Terms and General Conditions of Delivery

ALL SEEDS are quoted F.O.B. El Monte, California, for delivery after harvest crop 1940, 60 days net, less 2% cash 30 days. All invoices payable in U. S. dollars in or by New York or Los Angeles Exchange. All overdue accounts subject to sight draft without further notice.

Bags and containers will be charged at cost and are not returnable. There will be no charge made for bags smaller than the one pound size (5x7 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches).

Prices quoted in this list go into effect immediately, superseding all previous quotations. All orders of 4 ounces or over will be charged at the pound rate; all orders under 4 ounces will be charged at the ounce rate.

We reserve the right to change any or all prices in this list without notice.

For every order, we agree to plant sufficient land to produce the desired quantity of seed under normal conditions.

In case of crop shortages, orders will be filled pro rata only.

Crop failure or any cause beyond our control releases us entirely from delivery.

We give no warranty, express or implied, as to description, quality, purity, productiveness, or any other matter of any seeds we sell, and we will not be in any way responsible for the crop. If seeds are not accepted on these terms, they are to be held subject to our order.

Should fulfillment of any order or contract be prevented or delayed by the act of God, war, blockade, revolution, prohibition of exports or imports, riots, strikes, lock outs, fire, loss and/or detention at sea or any other contingency beyond our control, we shall not be responsible for any loss and/or damage thereby.

Shipping Information

Domestic: Time is important. Many of our customers use the Air Mail exclusively to save time and get the most possible out of our rapid order filling and delivery service. We suggest that you do the same. If your order is sent to us by Air Mail from the east coast it arrives the second day, is filled the same day it arrives and if shipped by Parcel Post seed will reach you within seven days from the time the order left your office. Correspondingly less time is needed when shorter distances are covered. For faster delivery, seeds shipped by Air Mail or Air Express will reach you within four days from the time your order is sent to us. For the greatest possible saving in time, send your order by wire to be shipped by air; seeds will arrive within two to three days from the time ordered.

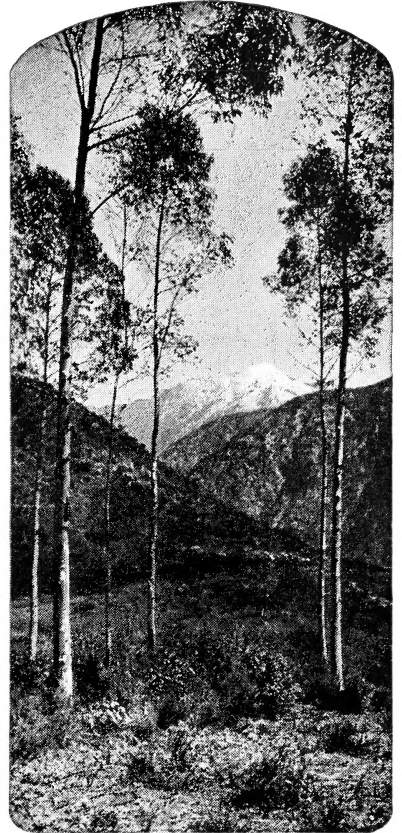
Air express rates are calculated on the basis of half-pounds and distances are zoned. Air Mail is calculated on an ounce basis and goes as first class mail. Both speed up transportation immensely, and where time is a deciding factor, they certainly are the cheapest in the long run. Air transportation is safe, sure and economical.

Regarding rail shipments, both Parcel Post and Express will take 4 to 5 days to reach the east coast. When the shipment is over 10 pounds in weight it is cheaper to ship by express, but when it is less than 10 pounds, Parcel Post is cheaper. Parcel Post packages marked "Special Delivery" are given first class mail service and will go through practically as fast as first class matter.

Shipments of 75 pounds or over can be sent most economically by Freight. Package cars leave Los Angeles twice a week, arriving in Chicago the 7th morning and in New York the 10th morning. Contract orders and others placed considerably in advance of the time needed should be sent by Freight.

Foreign: We urge our foreign customers to use the Air Mails when sending rush orders. With the new Air Mail service across the Atlantic and the Pacific, there is a great saving in time, over and on both sides of the ocean. Air Mail letters are given preference over regular mail in all handlings.

When sending orders by cable, we suggest the use of our number code to cut down on words and expense. Five numbers in a unit may be sent for the cost of one word, a rate which reduces costs considerably.

Novelties: The amateur gardener is novelty conscious, and it is easy to sell a new variety. Novelties are your logical sales leaders, and it is decidedly to your own advantage to make good use of them in your newspaper publicity, your advertising, and your counter features in the store. Transparencies: Our new colored transparencies are your busiest silent salesmen. They are accurately hand colored on translite film, printed from our regular photographic negatives. Placed in your store window, on the counter, along the walls with the seed racks, or near the cash register, they attract attention at once, and show your customer the actual flower of the seed you have for sale. Write us for full details regarding transparencies and the cabinets in which to display them.

Kodachromes: Our photographic department has recently assembled a very large collection of the small 35 millimeter Kodachrome slides which are available for the use of our customers for illustrating talks before garden clubs and other interested groups. If interested in the use of these Kodachrome slides, write us for full details and booking dates.

We are also equipped to photograph flower subjects in the larger professional size Kodachromes on order. We have a few 5" x 7" Kodachromes on hand at the present time. Write us if interested.

Electros: Believing that the day has passed when any average seedsman can afford to devote a full page or even a half page of space in his catalog to one subject, with this average seedsman in mind we have made practically all of our new electros and nicketypes in a small size this season so that six, eight or even more subjects can be shown on a page. We believe this size, particularly in the colored electros, will prove popular with retail seedsmen. We call your particular attention to our inexpensive 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ " color plates and to the large selection of new 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " black and white electros contained in this list.

All electros we send out are **unmounted** unless the order specifies that they be mounted. There is an additional charge of 20% for this service. Since a majority of our customers prefer unmounted electros we have followed this policy, but will be very glad to have them mounted for any who so request.

Photographs: Through our Photographic Service we are able to furnish you with a complete line of first class photographs of novelty and standard flower varieties suitable for publicity and catalog purposes. Photographs will be submitted for approval upon request.

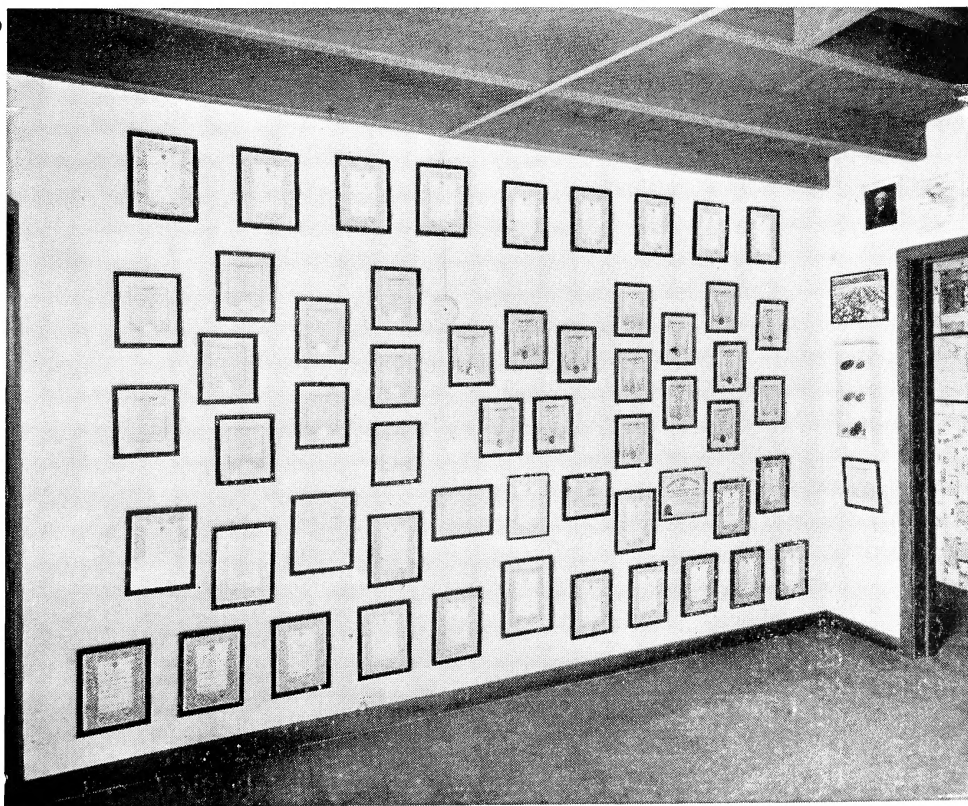

Horticultural Colour Chart: In certain sections of this catalog, we have added to the regular description of a variety some numbers and words in italics. These refer to color blocks in the Horticultural Colour Chart which many of our customers have secured either from us or from the Royal Horticultural Society direct. To visualize the exact color of the flower thus described, refer to your copy of the Colour Chart, turn to the page mentioned, mask the color block with the black mat provided and you will see the exact shade of the variety. For instance, Larkspur Stock Flowered Rosamond is described as *625 shaded 623*. These page numbers will be found in the upper right hand corner of each sheet in bold face type. *625* is the predominating color of the bloom with a shading of color *623*. Larkspur Stock Flowered Rose Queen, similar to Rosamond, is described as *623/1 and 623*. These two color tones will be found on page 623, block *623/1* being a slightly lighter tone of the full color *623*, both of which very similar colorings are found in this variety. We have been able to compile fairly complete color recordings of several flower varieties. We believe that by this method you will be able to visualize the colors of the several varieties much more vividly than any word description can do.

All-America Awards: Winners in the All-America Selections Competition are designated in this list by the following symbols: (G. M.) Gold Medal; (S. M.) Silver Medal; (B. M.) Bronze Medal; and (H. M.) Honorable Mention.

All-America award winners are among the finest flower varieties. We hope you are featuring as many of these All-America winners as possible.

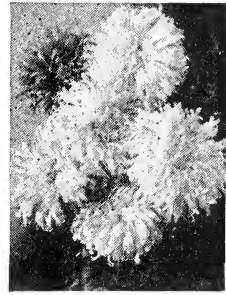

The finest large flowered, heavy stemmed wilt resistant Aster yet developed. Flowers are of the large Giants of California type, while the plants are less tall, about 1½' in height, with strong heavy stems. This class is early blooming, coming into flower four to six weeks earlier than the Giants of California, that is during early to mid August. An exceptional new class.

EARLY CALIFORNIA GIANT *f* (Bodger)

A new early blooming strain of the Giants of California Aster. The flower size and form are the same as in the later blooming group, while the plant habit resembles the Beauty class, with branching beginning rather high on the main stem, the flowers being borne erect. Blooming commences a week or more earlier than in the late class, or about the end of August under our conditions. We very highly recommend the new Early California Giant Asters for short season districts, or wherever a large flowered type is wanted early in the season.

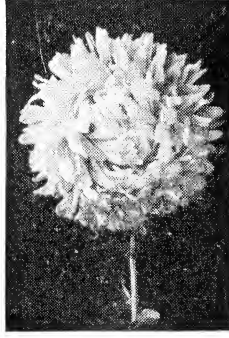

ASTER WILT AND WILT RESISTANCE

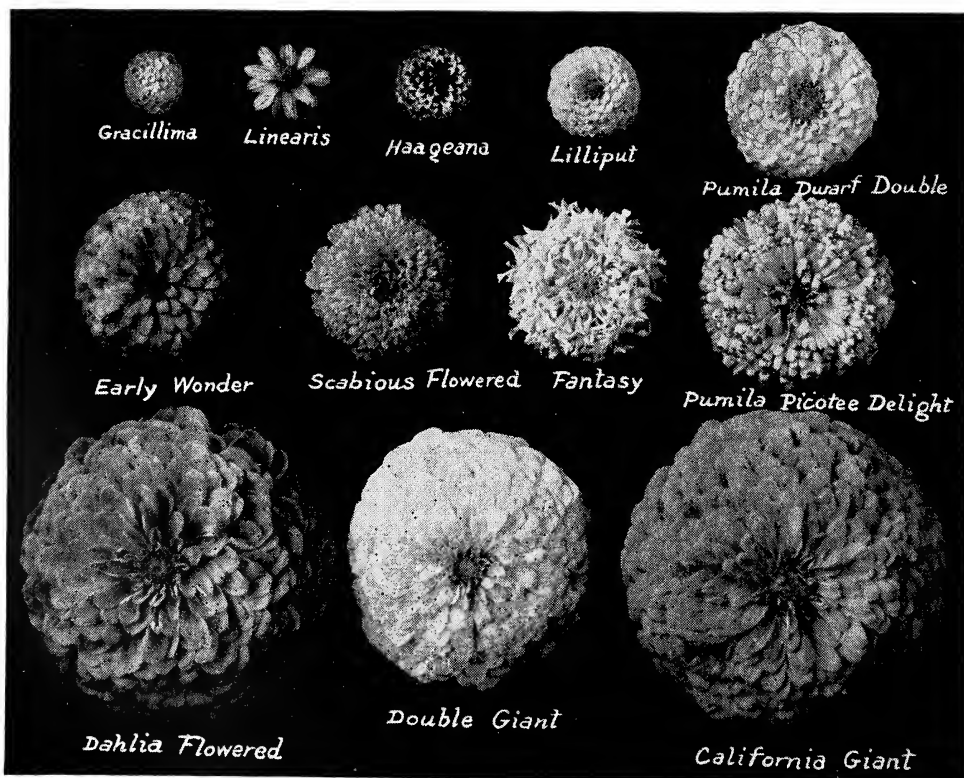
The so-called wilt disease of Asters is caused by a specific parasitic fungus, which may attack the plant at any stage in its growth from the seedling to the seed-producing age. The spores of the fungus may be carried on Aster seed and on inert matter with the seed, on the implements used in preparing the soil, and in the soil itself. When once introduced into the soil, it persists indefinitely and makes the land "aster sick," that is, whenever an ordinary strain of Asters is planted into that particular soil at any time thereafter, the wilt fungus living in it will attack the plants and they will die off at some stage of their growth.

A wilt resistant strain of Asters, however, is one which, although planted on the very sickest soil available, will withstand the attacks of the fungus and develop into strong, healthy plants. Just as some people or animals withstand the attacks of certain diseases, while others become sick at the first sign of an epidemic, so the resistant strains of Asters will withstand the attack of the wilt fungus, while the non-resistant strains will succumb.

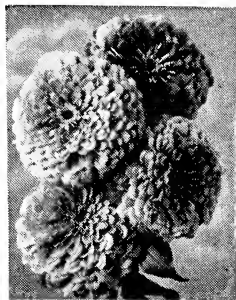

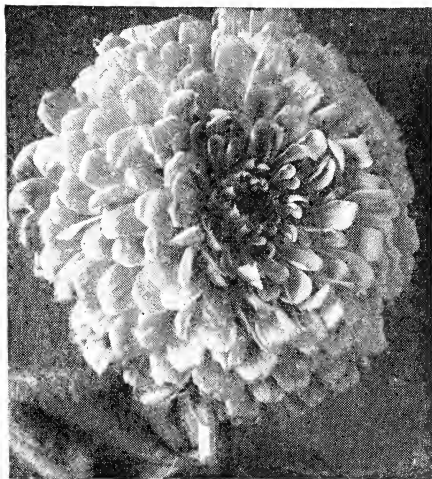
Comparative Zinnia Flower Types

BRIEF CULTURAL NOTES

ZINNIAS: Zinnias are warm weather loving plants and should never be sown until the soil has thoroughly warmed up and all danger of any frost has passed. For best results, especially with the smaller flowered, early blooming varieties, we recommend sowing the seed where the plants are to flower. The taller growing, large flowered sorts can safely be transplanted, although they also will make a more robust growth and will produce more flowers if they can be sown where the plants are to bloom, and then when the seedlings are 3" or 4" tall, thinned to the proper distance. To induce a thrifty, heavy root system, irrigate your plants rather than sprinkling. Dig a little trench alongside the row and let the water run slowly for several hours so it will seep down deep into the ground and make the food in the soil available for the plant throughout the mass of feeding roots. Always cultivate after each irrigation to conserve moisture. By this method you will have to water Zinnias only once every two weeks or so, whereas if the ground is merely sprinkled, you will have to repeat the sprinkling every other day or so. Irrigation not only gives a stronger, healthier plant, but also saves on your water bill.

CALENDULAS: Calendulas are definitely cool weather loving plants and in the warmer climates should be sown in the autumn for early bloom in the late winter or early spring. While they like full sun, they cannot stand the burning sun of summer. In colder climates, seed should be started in the cold frame and plants set out as soon as possible for late spring and early summer bloom. In planting Calendulas, be sure and choose the proper type for the use you have in mind. There are forcing varieties for greenhouse growing and garden varieties for outdoor growing. The outdoor varieties make a sturdier, more compact growth and are very desirable for garden use, while the forcing varieties are developed especially for the cut flower trade and do best under greenhouse conditions.

GODETIAS: In their native California, the Godetia seeds on the hillsides sprout with the first winter rains and grow during the cool, wet winter months and come into flower during late spring, hence their name, Farewell-to-Spring. Given similar treatment in the garden, they will give their best bloom. Sow the seed broadcast late in the fall and allow them to remain undisturbed during the winter months. In the spring they will grow quickly as the soil warms and bloom profusely during late spring. Best results will be obtained by this method as they cannot tolerate the very strong summer sun.

GOURDS: Gourds should be sown where the plants are to remain and should not be planted until late in the spring after the soil is thoroughly warm and nights as well as days are warm. For best results sow in a warm, sandy location, somewhat on the dry side. Provide enough water for a normal growth until the flowers appear, after which no further irrigation should be necessary. Watering during the flowering period will cause dropping of flowers and buds, and consequent loss of Gourds. For perfect-shape specimens, vines should be trained up on a fence or trellis and the Gourds allowed to hang, thus assuring straight necks and preventing rotting or discoloration from the soil. Do not harvest the Gourd crop until the fruits are thoroughly matured. This will be when the stem becomes brown and hard and pressure with the fingernail cannot dent the shell of the Gourd. After picking, Gourds should be hung in an airy, dry place until thoroughly cured. The large, hard-shelled varieties are then washed and scrubbed before decorating. The small, colorful varieties are wiped clean of dust and given a light coating of varnish or shellac. If thoroughly dried before treatment, Gourds should last several months for house decoration.

IPOMEAS: In growing Ipomeas, never plant until the soil is thoroughly warm. If it is too cool, the seeds will rot instead of germinating. Even in such warm sections as Southern California, seed should not be sown until late May. To aid germination of particularly hard-seeded varieties, filing a small notch at the top of the seed will help considerably. Always select the driest, sandiest part of the garden and sow where the plants are to flower as the Ipomeas resent transplanting. Plants should be kept on the dry side in order to induce early and abundant flowering with a rather sparse growth of foliage. Heavy watering will stimulate foliage growth at the expense of flowers. A poor soil is preferable to a rich one and fertilizer should not be used as this will promote heavy foliage which will hide the flowers. Ipomeas show off to best advantage when planted against a wall, fence or trellis.

LARKSPURS: Larkspurs are cool weather plants and for best results should be sown in the fall. In warm sections, such as Southern California, they are sown as early as August, broadcast where they are to bloom and if for the cut flower market, are sown thick like radishes and the entire plant pulled to go to market. For the home garden, on the other hand, plants are thinned out to the proper distance and allowed to branch normally for a more brilliant show of color. In the colder sections, seed should be sown broadcast in November in its permanent position in the garden. If very severe, a light mulch covering should be applied. Seed will, therefore, remain stratified and dormant throughout the winter months and with the spring thaws and first warmth will germinate and commence to grow. As Larkspur seed requires a chilling for best germination, this is the ideal treatment for best results.

MARIGOLDS: The African Marigolds are strong feeders requiring plenty of water. This type should therefore be planted in the richest, most favorable section of the garden. Seed may either be sown where the plants are to flower or can be started early in a seed bed and the seedlings set out to their permanent position later on. They transplant very readily. French Marigolds on the other hand are very light feeders and require a very small quantity of water. Too strong feeding and too heavy watering will throw them into foliage growth with a great scarcity of flowers. For a free-flowering, colorful plant, select the poorest soil, keep the plants on the dry side and do not fertilize. Seed may be sown where the plants are to flower or seedlings can be transplanted from the seed bed although better results will probably be obtained by sowing in place. Marigolds are fairly hardy and should be started early in the spring.

PETUNIAS: The chief pitfall the amateur runs up against in growing Petunias is in the seed sowing. Almost invariably they bury the tiny seeds so deeply that the sprouting seedlings cannot possibly fight their way to the surface. Petunia seed must be sown with the very utmost carefulness. A seed flat or a seed pan should be used, a light, loamy soil carefully prepared, properly moistened and finely screened, the box filled to within a half-inch of the top with ample drainage on the bottom and tamped down firmly, smoothly and evenly. Then the seed should be mixed with about a teaspoonful of sand and this mixture of seed and sand sprinkled carefully and thinly over the surface of the seed box. A very fine sprinkling of pure sand, not more than $\frac{1}{8}$ of an inch, may be used on top of this mixture or it may be left without any further covering. A pane of glass or a damp burlap sack or folded newspapers should then be placed over the flat and left there until the seeds begin to sprout. Immediately after the first sprout appears, this heavy shading must be removed and a single layer of gauze substituted. If the soil has been properly moistened when it is being prepared for sowing, it will not have to be watered again until the seedlings have developed their third and fourth leaves. If the soil appears to be drying out, however, water is to be applied with a very fine-spray hand bulb, or better still, the pan or flat placed in a tray of water to allow moisture to soak upwards from the bottom. Always leave the seed box in a well-ventilated place, but without any draft, to prevent damping off. When the seedlings are large enough to handle, they should be pricked off into a second flat or small pots for a few weeks before setting out in their permanent position in the garden.

SCABIOSAS: While the annual Scabiosas will bloom during the summer, they do so much better in the early spring than during the hot summer days, that every effort should be made to start the seed in the early fall in warm sections or in cold frames in early spring in the more northerly sections. In warm sections, such as Southern California, plants will winter over perfectly well and produce extremely early flowers the second year. Scabiosas enjoy full sun and will thrive in any good garden soil.
