A DESCRIPTIVE PRICE LIST OF: DECIDUOUS FRUIT TREES: CITRUS TREES: GRAPE VINES: STRAWBERRIES: AND DECIDUOUS ORNAMENTALS.

NOTE: Tho fruit treos on this list ore recomonded for homo planting in tho coastal plains and adjacont aroas of Southorn california.

## ALMONDS - $60 \not \subset$ each, 10 or more $50 \not \subset$ each.

NE PLUS ULTRA - Popular comercial variety, heavy producer of largo, elongatod, soft shelled nuts, the tree is vigorous.
I.X.L. - Boautiful largo shapoly nut, sholl is soft and kornol swoot, of good quality. Trco is a strong growor.

APPLES - $65 \notin$ oach, 10 or more 60 \& each.
RED ASTRACHAN- Popular carly variety. Boaring in July; hoavy cropper, especially adnptod to warm interior valloys. Rod fruit of fair size. Dolicious for eating frosh oi cooling.

WHITE WINTER PERMAIN - Tree vigorous and a good boarer. Splondid homo orchard varioty. Large oblong fruit; pale yellov skin with blush on sunny side. Tender, juicy, fine grainod. Bears Octobor to Novombor.

WINTER BANNANA - October to November. Highly prizod for its shapoly, boautiful fruit. Fruit is largo pale yollow with u decided red blush; crisp tender flesh. Should be plantod with another variety for pollinization. A quick beurer, adapted to coastal climate.

CRABAPPLE - 65\& each, 10 or more $60 \not \subset$ each.
TRANSCENDEITT - Septomber. Fruit is large, golden yellow with red cheek. Flesh sub-acid, crisp and tonder.
$\therefore$ PRICOT - 60\& each, 10 or more $50 \notin$ each.
ROYAL - Juno. Similar to Blenheim, but ripens bofore Blonhoim. Used extensively for canning and drying. Succoeds in noarly all Apricot districts and has a good reputation as an all purpose variety.

NEWCASTLE - May to oarly June. One of the oarliest of all Apricots; it ripens 25 deys ahead of Royal. Mediun sized fruit of good color and fair quality.

BLENHEIM - California's loading Apricot. Fruit is lerge, of jood form, attractive in color and of excollent quality. It is one of the heaviest boarers and most consistent.


CHERRIES - $65 \not \subset$ eaoh, 10 or more $60 \not \subset$ each.
ENGLISH MORELLO - June. The standard late, red, sour, juice cherry It is one of the best for canning and culinary uses. Fruit is mediun large, dark red, approaching black when ripe.

FIGS - $65 \not \subset$ each, 10 or more $60 \&$ each.
White adriatic - August. Reddish pulp, heavy bearer.
DURO BLACK - Large black fruit. Produces two distinct orops.
BLACK MISSION - Best all purpose fig. Produces two distict crops.
KADOTA - Aug. to Sept. Lidiun size, light green. Bears when younc. NECTARINES - 60 \& each, 10 or more 50 \& each.

GOLD RINE - July. A large attractive fruit, delicious in flavor. Flesh is white with some red at the pit. A perfect freostone, Good for home canning and fresh eating. The tree is vigorous.

STANVICK - August. This has been California's leading Nectarine for many years. The fruit is very large, attractive in appearance. A freestone; the flesh is white and of good flavor.

PEARS - $60 \&$ each, 10 or more $50 \nless$ each.
SECKEL - August. A beautiful small fruit, skin is yellow with russet cheek. Flesh is exceptionally fine grained, and sweet.

WINTER NELLIS - November. Liedium to large in size, has a yellow skin overlaid with brown russet. The flesh is juicy, rich and sweot. The tree is a prolific bearer. One of the best.

PEACHES - 60\& each, 10 or nore $50 \&$ each.
BABCOCK - Early July. A nevf freestone developed to meet the requirements of the mild climate in Southern California. Resistant to dolayed foliation caused by warre winters. This is heavy bearer with nediun sized fruit, highly colored. Flesh is white and very sweet.

AUSTRALIAN SAUCER - June. Thite skinned, white fleshed, exceed, ingly sweot, juicy and delicious. It is not affected by nild winters and always natures a large crop.

EARLY IMPERIAL - Late june to July. An early yellow freestone the fruit is of medium size, with an attractive blush overlaying a yellow skin. Flesh is yellow sweet and juicy.

LUKEN'S HONEY - August. One of the best. Like the Saucer, ovon in tho warmer sections it always cones through with a heavy orop. Bears small greenish white, white fleshed fruit.

PLUMS - $60 \notin$ each, 10 or more $50 \not \subset$ each.
BRAUTY - June. Fruit is medium to largo, heart shaped; color is a beautiful crimson. Flesh is firn and of good flavor.

SANTA ROSA - Late June. It is large in size, has firn flesh, and good eating qualities. The flesh is reddish in color, juicy and has a pleasing tart flavor. The tree is an upright frower, vigorous and very productive.

SATSUMA - August. An old variety still popular in hone orchards. It makes excellent jams. The fruit is large, nearly round, color is dark red, flesh is deep blood red and juicy.

TRAGEDY - July. Large dark blue, oval fruit of firm flesh, sweet and juicy. A popular plum in many districts.

QUINCE - $60 \not \subset$ each, 10 or more $50 \not \subset$ each.
SIYYRNA - Of large size and fine flavor. The fruit is oblong, with an attractive lemon shin. The flesh is tender and is highly perfumed.

## THE SMALL FRUITS

PIERCE - CALIFORNIA CONCORD - A very large blue-black grape, showy and aromatic. When fully ripe, the flesh is juicy, sweet and slightly musky.

MUSCAT - California's lending all purpose grape. The chiof source of seeded raisins, and used for wine making. A large, pale amber colored, sweet grape. A fine table variety.

THOMPSON SEEDLESS - California's famous seedless variety. So well known it hardly needs description; a delicious table crape.
STRAWBERRIES - 1 to $50,2 \frac{1}{2} \not \subset$ each -- 50 to $1002 \not \subset$ each.
PROGRESSIVE - Bears over a long period. !'ediun sized berries of Great richness and flavor.

KLONDIKE - Does well in warm sections. Yielding over long period, medium sized berries of good flavor.

## CITRUS FRUITS

ALL CITRUS TREES LISTED ARE TWO YEARS OLD (UNLESS OTHERWISE NOTED) GRAPEFRUIT $\quad 2.00$

MARSH SEEDLESS - Ripens llay to August. The fruit is large, with a thin rind and is practically seedless; has an abundance of juice and exceptional flavor. The best for all soctions.
LEMONS

EUREKA - The leading lemon for home planting. It bears continually throughout the year and ripens most of its fruit in the sumer. The tree is practically thornless, the seeds are few, and the juico is abundant.

ORAITGES 2.00

WASHINGTON NAVEL - California's well known navel orance, the seedless variety harvested in the winter.

VALENCIA - California's summer orance, containing abundant juice. The fruit is mediun sized, with few seeds, and the tree is the largest of all citrus varieties.

ROBERTSON NAVEL - 3.00 - 1 year old stock. (Plant Patent \#̈l 126) The most remarkable characteristic of this orange is its ability to produce enormous crops. Its fruit is comparable to the Washington Navel, and ripens fully threo weoks earlier.

## TAITGERIITES 2.50

DANCY - A strong growing, heavy producing type of the Mandarin Orange. A medium to large fruit, firm, flattened in shape, exceedingly juicy. February to liay.

BEARSS - Largest and finest of the limes, seedless and attaining the size of a small lemon. The tree ripens the most of its fruit in the summer, and is slightly hardier than the llexican.

MEXICAN - This line is semi-dwarf, the fruit is light green, oval, strongly acid and richly flavored. The fruit ripens all thru the year, with the main crop in the spring.

## DECIDUOUS ORNAMEMTALS

MELIA AZADARACH UIIBRACULIFORMIS (TEXAS UMBRELLA TREE)
Fast growing deciduous shade tree to 30 feet - branches radiating from the trunk as the ribs of an unbrella.

A nediun to large tree to 70 feet high, of nuch merit, especially fine as a street tree as it may be trimod to assure almost any shape.
