#### BOXWOOD (Weller's Hardy Northern Type).

During the last twenty years we have developed a Boxwood, originally out of the Sempervirens type, which has proved hardy, not only in this part of the country, but also in sections where otherwise no other Boxwood would ever survive. Three years ago when the thermometer went down to 28 below, our Boxwood showed up fresher than ever in the spring, while in all other sections of the country they were winterkilled. We cleaned up on Boxwood that spring on all salable stock, but we are now coming back with a fair supply of Globe-shaped and bushes for window boxes and hedging. So far we have done nothing to advertise our plants, for the news has traveled so fast that we are still short on our orders every year. But we think that we must make it known to our customers now so that we may obtain a wider distribution for a larger future production.
