PREPARATION OF SOIL. Spade 18 inches deep and and enriched to about have the soil well pulverized rotted barnyard about one-fifth of its bulk with well-

PLANTING. Plant the roses at once, but if impossible, roots with poiace them in a shady place, cover the roots with soil, and water thoroughly. Place plants in an upright position, working the soil around roots a little at a time, treading firmly with the foot. Leave a shallow depression and fill with water as soon as planted and again after water has seeped away.
WATERING AND CULTIVATION. During the growing a liberal supply of water and should be cultivated regularly through the summer months. A thorough irrigation every week, soaking the soil to a depth of 18 inches or 2 feet, is usually sufficient. Be sure, however, that the water penetrates to the required depth. do not "sprinkle" and think you are watering.
