Fritillaria

Does best in a sheltered, shady location in light, loose, well-drained soil; it can be fairly damp but must not be wet. Plant bulbs 2 to 3 in. deep and 4 to 5 in. apart. In cold sections, give winter protection of leaves, straw or litter after soil has become frozen.

Hen Flower or Checkered Lily) (See colored illustration on second cover.) Pendent, bell-shaped blooms in various colors, chiefly bronze and purple tones, and white, all curiously checkered, striped or splashed with contrasting colors, including green. Most effective when planted in groups. Flower in April. 6 in. high. 12 for 50¢; 100 for \$3.25; 200 for \$6.25.

Often referred to as Fairy Lanterns; the shape of the flowers and the way they hang on the stem suggest the name. In cold sections, provide winter protection. Bloom in May and June.







BULBOUS IRIS

A glorious display of blue, white, bronze, and yellow flowers in June if you plant the bulbs of these beautiful Iris early in the fall. Flowers are suggestive of Orchids. Bulbs, for best results, should be planted early (September or October) in well-drained, sandy loam, 3 to 4 in. deep and 6 in. apart. In cold climates, mulch ground well after it is frozen. It is their nature to root early and often make top growth in December.

Dutch Iris Flowers are larger, broader; and the falls usually wider apart than the Spanish type; they come into bloom one to two weeks earlier. Beautiful in the garden; lovely for cutting. Valuable for greenhouse forcing.



Crocus will grow in many places—in the lawn, flower borders, in rock gardens, edge of shrubs, on the slopes of terraces, in sun or shade, and even under trees. The best position is where they will receive the sun for only part of the day. For showy effect plant bulbs 3 to 4 in. apart, 2 in. deep. The soil should be rather dry; they will not flourish in heavy, wet soil. Rich soil is not necessary, but will prove beneficial. When planted in the lawn, select a place where the grass need not be cut until the foliage of the Crocus has matured. This is essential if flowers are wanted in future years. To avoid formal arrangements, scatter the bulbs on the lawn and plant them where they fall. In borders, bulbs should be planted about 3 inches apart, and for mass effect in double rows 6 inches apart. Such ribbon plantings are very pretty.

Indoors: Crocus are very ornamental when flowered in pots, pans, or bowls. Use light sandy soil to which bone meal has been added. Plant 8 to 10 bulbs 1 inch deep, 2 inches apart, in a 6-inch container; water well and set in a cool cellar for about 6 weeks so that bulbs will become well rooted. When top growth has begun, bring them to the light. Keep in a cool location.

Cottage or May Flowering Tulips

Cottage or May Flowering Tulips are, perhaps, the most permanent of all Tulips, blooming in early May after the Early Singles have passed, hence the name, "May Flowering." The term "Cottage" is of recent origin, and so called because so many were planted around the country homes and cottages of England. As a class, they are rich in the more





Narcissus or Daffodils

In a general way, Daffodil and Narcissus mean the same thing; Daffodil is the common name and Narcissus, the botanical name. Common usage among garden makers in this country has applied the term Daffodil to the giant trumpet varieties, while the smaller or medium trumpet, as well as the Cluster-flowered and Poet's types are referred to as Narcissus. Botanically these smaller or medium trumpet Daffodils are the Barrii, Incomparabilis, Leedsii, Poeticus, Poetaz, Polyanthus and Miniature types.

Some gardeners apply the name Jonquil to the giant trumpet Daffodils, but this is misleading, as Jonquils are small flowered, sweet scented, have foliage of about the same thickness as width (rush-leaved). Other Narcissus have flat or grass-like leaves.

We are listing the different classes separately, describing the distinguishing characters of each, and in so doing hope it will be of some help to you in selecting the varieties you want in your garden.

As Narcissus bloom early, last a long time, and may be had in so many lovely varied forms, they have few equals as garden flowers. They are most desirable for any garden purpose—in masses in beds or borders, in groups of 12 or more here and there in the hardy perennial border, or in the foreground of shrubbery. For naturalizing in large quantities, no other flower is more suitable. Narcissus are also ideal, easily grown subjects for winter blooming in the house.



How to Grow Daffodils

Outdoors: For best results plant bulbs as early in the fall as possible, 4 to 8 in. deep and 6 to 10 in. apart; the exact distances depend on the size of the bulb and the nature of the soil. In very cold locations, after the ground is frozen hard, cover with leaves, straw or coarse litter to a depth of 4 to 6 in.

Indoors: Put several bulbs, about 1 in. apart (same variety), in a pot, barely cover the bulbs with soil, water thoroughly, and put in a cold-frame or heel-in in the garden for 8 to 10 weeks to force root development before bringing indoors for winter blooming.

To have a continuous display, make successive plantings two or three weeks apart. Hardy Garden Lilies

Fall is the best time to plant Hardy Lily Bulbs. Candidums are ready in September, others in late November or early December. If you live in a locality where the soil freezes up early, prepare your bed, cover with manure, leaves or straw to prevent freezing until bulbs arrive, and then plant promptly. After planting the bulbs, do not put back the manure, etc., until the ground has frozen.
