## Directions for Handling

This stock will come to you in moist moss or damp earth.

It is important that the roots do not dry out for a minute.

When you have assured yourself that the package is not dust dry soak it in water before unpacking.

Unpack and place immediately in a bucket containing three or four inches of clear water.

Dig a hole large enough to contain all the roots.

Allow for a slight depression around tree for watering.

Do not plant any deeper than it was before.

Tamp the dirt very firmly.

Some protection in winter is advisable.
