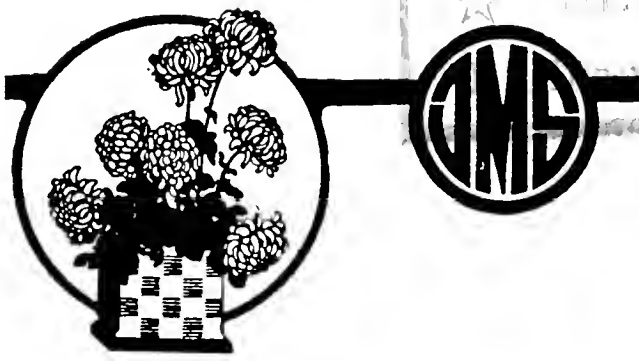


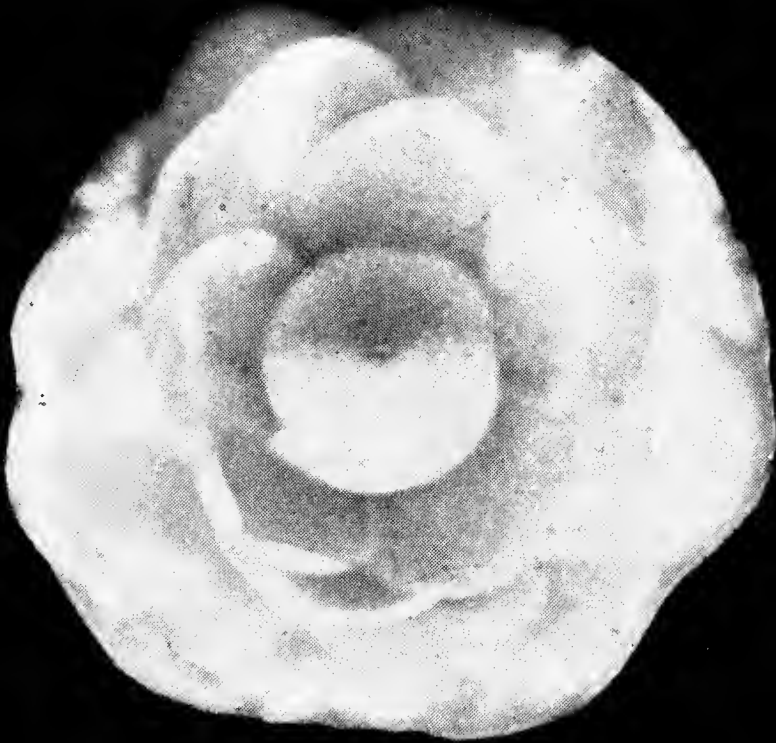

CONDITIONS OF SALE

Prices—5 plants of same size and variety at 10 rate, 50 at the 100 rate and 500 at the 1000 rate.

Terms—We allow 3% discount for cash, all prices F.O.B. Mobile, Ala., New accounts must furnish references and allow time for investigation.

We accept C.O.D. orders only when a deposit of 25% accompanies same. No charge for boxing or packing on cash orders.

Discounts—We give customers a 20% discount, EXCEPT ON LINING OUT STOCK, when trucks come to our Nurseries and we do not have to pack B. & B. plants.

Carloads—We allow attractive discounts on carload orders.

Shipping—Our customers are asked to give complete shipping instructions with each order. Whether by Parcel Post, Express, Freight, Truckline, or Boat. All these are available. When this is not done we use our best judgment. Our responsibility ceases upon delivery of goods to carrier.

Guarantee—We take great care to have our stock true to name, but we are not liable for more than the original invoice cost, and we accept orders on the condition that they shall be void should any injury befall stock over which we have no control.

Specimen Stock selected or marked by our customers at the Nursery will be marked according to value and higher than listed prices.

AZALEAS

The name is from the Greek word azaleos, meaning dry, because their discoverer believed them to grow in dry locations, however because they are shallow rooted, they require an abundance of water.

Azaleas prefer an acid soil, therefore a mulch of peat moss or oak leaves is beneficial, also serving to protect the roots, which are near the surface.

Three applications of cottonseed meal a year, is all the fertilization they need, because too much fertilizer forces young, sappy growth, which will not stand cold weather as well as an older, harder growth.

Our lining out size azaleas were planted in beds early in the Summer to allow plenty of time and space for strong root development. Their root system equaling that of a 3 inch pot plant.

Spring delivery is best for lining out size, as they need protection from cold the first year . . . we book orders in advance for Spring delivery upon receipt of one-fourth deposit . . . Older plants, however, are not affected by frost and can be purchased at any time suitable for transplanting.

Every year thousands of visitors come to Mobile to see our marvelous azaleas in bloom. This is mainly due to the variety called Pride of Mobile, appropriately named for the city in which it originated, and unequalled in regularity and profuseness of bloom.

Some of them in this section are over 100 years old, having attained heights of 20 feet and spreads of 40 or more feet. They are among the finest flowering plants in existence, being unequalled in beauty, shape and color.

AZALEA INDICA

The Indica group are the fastest growers of all . . . the Pride of Mobile being a member of this group.

Florist and Nurserymen do well by planting some of these around their home and business grounds because few people are able to resist the lure to buy some of these beautiful plants when they see them in bloom.

We have listed only the best and prettiest varieties, feeling that our efforts will be well rewarded by satisfied customers.

AZALEA INDICA

Daphne Salmon—Salmon colored, medium size flowers . . . blooms in mid-season . . . Ideal for greenhouse forcing and hardy.

Elegance—Light pink colored flowers, blooming early, of upright habit and is fast growing and hardy.

Fielder's White—Large white flowers . . . blooms early and is very hardy.

Formosa—Purplish pink flowers, among the largest in the azalea family. Large dark green leaves. Rapid grower and similar to Pride of Mobile (listed below) in its habits, ideal for landscape work.

Indica Alba—The prettiest of the white flowered azaleas . . . Upright habit and hardy . . . Fine for potting and landscape.

Indica Rosea—White flowers with a rose colored throat . . . Blooms in mid-season . . . an unusual variety and very hardy.

Iveryana—White flowers with pink stripes . . . Blooms late and is of compact habits.

Lalanceana—Delicate shade of lilac and orchid . . . its large flowers and strong, vigorous growth makes it very attractive and beautiful.

Phoenicia—Purplish pink flowers . . . low compact grower . . . used extensively with white flowered types in landscapes and flower shows.

Pride of Mobile—Lighter colored flowers than Formosa (see above) Formerly known as Watermelon Pink, because of its color the name was changed to honor the city in which it originated. Some here are 100 years old which shows its hardiness, attaining heights of 20 and spreads of 40 or more feet. Blooming in mid-season, it is one of the best for Florists and Nurserymen to handle, becoming more and more popular.

Vitata Fortuni—Lavender and white, sometimes pure lavender flowers on the same plant . . . Blooms early in Fall and continues until Spring is over . . . Fast grower . . . hardy . . . upright.

William Bull—Dubonnet colored, double flowers . . . late bloomer . . . Hardy, vigorous . . . Because of its upright habits, often used for background in large landscapes.

When received from us water daily and keep in a moderately warm house to bloom in about 60 days or less.

Christmas Cheer—Red flowers, hose in hose type. Compact grower with glossy leaves. Fine for Christmas and Mother's day forcing.

Coral Bells—Florists' favorite both because of color, which is light pink and because of its beautiful bell shaped flowers. Heavy and profuse bloomer.

Double Mauve—Mauve colored flowers with white throat, hose in hose type. An unusually beautiful new variety, this one should become popular in a short time.

Flame—Chinese red color, early bloomer, hardy and upright.

Hinamoyo—Blush pink flowers, completely hide the plant when in bloom. Fast grower and of upright habit.

Hinodegiri—Most popular of all the evergreen Kurume azaleas. Red blossoms cover the entire plant even when very small, and it is slow growing and compact. Fine for borders and the most popular in the country for Florists' forcing.

Macrantha, single—Pink and salmon flowers. Very hardy and blooms from April to July, when the others have finished.

Macrantha, double—Clear pink flowers, blooming from May to August, and like the single variety, desirable for this reason. Hardy.

Pink Pearl—Salmon rose colored, large size, hose in hose flowers, very compact with large clusters of blooms.

Salmon Beauty—Large, salmon pink flowers, hose in hose type, with light green leaves. One of the best.

Snow—Pure snow white flowers of nice size. Hose in hose type. Glossy, round leaves. This is a universal favorite with florists for Easter forcing.

CAMELLIA JAPONICA

Camellia japonicas with advanced flower buds should be kept in a very cool temperature, not more than 50 degrees.

As cut flowers their use is increasing more and more, and due to the heavy demand we ask our customers placing large orders to do so early in order to receive the varieties wanted, before they are sold out. We do not substitute varieties unless requested to do so.

Class A Camellias

Alba Plena—This well known camellia is one of the best for cut flower purposes. Snow white color, full double, blooms early and flowers from 3 to 5 in. in dia.

Belle Romania—Most attractive of variegated camellias. Flowers 4 inches across of light pink, profusely striped and splashed with crimson. Very double, free bloomer.

Chandleri Elegans—Largest flower of all, sometimes 7 inches across. Peony type, cherry red with white variegation. Blooms even when very young from February through March. Compact.

Enrico Bettoni—Salmon pink flowers, very large size, varying from semi-double to peony in form. Fast grower. Free bloomer.

Herme—Pink and red variegated with white margin, between semi-double and peony in shape. Has faint scent. One of the most popular and among the very best.

Monarch—Deep pink flowers of enormous size. Many petals and stamens in clusters inside of huge outer petals. Peony type, Beautiful foliage and compact grower.

Pink Perfection—Shell pink color. Blooms early and for a long time. Starts blooming when very young and blooms very profusely. Full double. Most popular for cut flowers.

Abby Wilder—White with tiny splashes of pink. Peony type flower, medium to large. Good grower and compact habit.

Anna Frost—Flesh pink with deeper stripes of rose, very double, about 3 to 5 inches across. Heavy bloomer.



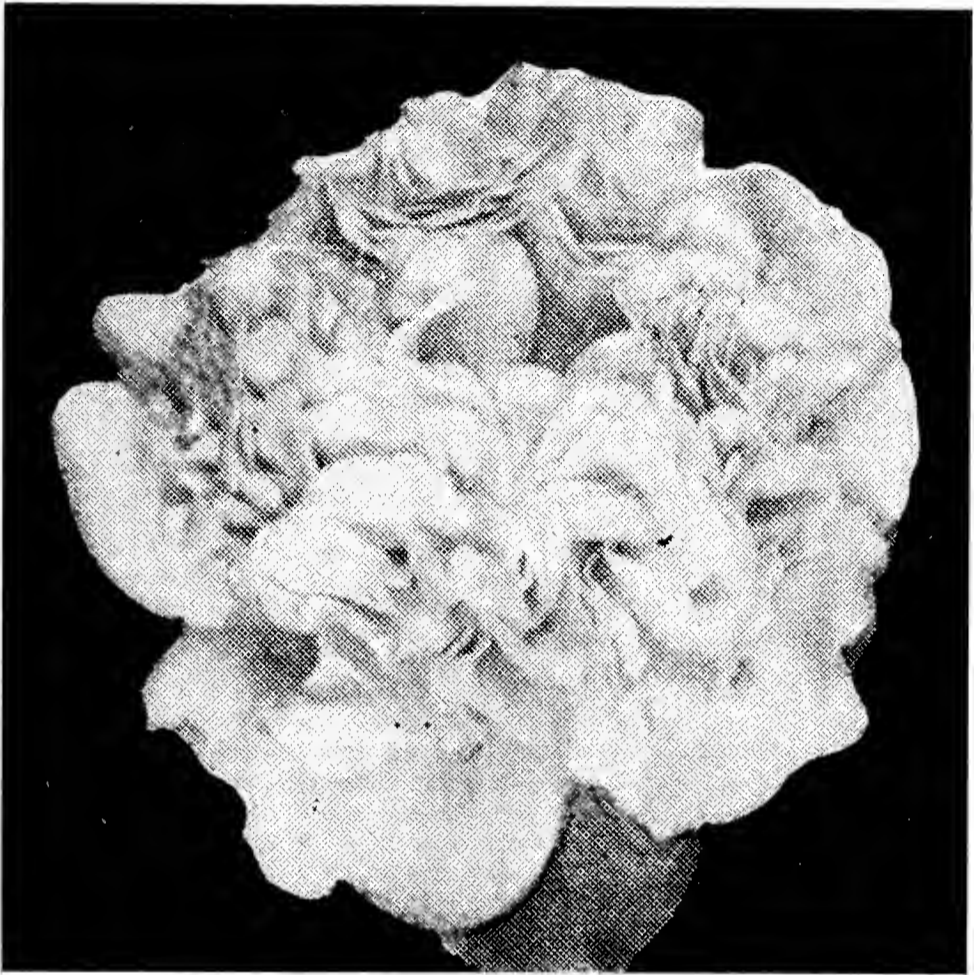
Emperor of Russia

Candidissima—Star shaped pure white flowers, very double, prolific bloomer. Blooms late and very profusely.

Countess of Orkney—Light pink with stripes of red, very double and blooms heavy even when small. Compact habit.

Duke de Orleans—White with flecks of pink, peony type. It is a good fast grower of compact habit.

Elizabeth. (Tutonia)—Pure white, sometimes pink flowers, very double with petals crinkled at tip. Leaves thick, dark green. A strong grower and free bloomer.

Gloire des Nantes—Large cerise flowers, with center petals twisted. Extra large, dark green leaves.

Jarvis Red—Deep blood red, semi-double, dark green leaves. Good grower of compact habit.

Kellintonia—Orange red striped or blotched with white, peony type. Heavy and prolific bloomer.

Mathotiana Alba—White flowers, very double, and large sized, with large light green leaves. Blooms late.

Nobilissima—White flowers, Petals mixed with stamens, Very good grower and a prolific bloomer.

Pope Pius IX—(Prince Eugene Napoleon) Large sized scarlet flowers. Very double. Blooms in mid-season. Compact grower.

Rev. John Bennett—Orange red flowers. Semi-double type and very large with stamens often twisted with the petals. Good grower.

Rose Emry—Crimson flowers of medium size . . . blooms early . . . vigorous grower . . . one of the best for cut flowers.

Rosita—Rose pink flowers with every one perfect in shape which is very double . . . very late and prolific bloomer . . . we recommend this variety for best cut flower purposes.

Sacco—Rose with lavender and white spots. Full peony type . . . mid-season bloomer . . . very unusual variety.

CAMELLIA SASANQUA

Sasanqua is very similar to camellia japonica, but it is a faster and looser grower. It blooms in the latter part of September and continues until November. It is used quite extensively for grafting.

Mineno-Yuki—(Snow on the Mountain) Double white, peony type with a nice scent and it blooms freely at an early age.

Seedlings—Mostly single flowers, mixed colors, sometimes white and sometimes red. By growing seedlings new varieties are sometimes obtained.

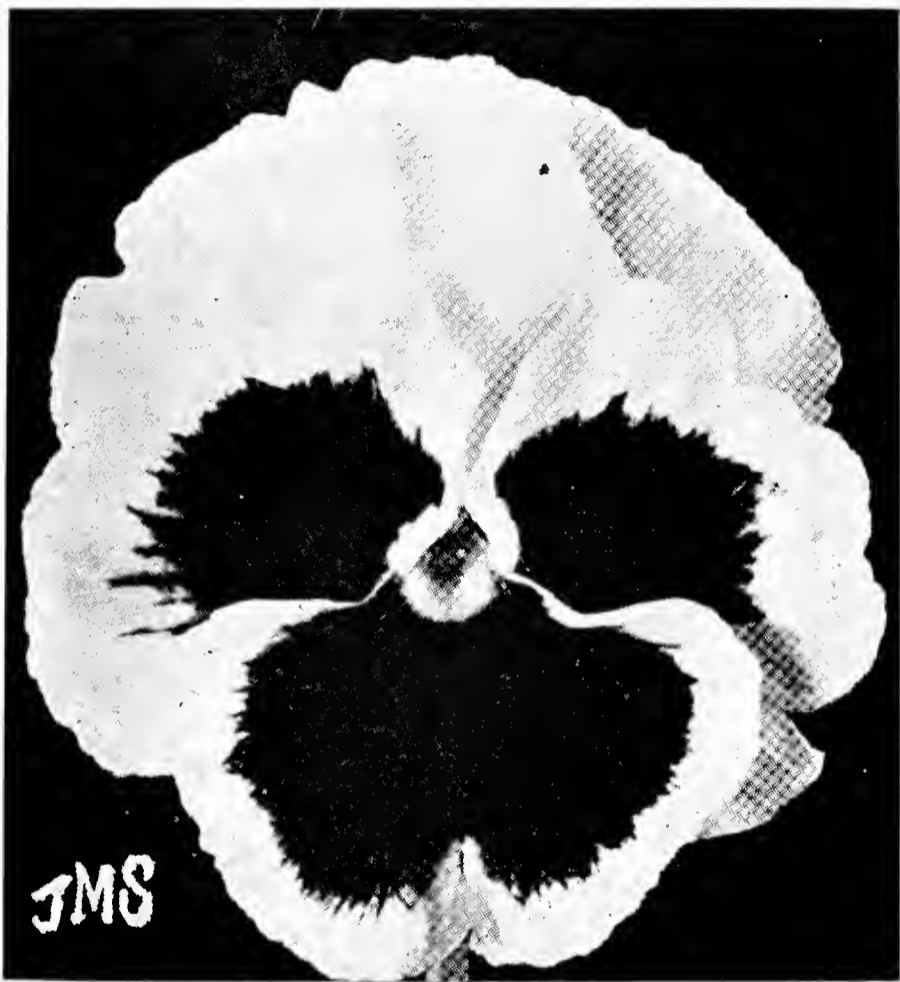

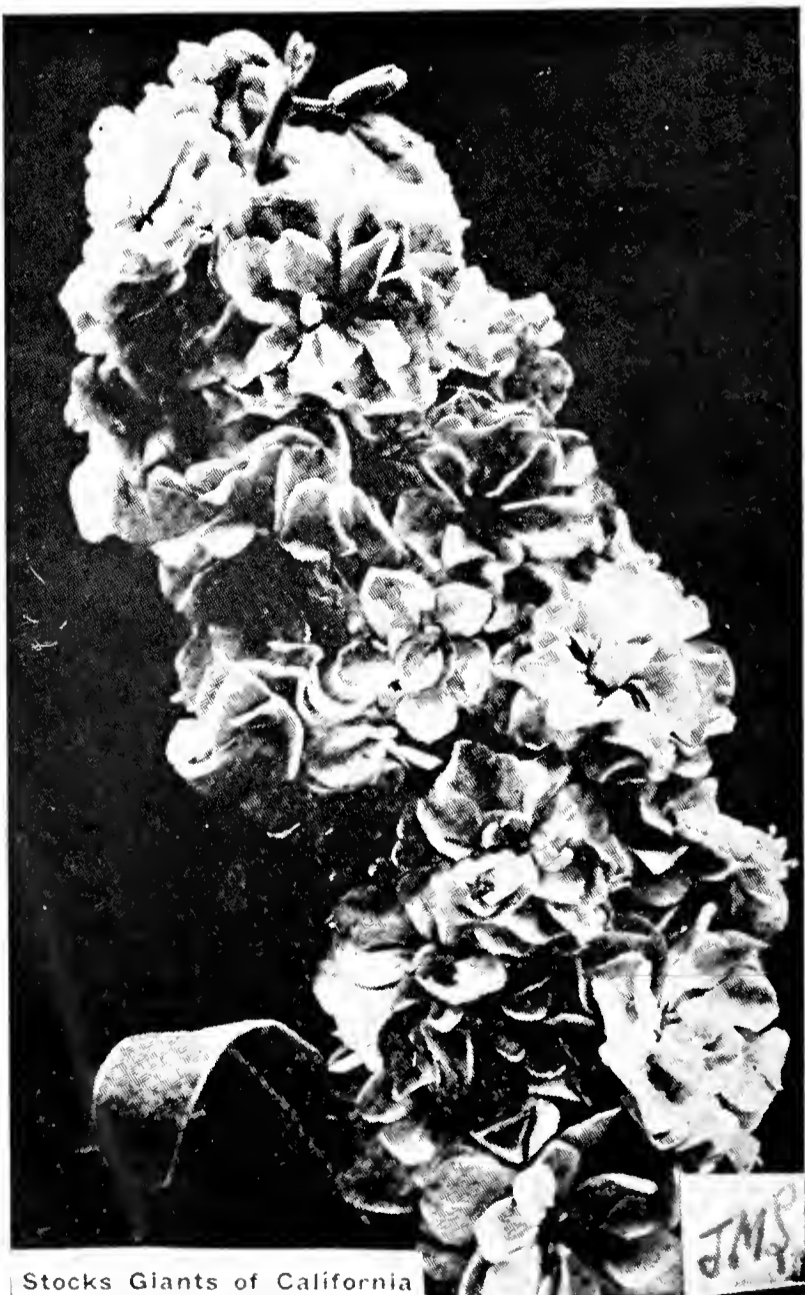
