth and burlapped. Experience has shown that the loss in these plants, which is otherwise high, is reduced to a minimum if handled in this way.

IMPORTANT

We have made careful studies of actual balling costs of different types of plants under varying soil and weather conditions. The following schedule is the result of several years' cost records plus a moderate profit margin.

Notes in Explanation of Catalogue

The figures following each variety indicate in feet the approximate height of that plant in maturity. Ample allowance has been made for the many physical factors that tend to modify the growth of plants in cultivation.

The botanical and common names are taken from "Standardized Plant Names," which is the accepted authority on plant nomenclature in the horticultural industry.


Our standard of grading all plants is based on a schedule which has been adopted by the American Association of Nurserymen.
