

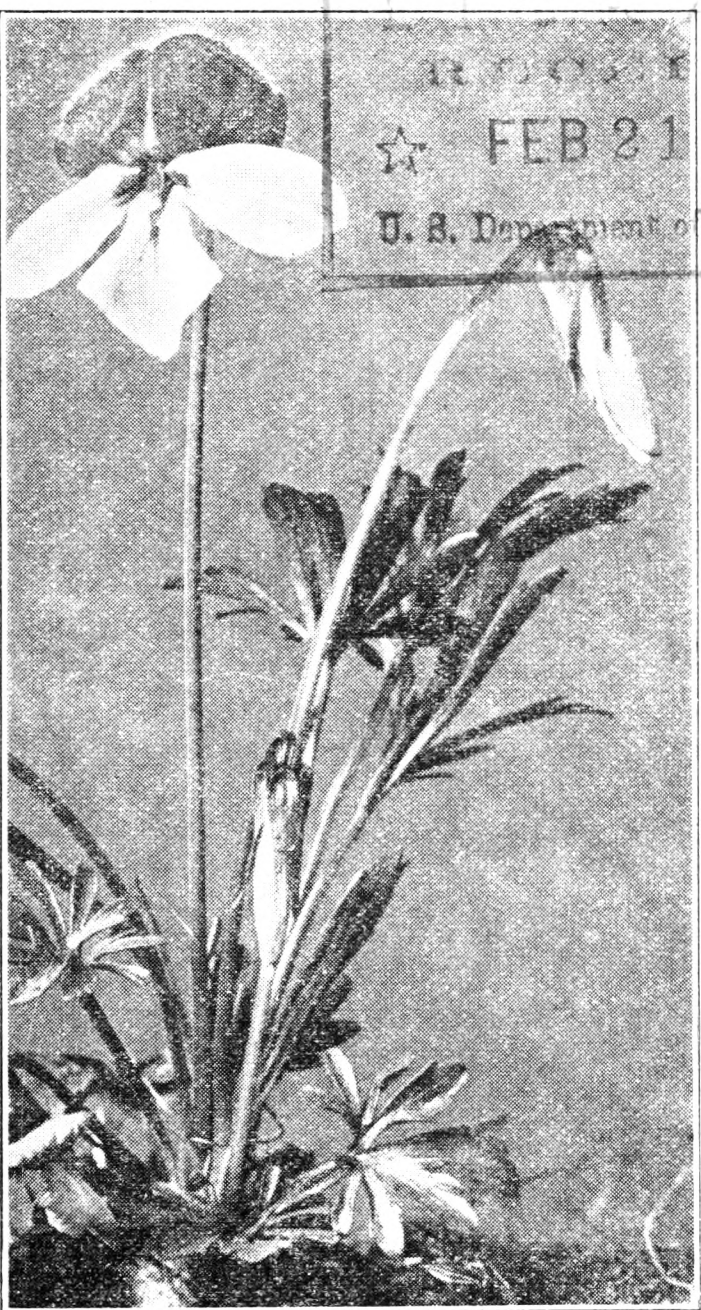

TO THE TRADE

To our many customers and friends in the Nursery trade we extend greetings. We appreciate the favors you have shown us in the past and shall endeavor to merit your confidence in the years to come.

TERMS—

To customers who are known to us, or who can furnish satisfactory references, we will ship stock on 30 days credit, unless other terms have been agreed upon. Persons unknown to us or with whom we have had no credit dealings must give trade references and allow sufficient time for investigation. To insure prompt shipment of rush orders, persons unknown to us should send money order to cover cost of stock and packing.

PACKING—

Prices quoted in this catalog **DO NOT INCLUDE PACKING AND BOXING**. This service will be charged for at actual cost of labor and material used.

C. O. D. SHIPMENTS—

Orders for stock to be shipped C. O. D. must be accompanied with 25% of the amount of the order.

PARCEL POST SHIPMENTS—

Cash with orders to be forwarded by parcel post **MUST** be accompanied with sufficient cash to cover parcel post charges, otherwise stock will be shipped by express.

SHIPPING INSTRUCTIONS—

We prefer to have customers give explicit shipping instructions as to how stock is to be forwarded—freight, express or parcel post. Where method of forwarding is not specified or is left to us, we shall use our best judgment as to safest and cheapest method.

Prices are **WHOLESALE** to **THE TRADE** only and subject **TO CHANGE** without notice.. Use printed letter-head or Inspection certificate with first order.

All orders are accepted with the understanding that same shall be void should any injury befall our stock through frost, hail, drouth, or in other cause beyond our control.

INSPECTION—

The stock of the Ferndale Nursery has been duly inspected by an authorized State Inspector, and found free from injurious disease and insect pests. Certificate of such inspection will accompany all shipments.

GUARANTEE—

We guarantee all stock to be true to name and in good condition when it leaves our grounds. We exercise every possible care to have all plants and trees true to name and will, upon proper proof, replace free of charge or refund full purchase price of any tree or plant sent out by us that may prove untrue to label.

We do not guarantee stock to live and no allowance will be made for stock which fails to live after planting.

CLAIMS—

All claims for shortage and unsatisfactory stock **MUST BE MADE WITHIN TEN DAYS** from date of delivery. Claims for shortage, damage or delay in transit should be made to transportation company when stock is called for at freight or express depot.

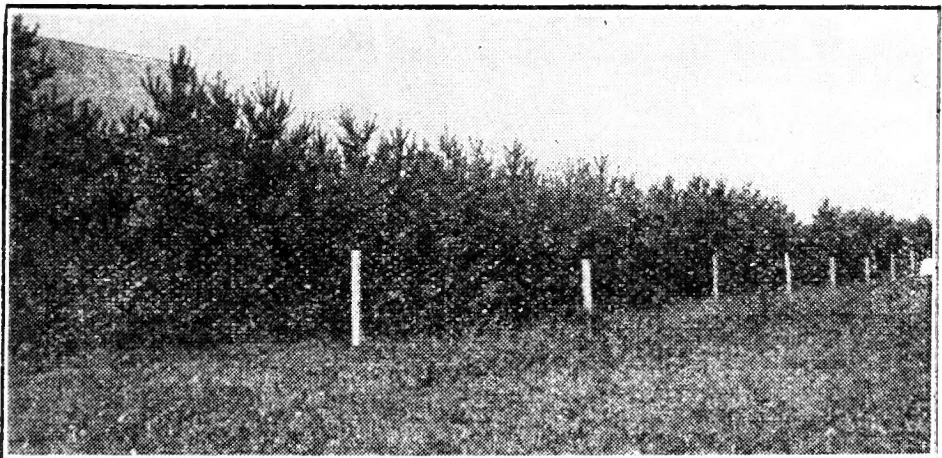

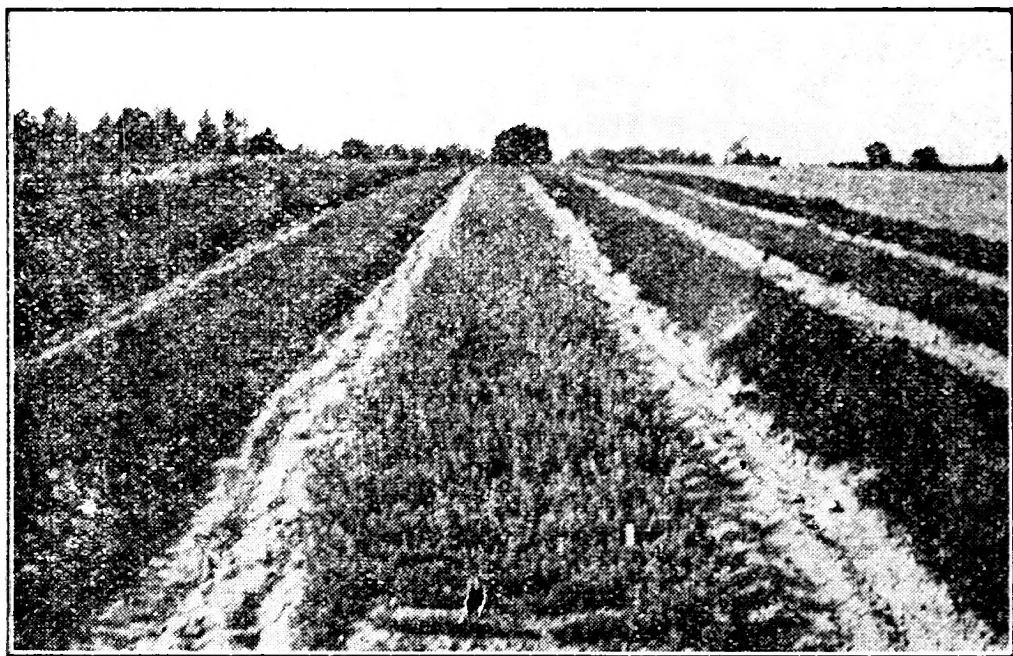
We have established a reputation for quick service and aim to maintain the reputation.

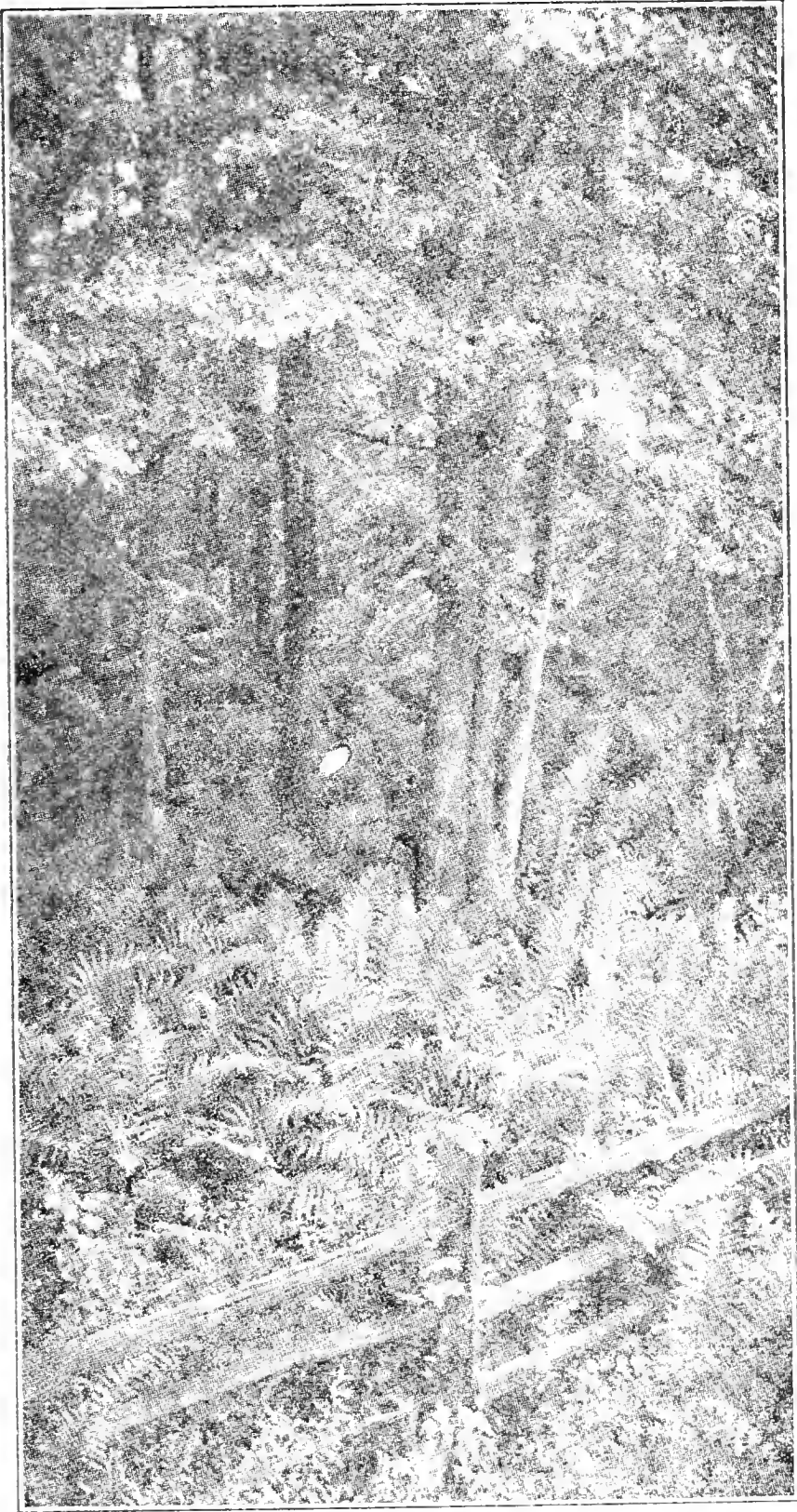

HARDY FERNS

Hardy ferns still maintain their popularity for general planting. For shade or sun—for bog or dry hillside. For woodland, fernbed, rock garden, border or foundation planting there are suitable hardy ferns to be obtained.

Our list include 25 varieties which experience has proven to be well adapted and easily grown under cultivation.

Dormant roots can be shipped until the middle of June.

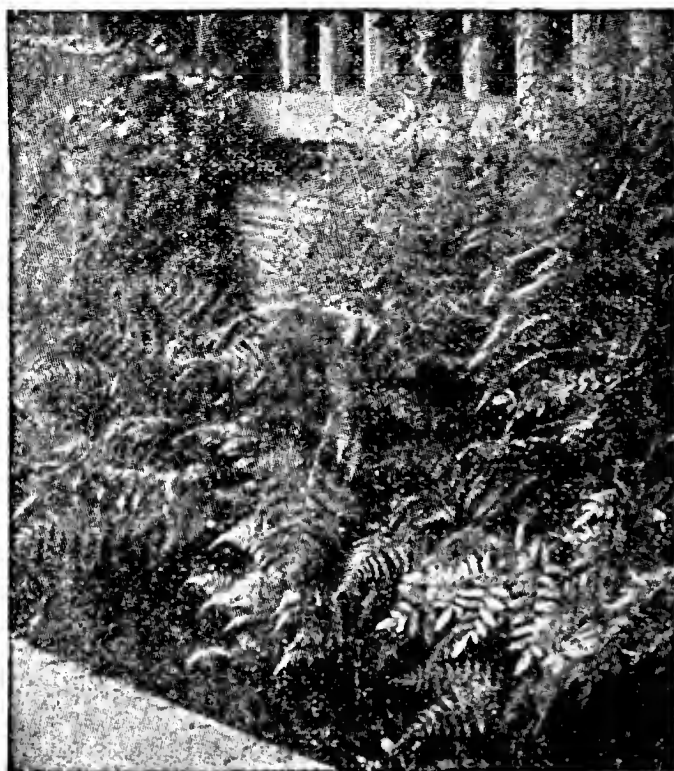

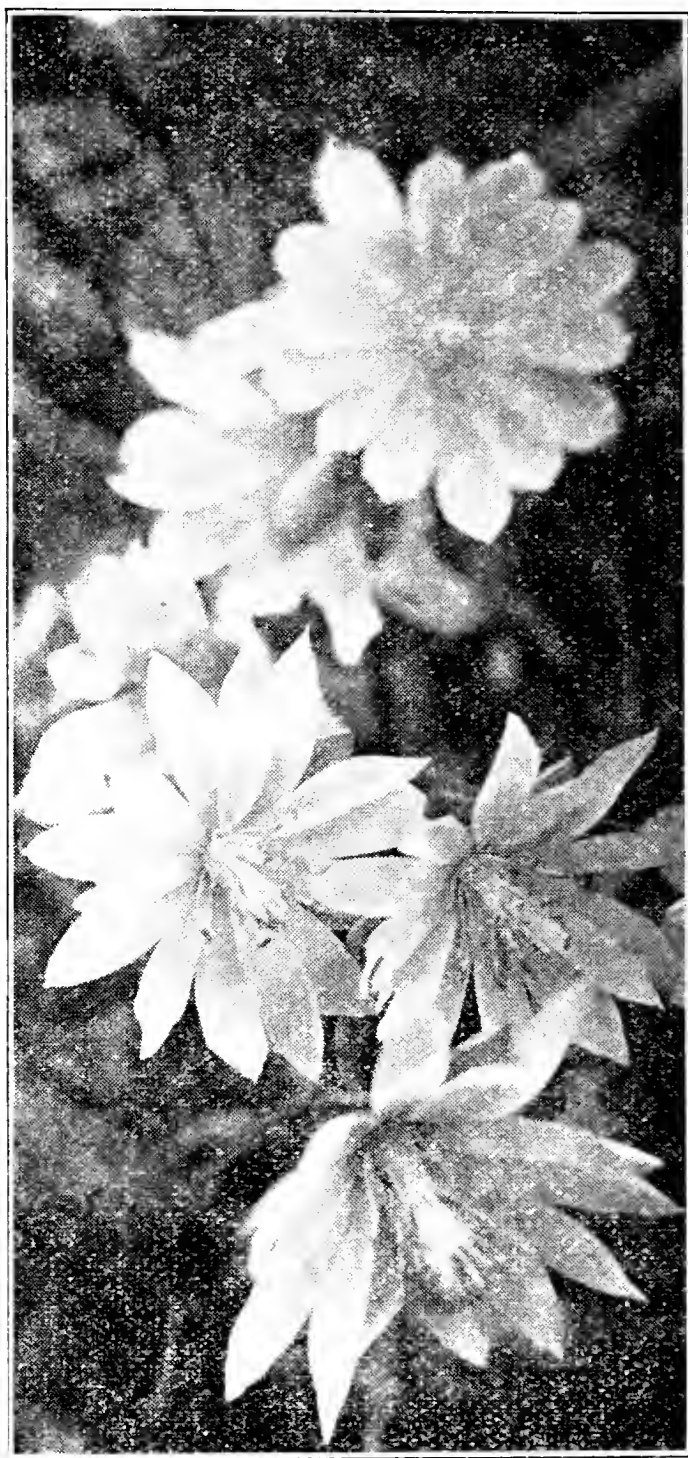
