


Terms and General Conditions of Delivery

ALL SEEDS are quoted F.O.B. El Monte, California, for delivery after harvest crop 1939, 60 days net, less 2% cash 30 days. All invoices payable in U. S. dollars in or by New York or Los Angeles Exchange. All overdue accounts subject to sight draft without further notice.

Bags and containers will be charged at cost and are not returnable. There will be no charge made for bags smaller than the one pound size $(5x71/_2 \text{ inches})$.

Prices quoted in this list go into effect immediately, superseding all previous quotations. All orders of 4 ounces or over will be charged at the pound rate; all orders under 4 ounces will be charged at the ounce rate.

We reserve the right to change any or all prices in this list without notice.

For every order, we agree to plant sufficient land to produce the desired quantity of seed under normal conditions.

In case of crop shortages, orders will be filled pro rata only.

Crop failure or any cause beyond our control releases us entirely from delivery.

We give no warranty, express or implied, as to description, quality, purity, productiveness, or any other matter of any seeds we sell, and we will not be in any way responsible for the crop. If seeds are not accepted on these terms, they are to be held subject to our order.

Shipping Information

Domestic: Time is important. Many of our customers use the Air Mail exclusively to save time and get the most possible out of our rapid order filling and delivery service. We suggest that you do the same. If your order is sent to us by Air Mail from the east coast it arrives the second day, is filled the same day it arrives and if shipped by Parcel Post seed will reach you within seven days from the time the order left your office. Correspondingly less time is needed when shorter distances are covered. For faster delivery, seeds shipped by Air Mail or Air Express will reach you within four days from the time your order is sent to us. For the greatest possible saving in time, send your order by wire to be shipped by air; seeds will arrive within two to three days from the time ordered.

Contrary to the general impression, Air Express is not expensive. Rates are calculated on the basis of half pounds, and are very close to the ordinary Parcel Post rates.

Air Mail, which is more expensive, is calculated on an ounce basis and goes as first class mail. Air transportation is no longer in the experimental stage; it is an established fact—safe, sure and economical.

Regarding rail shipments, both Parcel Post and Express will take 4 to 5 days to reach the east coast. When the shipment is over 10 pounds in weight it is cheaper to ship by express, but when it is less than 10 pounds, Parcel Post is cheaper. Parcel Post packages marked "Special Delivery" are given first class mail service and will go through practically as fast as first class matter.

Shipments of 75 pounds or over can be sent most economically by Freight. Package cars leave Los Angeles twice a week, arriving in Chicago the 7th morning and in New York the 10th morning. Contract orders and others placed considerably in advance of the time needed should be sent by Freight.

Foreign: We urge our foreign customers to use the Air Mails when sending rush orders. With the new Air Mail service across the Atlantic, there is a great saving in time, over and on both sides of the ocean. Air Mail letters are given preference over regular mail in all handlings.

When sending orders by cable, we suggest the use of our number code to cut down on words and expense. Five numbers in a unit may be sent for the cost of one word, a rate which reduces costs considerably.

Novelties: The amateur gardener is novelty conscious, and it is easy to sell a new variety. Novelties are your logical sales leaders, and it is decidedly to your own advantage to make good use of them in your newspaper publicity, your advertising, and your counter features in the store. Transparencies: Our new colored transparencies are your busiest silent salesmen. They are accurately hand colored on translite film, printed from our regular photographic negatives. Placed in your store window, on the counter, along the walls with the seed racks, or near the cash register, they attract attention at once, and show your customer the actual flower of the seed you have for sale. Write us for full details regarding transparencies and the cabinets in which to display them.

Electros: Included in this price list are many new black and white electros in standard sizes and new four-color nickeltypes, as well as a great many new subjects in the smaller $1''x1'_2$ " electros. We expect to issue an Electro Catalog this summer which will include all of our new electros and nickeltypes.

All electros we send out are unmounted unless the order specifies that they be mounted. There is an additional charge of 20% for this service. Since a majority of our customers prefer unmounted electros we have followed this policy, but will be very glad to have them mounted for any who so request.

Photographs: Through our Photographic Service we are able to furnish you with a complete line of first class photographs of novelty and standard flower varieties suitable for publicity and catalog purposes. Photographs will be submitted for approval upon request.

Bulletins: The most ambitious effort of our Service Department is the publication of a series of bulletins on various flower subjects. Bulletin No. 1, The Zinnia and Its Uses, Bulletin No. 2, Asters of Today, and Bulletin No. 3, Petunias, Past and Present, have been distributed; if you have not received copies, write us and they will be forwarded promptly.





Horticultural Colour Chart: In certain sections of this catalog, we have added to the regular description of a variety some numbers and words in italics. These refer to color blocks in the Horticultural Colour Chart which many of our customers have secured either from us or from the Royal Horticultural Society direct. To visualize the exact color of the flower thus described, refer to your copy of the Colour Chart, turn to the page mentioned, mask the color block with the black mat provided and you will see the exact shade of the variety. For instance, Larkspur Stock Flowered Rosamond is described as 625 shaded 623. These page numbers will be found in the upper right hand corner of each sheet in bold face type. 625 is the predominating color of the bloom with a shading of color 623. Larkspur Stock Flowered Rose Queen, similar to Rosamond, is described as 623/1 and 623. These two color tones will be found on page 623, block 623/1 being a slightly lighter tone of the full color 623, both of which very similar colorings are found in this variety. We have been able to compile fairly complete color recordings on the Larkspur, Stock and Sweet Pea groups this year. By next year we expect to have practically all of our flowers described in terms of the color blocks of the Horticultural Colour Chart. We believe that by this method you will be able to visualize the colors of the several varieties much more vividly than any word description can do.

All-America Awards: In order to make the All-America awards more easily understood by the general public, there has been a slight change in designation of the various awards. We have made the changes in our list in accordance with this new set-up as follows: GOLD MEDAL remains the same (G. M.); the old Award of Merit is now SILVER MEDAL (S. M.); the old Special Mention is now BRONZE MEDAL (B. M.); and the old Recommended is now HONORABLE MENTION (H. M.).

We hope you are featuring as many of the All-America winners as possible.

Marigold Harmony Type French Dwarf Double Harmony Hybrids (Bodger)

OR SEVERAL years Marigold Harmony has been one of the most popular all around garden and cut flower plants. Practically 100% true, only occasionally has a break occurred in the stock of Harmony, but by utilizing the few breaks which have appeared, our plant breeding staff has succeeded in developing an excellent new strain of Marigolds embodying all the fine features of Harmony combined with a wide and varied color range. The compact plants are 12" to 14" in height, 100% All Double, and flowering commences about two and a half months after seed sowing-one of the earliest of all Marigolds. The neat, dwarf, compact habit of the Hybrids, combined with the extremely early, free flowering character of the plants make this new dwarf Harmony Hybrids one of the outstanding introductions of the season. Flowers are of medium size, rather large for the French type, averaging $1^{3}/_{4}^{\prime\prime}$ in diameter and do not have the strong Marigold odor. The color range includes the popular Harmony, our new Spotlight, a lovely golden orange shade, a distinct golden yellow and innumerable blotched and striped combinations of golden orange with maroon, and various shades of golden and lemon yellow with the contrasting dark maroon. All the flowers have the familiar crested center flanked by several rows of broad guard petals. As a showy garden subject, Harmony Hybrids take first honors and will undoubtedly supersede all other dwarf French types.

Marigold Harmony Type French Dwarf Double Spotlight (Bodger)

STRIKING, very showy companion to the popular Harmony Marigold, Spotlight takes its place on the Marigold roll of honor. Spotlight has all the fine qualities of Harmony, but with a much brighter, more colorful flower. The plants are about 12" to 14" high, very compact, extremely free blooming and unusually early, commencing to flower in early June, at least two weeks earlier than ordinary French varieties. The gay, brilliantly colored flowers are of medium size, about 13/4'' in diameter, are borne well above the foliage, and do not have the

strong Marigold odor. They have the characteristic Harmony flower formation, Scabiosa-like, with crested centers of dainty tubular petals in a bright, lively yellow shade which contrasts strikingly with the broad, velvety dark mahoganyred guard petals. We have already had very favorable reports on Marigold Spotlight from those who have it in trial this season. While the dwarf, compact habit places it primarily in the bedding class, it has been very favorably recommended for cut flower use as well.

Marigold Harmony Type French Tall Double Harmony Mixture (Bodger)

E XCEPT for the habit and height of the plant, this new Marigold Mixture is identical with the Dwarf Double Harmony Hybrids. The flowers have the characteristic Harmony crested center flanked by deep mahogany-red guard petals, while the color range includes the popular orange and maroon-red combination of Harmony, the new bright yellow and mahogany-red Spotlight, golden orange and golden yellow self colors together with blotched and striped combinations of both orange and yellow shades with mahogany-red. It differs radically from the dwarf strain in the height of the plant, growing 20 to 24 inches tall, and the plant habit is more open. Like all the Harmony Type Marigolds, it is extremely early blooming, does not have the strong Marigold odor, and comes practically 100% double. We expect this new Tall Double Harmony Mixture to take the place of all other Tall French Double Marigolds.

Marigold Harmony Type French Tall Single Ferdinand (Bodger)

S AUCY, sprightly and colorful, Ferdinand is one of the gayest of our new flowers. Unlike its companions in our new Harmony Type group, Ferdinand is single flowered with a neat round, crested center of dainty tubular florets in an arresting shade of golden yellow (5) surrounded by a single row of broad, mahogany-red guard petals. While the flowers are of only medium size, 1¹/₂ to 1³/₄ inches in diameter, they are extremely showy and attractive. The plants are tall growing, 20 to 24 inches, with an upright, semi-compact, yet full foliaged growth habit. Stems are well over a foot in length, making Ferdinand a fine new cut flower subject as well as an attractive and showy garden plant. Like all of the Harmony Type Marigolds, Ferdinand is early blooming, commencing to flower within three months after the seed is sown, and does not have the strong Marigold odor.

Marigold Gigantea Full Double Orange (Bodger)

FEW YEARS ago we introduced the extremely popular Orange Sunset Marigold, which unfortunately carried a heavy percentage of single flowered plants. We now take pleasure in presenting Marigold Gigantea Full Double Orange, a strain of this same popular, large flowered Marigold in an alldouble or full-double type. The flowers are, without doubt, the very largest of any Marigold variety, averaging 5 inches and over in diameter when grown in the field and obtaining a size up to 7 inches with special feeding for show purposes. The color is a deep, rich, lively orange which combined with the unusual size of the flowers makes this new Full Double Orange one of the showiest and most colorful of garden subjects. Although the foliage carries the characteristic Marigold odor, the flowers themselves are delicately sweet scented. Even though of extreme size, the flowers are loosely formed, very full centered with broad, heavy, wavy petals which gracefully overlap and make a flower ideal not only for garden decoration, but for cut flower use as well. The plants are strong growing, upright branching in habit, somewhat dwarfer than the older variety Orange Sunset, usually $2\frac{1}{2}$ to 3 feet tall, and producing a heavy growth of foliage with six or eight heavy branches each bearing three or four large flowers. The new Full Double Orange is also somewhat earlier blooming than Orange Sunset, commencing in late July in the warmer climates and in late August or early September in the northern sections. We present Marigold Gigantea Full Double Orange with every confidence that it will be enthusiastically accepted by the entire flower loving world.

FULL-DOUBLE or all-double counterpart of the popular Marigold Sunset Giants, we present the improved Marigold Gigantea Full Double Mixture for your approval. As in Sunset Giants, the color range includes deep orange, golden orange, deep golden yellow, light yellow, lemon yellow and the lovely new primrose shade. The robust plants produce a heavy growth of foliage with six to eight heavy branches each bearing three or four large flowers. The plants are dwarfer than in Sunset Giants, usually 2½ to 3 feet tall, with a more compact growth, and they are earlier blooming, coming into flower in late July to early August in the warmer sections and late August to early September in the colder climates. A fine forcer in the greenhouse, Full Double Mixture with its extremely large, sweet scented flowers is a winner whether for cutting or garden use.

Larkspur Giant Imperial Pink Perfection (Bodger)

ON A PAR in every respect with our former two outstanding Larkspur introductions, Carmine King and White King, Pink Perfection is a distinct addition to the color range in the popular basal branching Giant Imperial group. It has all the fine qualities of the popular Bodger or King type of Larkspurs with 2 inch florets of rounded broad petals evenly and closely spaced on the stem, giving a very heavy Hollyhock-like cutting spike 24 inches or more in length. The plants are tall, basal branching, upright in habit and very free flowering. The color is a very luscious shade of lively light pink (623/2 and light salmon pink) similar to the Stock Flowered variety La France. Early flowering, Pink Perfection comes into bloom about the same time as the Stock Flowered variety, Rosamond. Ideal as a florist color, Pink Perfection is also a magnificent addition to the home garden.

Aster Wilt Resistant Early Giant Rose Marie (Bodger)

 \mathbf{Y} OSE MARIE is a fascinating, rich, lively shade of rose which is probably the most popular color in Asters. It also belongs to the Early Giant Wilt Resistant group, fast becoming the most popular Aster type. With this happy combination of characters, Rose Marie should most certainly be one of the outstanding cut flower introductions of the season. The flowers are fullpetaled with broad, graceful petals, daintily plumed and intertwined, very large, 4 to 5 inches in diameter, and similar to the Giants of California blooms. While the flowers resemble the Giants of California, the plants however differ considerably since they are only $1\frac{1}{2}$ to 2 feet tall with branches coming low on the central spike and only 6 to 8 flowers are produced on each plant. There are practically no laterals or side branches. One of the most desirable characteristics is the early blooming habit of the Early Giant type, flowers being produced with us during the first two weeks of August, so they can safely be counted on by the first week of September in any section. Rose Marie is indeed an excellent cut flower variety and, although not as free blooming as the branching type, is also a distinct addition to the garden. Fully wilt resistant, it can safely be grown in any soil. Rose Marie is the third introduction in our new Early Giant Wilt Resistant strain, former varieties being Light Blue, a Silver Medal winner in the 1939 All-America Selections, and Peach Blossom.

IN PRESENTING our new Giant Harmony Aster, we are introducing a new cut flower type. These large flowers have full-double quilled rounded centers, which open



Although not wilt resistant, Aster Giant Harmony Mixture is well worth growing.


Stocks Double Giant Column Gardenia (Bodger)

'S LOVELY and elegant as the exotic Gardenia from which it borrows its name, this new Stock of ours is the crowning achievement of the plant breeder's efforts. With superbly formed, magnificent spikes composed of individual florets 2" to $2^{1}/_{4}$ " in diameter, this remarkable new Giant Column Stock is indeed the last word in perfection for its class. Shimmering, glistening white, the flowers are the purest snow white of any Stock variety yet introduced. Producing only one flower spike to a plant, this spike will however be of enormous size, 12" to 15" of florets and nearly 3 feet in length, and 4" or even $4^{1/2}$ " in depth, with the individual florets closely and compactly placed on the stem. The robust habit and uniformity of type combined with a high percentage of doubles places Gardenia definitely in a class by itself with no peer among the finer flowers for the high class florist trade.

Ipomea Alamo Vine or Mile-A-Minute Vine

S THE NAME, Mile-A-Minute Vine, would imply, this little Morning Glory is a very fast growing and attractive vine which thrives with outstanding success in the hot, dry, southern parts of the country and we are confident will do equally well in any situation. The foliage is fine and multi-cut, stems are rather wiry and the runners obtain a growth of as much as 20 feet or more in a season. The flowers are creamy white, about $l_{1/2}$ inches in diameter, deep wine red at the center and, unlike most members of this family, open late in the morning with the bright sun and remain open during the afternoon, rather than the reverse. Although there are not a great many flowers open at any one time, the plants remain in bloom over a period of many weeks, commencing about the first of August. They bloom until late in the fall and are not affected by the first light frosts. The main value of the plant is as a quick growing and most attractive vine for use as a covering on fences or trellises. Since the foliage is dainty and delicate in appearance, it makes a lacey tracery of green rather than a heavy deep growth. Although it has been very popular in parts of Arizona for a good many years, we believe this is the first time the so-called Alamo Vine or Mile-A-Minute Vine has been grown commercially for general distribution.

Violettas The Little Dwarfs Finest Mixed

E CONSIDER it a privilege to announce that through a special arrangement with the introducers, Dobbie & Co. Ltd., of Edinburgh, Scotland, we have been appointed exclusive agents for the Americas, Australia, New Zealand and the Asiatic countries for the outstanding Scottish flower introduction of the year, Violettas "The Little Dwarfs." This is an entirely new type of miniature Viola, one of the most delightful little plants that has ever been presented to the garden world. The flowers are small and perfect miniatures of Violas, with broad, beautifully rounded petals, making a flower of almost symmetrical roundness. They have a very delightful sweet scent and come in a wide range of colors previously unknown in this family. Among these colors are canary yellow, campanula blue, sulphur yellow splashed with hyacinth blue, purplish violet with a creamy eye, creamy yellow with deep yellow center, parma violet shot with petunia purple, creamy white, and many others, each with a distinct yellow eye. The habit of the plant is neat and compact, forming dense cushions of green, studded with flowers which are held erect on short, wiry stems. The Violettas will grow and bloom freely for nearly six months of the year in almost any type of soil and require very little attention. They are particularly suitable for use as a bedding plant, for edging, in rockeries, in miniature gardens or in window boxes. The Violettas were developed by Mr. D. B. Crane, who unfortu-

nately passed on before they were actually introduced to the public. He modestly sums up his work in the following paragraph which was taken from the Royal Horticultural Scciety Journal for March 1939:

"I have been working on these plants (Violettas) since the early nineties and had some good successes before the Great War. Unfortunately I lost some of my better sorts during the war, but by persistent effort since, by selection and otherwise, I have got together a large and most interesting collection embracing colours common to the ordinary Viola. They are now a source of unfailing interest to me, as they comprise blossoms of the most dainty and charming character and most of them are very fragrant."

Zinnia Fantasy Wildfire (Bodger)

TE HAVE been more than ordinarily pleased with the very rapidly increasing popularity of the Fantasy type of Zinnia. It is one of the most interesting of the newer Zinnia developments, and with its friendly informality is certainly maintaining its place as a reigning favorite in the Zinnia family. With the addition of separate color varieties, the usefulness of this gaily informal flower is greatly enhanced. As a very vivid companion to Star Dust, Rosalie, Orange Lady and White Light, we are this year offering Wildfire, a rich, dazzling scarlet. Wildfire adds a distinct note of color and cheerfulness to the garden and will enliven any home when used in flower arrangements. The plants are neat in habit, strong growing and very free blooming, $2\frac{1}{2}$ to 3 feet in height, coming into flower 45 to 50 days after the seed is sown. In growing this or any other Zinnia, we strongly recommend sowing the seed where the plants are to bloom if this is at all possible. Furthermore, when watering, rather than use the sprinkler, irrigate by the trench method and let the water run slowly for several hours until it has soaked down thoroughly into the ground through and beyond the roots. By this method, you will have to water the plants only once every two weeks or so if the top soil is properly cultivated after each irrigation. Excellent results will be obtained by this method.

Zinnia Early Wonder Padre (Bodger)

N ^O annual is more colorful or anywhere near as free flowering during the first hot weeks of early summer than the Early Wonder Zinnias. Successive sowings every ten days or two weeks are recommended to have fresh flowers in good condition all through the sum-



THE Pastel Tints Mixture in our new improved Crown O'Gold type is winning more and more enthusiastic boosters every day. LTHOUGH we hybridists may sometimes feel that the business of producing new flowers is just a routine day-after-day job, every once in a while we are buoyed up when we succeed in guiding a plant into unsuspected and hitherto unimagined beauty. Such has been our experience during the development of a strikingly beautiful Scabiosa which we present herewith-Scabiosa Imperial Giants Blue Moon. The flower form is as different from the existent Scabiosa varieties as Nasturtium Golden Gleam is different from the old singles or the Dahlia Flowered Zinnia differs from the old Zinnia types. ASTER WILT AND WILT RESISTANCE

The so-called wilt discase of Asters is caused by a specific parasitic fungus, which may attack the plant at any stage in its growth from the seedling to the seedproducing age. The spores of the fungus may be carried on Aster seed and on inert matter with the seed, on the implements used in preparing the soil, and in the soil itself. When once introduced into the soil, it persists indefinitely and makes the land "aster sick," that is, whenever an ordinary strain of Asters is planted into that particular soil at any time thereafter, the wilt fungus living in it will attack the plants and they will die off at some stage of their growth.

A wilt resistant strain of Asters, however, is one which, although planted on the very sickest soil available, will withstand the attacks of the fungus and develop into strong, healthy plants. Just as some people or animals withstand the attacks of certain diseases, while others become siek at the first sign of an epidemie, so the resistant strains of Asters will withstand the attack of the wilt fungus, while the non-resistant strains will succumb.

ZINNIAS: Zinnias are warm weather loving plants and should never be sown until the soil has thoroughly warmed up and all danger of any frost has passed. For best results, especially with the smaller flowered, early blooming varieties, we recommend sowing the seed where the plants are to flower. The taller growing, large flowered sorts can safely be transplanted, although they also will make a more robust growth and will produce more flowers if they can be sown where the plants are to bloom, and then when the seedlings are 3" or 4" tall, thinned to the proper distance. To induce a thrifty, heavy root system, irrigate your plants rather than sprinkling. Dig a little trench alongside the row and let the water run slowly for several hours so it will seep down deep into the ground and make the food in the soil available for the plant throughout the mass of feeding roots. Always cultivate after each irrigation to conserve moisture. By this method you will have to water Zinnias only once every two weeks or so, whereas if the ground is merely sprinkled, you will have to repeat the sprinkling every other day or so. Irrigation not only gives a stronger, healthier plant, but also saves on your water bill.

CALENDULAS: Calendulas are definitely cool weather loving plants and in the warmer climates should be sown in the autumn for early bloom in the late winter or early spring. While they like full sun, they cannot stand the burning sun of summer. In colder climates, seed should be started in the cold frame and plants set out as soon as possible for late spring and early summer bloom. In planting Calendulas, be sure and choose the proper type for the use you have in mind. There are forcing varieties for greenhouse growing and garden varieties for outdoor growing. The outdoor varieties make a sturdier, more compact growth and are very desirable for garden use, while the forcing varieties are developed especially for the cut flower trade and do best under greenhouse conditions.

GODETIAS: In their native California, the Godetia seeds on the hillsides sprout with the first winter rains and grow during the cool, wet winter months and come into flower during late spring, hence their name, Farewell-to-Spring. Given similar treatment in the garden, they will give their best bloom. Sow the seed broadcast late in the fall and allow them to remain undisturbed during the winter months. In the spring they will grow quickly as the soil warms and bloom profusely during late spring. Best results will be obtained by this method as they cannot tolerate the very strong summer sun.

GOURDS: Gourds should be sown where the plants are to remain and should not be planted until late in the spring after the soil is thoroughly warm and nights as well as days are warm. For best results sow in a warm, sandy location, somewhat on the dry side. Provide enough water for a normal growth until the flowers appear, after which no further irrigation should be necessary. Watering during the flowering period will cause dropping of flowers and buds, and consequent loss of Gourds. For perfect-shape specimens, vines should be trained up on a fence or trellis and the Gourds allowed to hang, thus assuring straight necks and preventing rotting or discoloration from the soil. Do not harvest the Gourd crop until the fruits are thoroughly matured. This will be when the stem becomes brown and hard and pressure with the fingernail cannot dent the shell of the Gourd. After picking, Gourds should be hung in an airy, dry place until thoroughly cured. The large, hard-shelled varieties are then washed and scrubbed before decorating. The small, colorful varieties are wiped clean of dust and given a light coating of varnish or shellac. If thoroughly dried before treatment, Gourds should last several months for house decoration.

IPOMEAS: In growing Ipomeas, never plant until the soil is thoroughly warm. If it is too cool, the seeds will rot instead of germinating. Even in such warm sections as Southern California, seed should not be sown until late May. To aid germination of particularly hard-seeded varieties, filing a small notch at the top of the seed will help considerably. Always select the driest, sandiest part of the garden and sow where the plants are to flower as the Ipomeas resent transplanting. Plants should be kept on the dry side in order to induce early and abundant flowering with a rather sparse growth of foliage. Heavy watering will stimulate foliage growth at the expense of flowers. A poor soil is preferable to a rich one and fertilizer should not be used as this will promote heavy foliage which will hide the flowers. Ipomeas show off to best advantage when planted against a wall, fence or trellis. LARKSPURS: Larkspurs are cool weather plants and for best results should be sown in the fall. In warm sections, such as Southern California, they are sown as early as August, broadcast where they are to bloom and if for the cut flower market, are sown thick like radishes and the entire plant pulled to go to market. For the home garden, on the other hand, plants are thinned out to the proper distance and allowed to branch normally for a more brilliant show of color. In the colder sections, seed should be sown broadcast in November in its permanent position in the garden. If very severe, a light mulch covering should be applied. Seed will, therefore, remain stratified and dormant throughout the winter months and with the spring thaws and first warmth will germinate and commence to grow. As Larkspur seed requires a chilling for best germination, this is the ideal treatment for best results.

MARIGOLDS: The African Marigolds are strong feeders requiring plenty of water. This type should therefore be planted in the richest, most favorable section of the garden. Seed may either be sown where the plants are to flower or can be started early in a seed bed and the seedlings set out to their permanent position later on. They transplant very readily. French Marigolds on the other hand are very light feeders and require a very small quantity of water. Too strong feeding and too heavy watering will throw them into foliage growth with a great scarcity of flowers. For a free-flowering, colorful plant, select the poorest soil, keep the plants on the dry side and do not fertilize. Seed may be sown where the plants are to flower or seedlings can be transplanted from the seed bed although better results will probably be obtained by sowing in place. Marigolds are fairly hardy and should be started early in the spring.

PETUNIAS: The chief pitfall the amateur runs up against in growing Petunias is in the seed sowing. Almost invariably they bury the tiny seeds so deeply that the sprouting seedlings cannot possibly fight their way to the surface. Petunia seed must be sown with the very utmost carefulness. A seed flat or a seed pan should be used, a light, loamy soil carefully prepared, properly moistened and finely screened, the box filled to within a half-inch of the top with ample drainage on the bottom and tamped down firmly, smoothly and evenly. Then the seed should be mixed with about a teaspoonful of sand and this mixture of seed and sand sprinkled carefully and thinly over the surface of the seed box. A very fine sprinkling of pure sand, not more than $\frac{1}{16}$ of an inch, may be used on top of this mixture or it may be left without any further covering. A pane of glass or a damp burlap sack or folded newspapers should then be placed over the flat and left there until the seeds begin to sprout. Immediately after the first sprout appears, this heavy shading must be removed and a single layer of gauze substituted. If the soil has been properly moistened when it is being prepared for sowing, it will not have to be watered again until the seedlings have developed their third and fourth leaves. If the soil appears to be drying out, however, water is to be applied with a very fine-spray hand bulb, or better still, the pan or flat placed in a tray of water to allow moisture to soak upwards from the bottom. Always leave the seed box in a well-ventilated place, but without any draft, to prevent damping off. When the seedlings are large enough to handle, they should be pricked off into a second flat or small pots for a few weeks before setting out in their permanent position in the garden.

SCABIOSAS: While the annual Scabiosas will bloom during the summer, they do so much better in the early spring than during the hot summer days, that every effort should be made to start the seed in the early fall in warm sections or in cold frames in early spring in the more northerly sections. In warm sections, such as Southern California, plants will winter over perfectly well and produce extremely early flowers the second year. Scabiosas enjoy full sun and will thrive in any good garden soil.



Perhaps we should apologize to you for the lateness of this publication, but we have been waiting as long as possible to get last minute reports on our crops and market conditions in order to adjust prices and come to decisions regarding novelty introductions.

Even with this long delay, we are now unable to supply seeds of one of the novelties we have featured, Violettas "The Little Dwarfs". After the catalog was printed we received word from Dobbie & Co., Ltd., the introducers, that this variety is being withheld from introduction for this season due to unsettled economic conditions.

Orops in general are not overabundant and many are weighing in even lighter than anticipated. This general undersupply, combined with shortages which are developing in other growing sections, making heavy demands on us, point toward an early sellout on practically all flower seed items. We strongly urge you to get your orders to us at once so you will be one of the foresighted seedsmen who covered well in advance of the selling season and will not be caught short at the last moment.

In view of the generally unsettled economic conditions at this time, we ask for your cooperation to assist us in planning our acreage this year by sending your contract orders for 1940 crop seed just as soon as you possibly can. This especially applies to Sweet Peas and other varieties where large quantities of seed are used. As our planting is done in November and December, any information you can give us now as to your tentative requirements will be doubly appreciated this year.

We sincerely hope that your business will be brisk and remunerative during this coming season.
