

Developed by Rutan Bros., New Market, N. J.



SPECIMEN PLANT IN 5" POT

SUNRISE was awarded "Special Merit" rating in the New York Florist Club variety test at the New Jersey Experiment Station and given an Award of Merit as a pot plant by the New Jersey Florist Association.

"All the world has been waiting for SUNRISE" is an exaggeration but the search has been world-wide for a compact yet vigorous, brilliant pink bedding Petunia.

SUNRISE answers these qualifications better than any we know. The growth is very compact and branching, attaining at maturity a height of 10-12" and a spread of 15-18". At no time does the plant become "leggy" but always presents a solid mass of deep green foliage studded with blooms.

The 2" flowers have slightly frilled edges and are brilliant rose with a flush of scarlet radiating from a small yellow throat, a combination that glows in the sunlight.

SUNRISE is excellent to use as a pot plant in early Spring and will sell readily in competition with the more difficult large flowered sorts.

Forcing Stocks

Seed of Stock for forcing has always been more or less unpredictable with regard to the percentage of doubles it will produce. Selection of the strongest plants, growing in rich soil and proper feeding has been standard practice, but even under these conditions sometimes the percentage of doubles is too low for profit. To use all possible safeguards, our grower plants a quantity of each lot of seed and any lot that does not prove up to standard, is discarded.

Careful comparative tests have proved that our strains are equal to the best available and we feel convinced that we can satisfy the most critical.
