Reflection
This is the first year for this variety, but we have grown it here and were so very much impressed that we took it with us to the Michigan and New England Gladiolus Shows this past summer. It caused such general praise and comment that we feel justified in marketing it as the finest LAVENDER anywhere on the market. There are absolutely no blotches, flecks, or lines to mar its clear lavender beauty. It has been remarked that when several spikes of REFLECTION are grouped they give the effect of a billowing cloud in the sky. The florets are almost perfectly set, being straight forward and close together. Growing to the average height of five feet in eighty-five days, it opens at least six well-placed florets at once. One of the lightest of lavender shades in the field, REFLECTION has the peculiar quality of deepening in color when brought indcors.

## INFORMATION

TERMS. When ordering, each item should not be less than ten cents ( $\$ 0.10$ ) nor total order less than one dollar ( $\$ 1.00$ ).
PRICES. Five or more bulbs or bulblets may be ordered at the 10 -bulb rate; 25 at the 100 rate.
BULBLETS. A package (Pa.) of bulblets will contain between fifty and one hundred ( 50 and 100)
SIZE. Large bulbs measure from $11 / 4$ inches up; medium $3 / 4$ to $11 / 4$ inches; and small $1 / 4$ to $3 / 4$ inch.
BLOOMS. Large bulbs should always bloom; medium size bulbs nearly always bloom, though not as big as the large size; small bulbs may bloom when given special care.
LISTINGS. The various varieties are listed in this way: First under general color class heading, second under the name of the variety, basic color, type class, and name of its originator.
TYPE CLASS. Exhibition is denoted by (Ex.), which is the class to which the variety belongs according to size of bloom ( $41 / 2$ or more inches across); Decorative (Dec.), $31 / 2$ to $4 \frac{1}{2}$ inches; and Small Decorative (S. Dec.), less than $31 / 2$ inches.
PLANTING. Complete instructions for care and planting of bulbs and bulblets will be sent with each order.
