

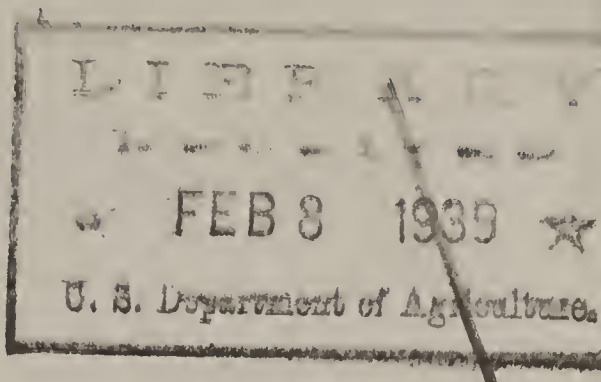

THRIP AND TREATMENT

We still hear of thrip in some localities but growers are learning how to prevent serious infections. We treat and we advise everyone to treat bulbs before planting. By using some treatment before planting, you may be sure to kill any insects on the bulbs and planting thrip free bulbs is a long step in getting rid of them. After bulbs are dug and cured, place in tight paper bags with one ounce of naphthaline flakes to each one hundred bulbs. This forms a gas that kills the thrip and eggs. Leave several weeks but be sure bulbs do not sweat or mold.

For treatment at planting, use corrosive sublimate, one ounce to five gallons of water in wooden or earthen jars. Leave several hours or over night. This treatment is also good to use against scab and disease.

For spraying plants, use two tablespoons of paris green, two pounds of brown sugar and three gallons of water. Spray on both sides with plenty of force.

Thrip does not thrive out of doors in cold climates, so if your ground freezes several inches deep the only danger is from bulbs or roots in storage. Always keep bulbs in cool places as little above freezing as possible.
