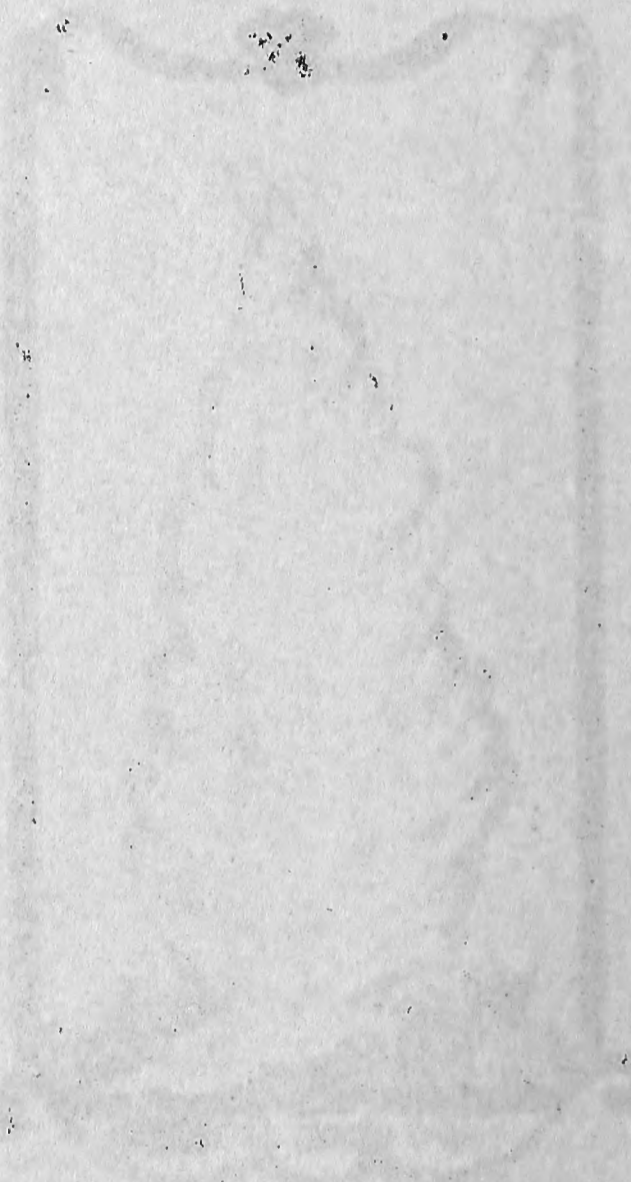


Airplane views of the 160 acre nursery of

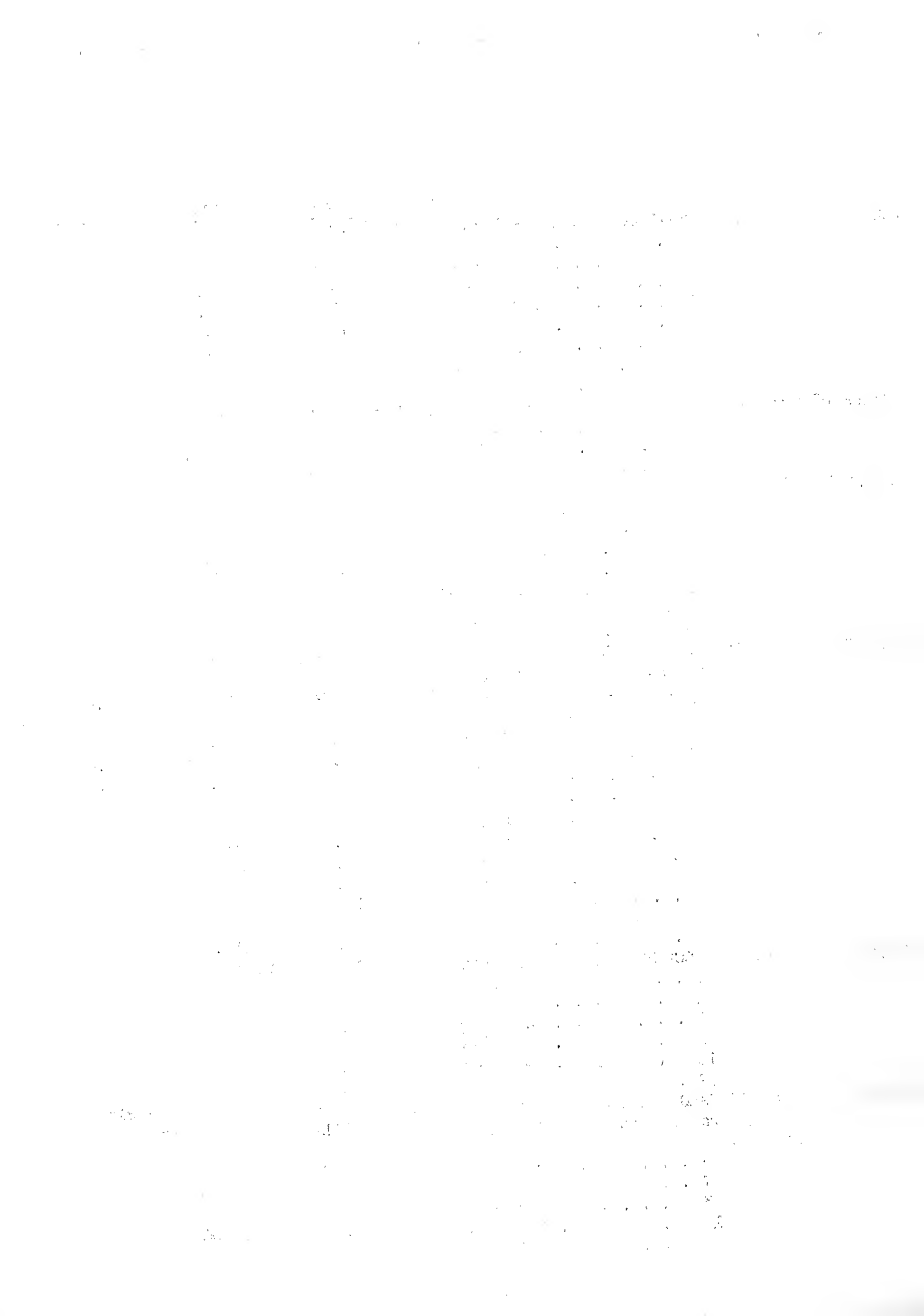

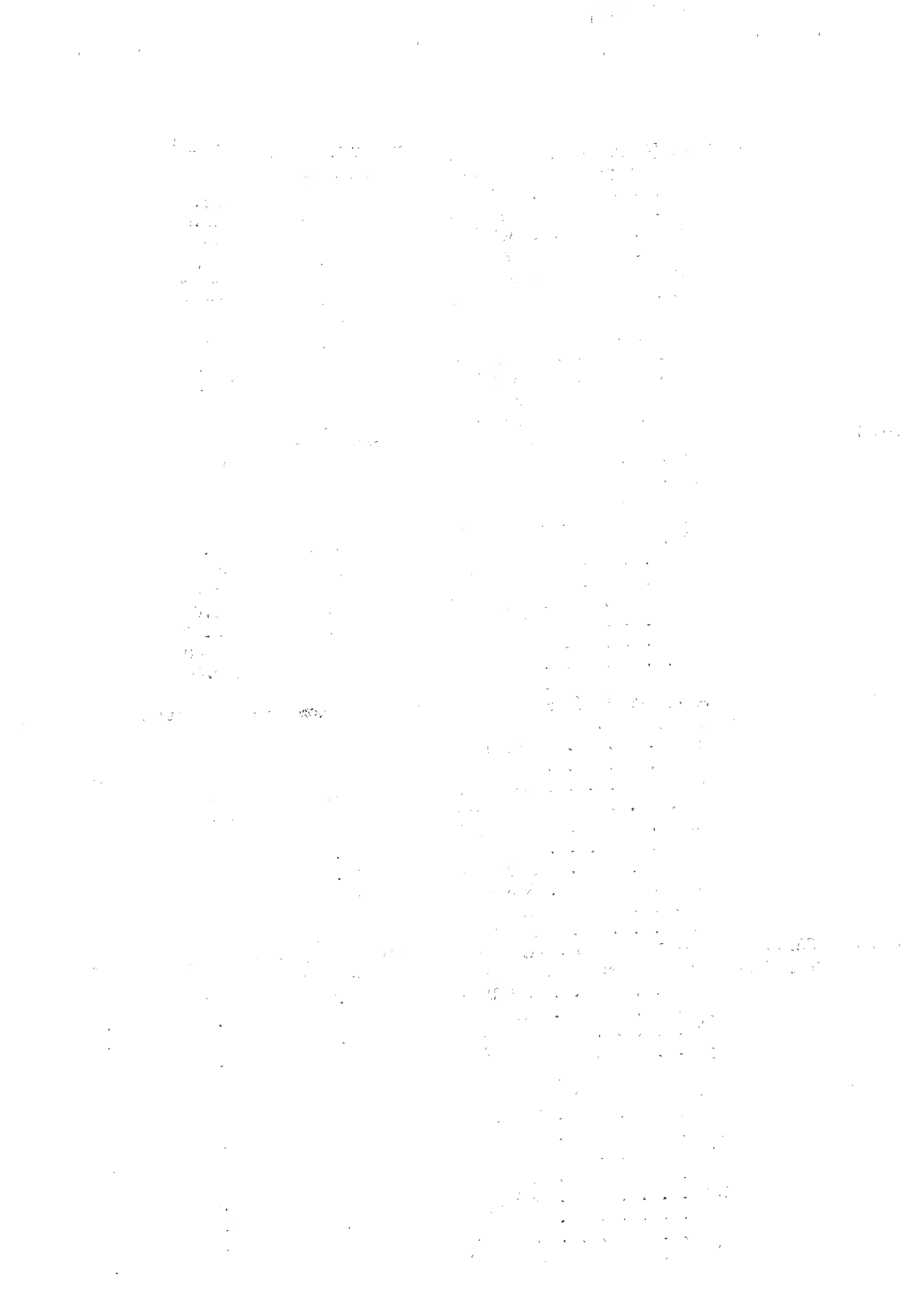

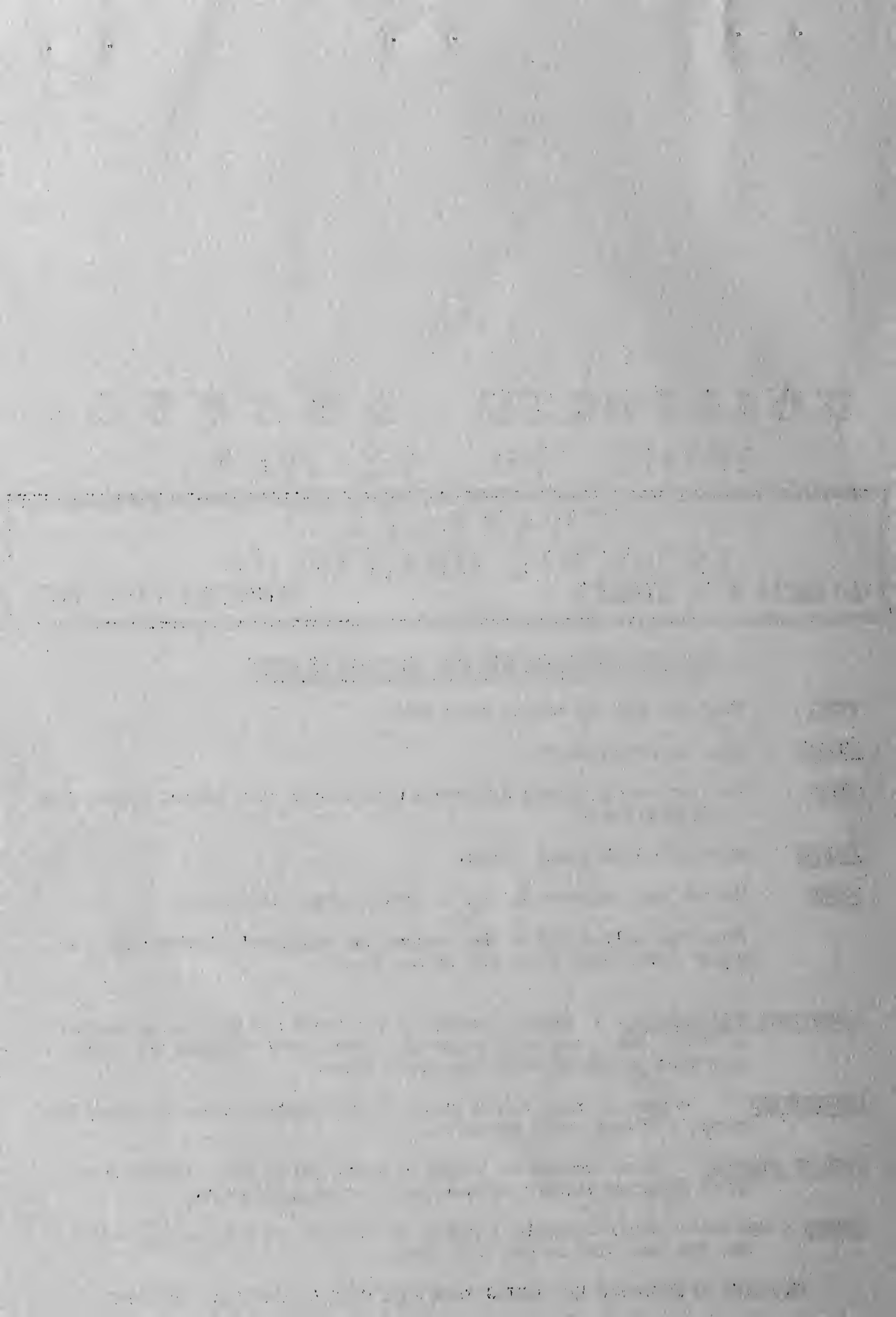

Elms may be moved at the proper time of year bare rooted, up to and including the 4 to 5 inch size. All trees transplanted during the winter when the ground is frozen, should be moved with a ball. Pin Oak, Birch, Magnolia, Ilex, Flowering Peach and a few other varieties should be moved with a ball regardless of the season.

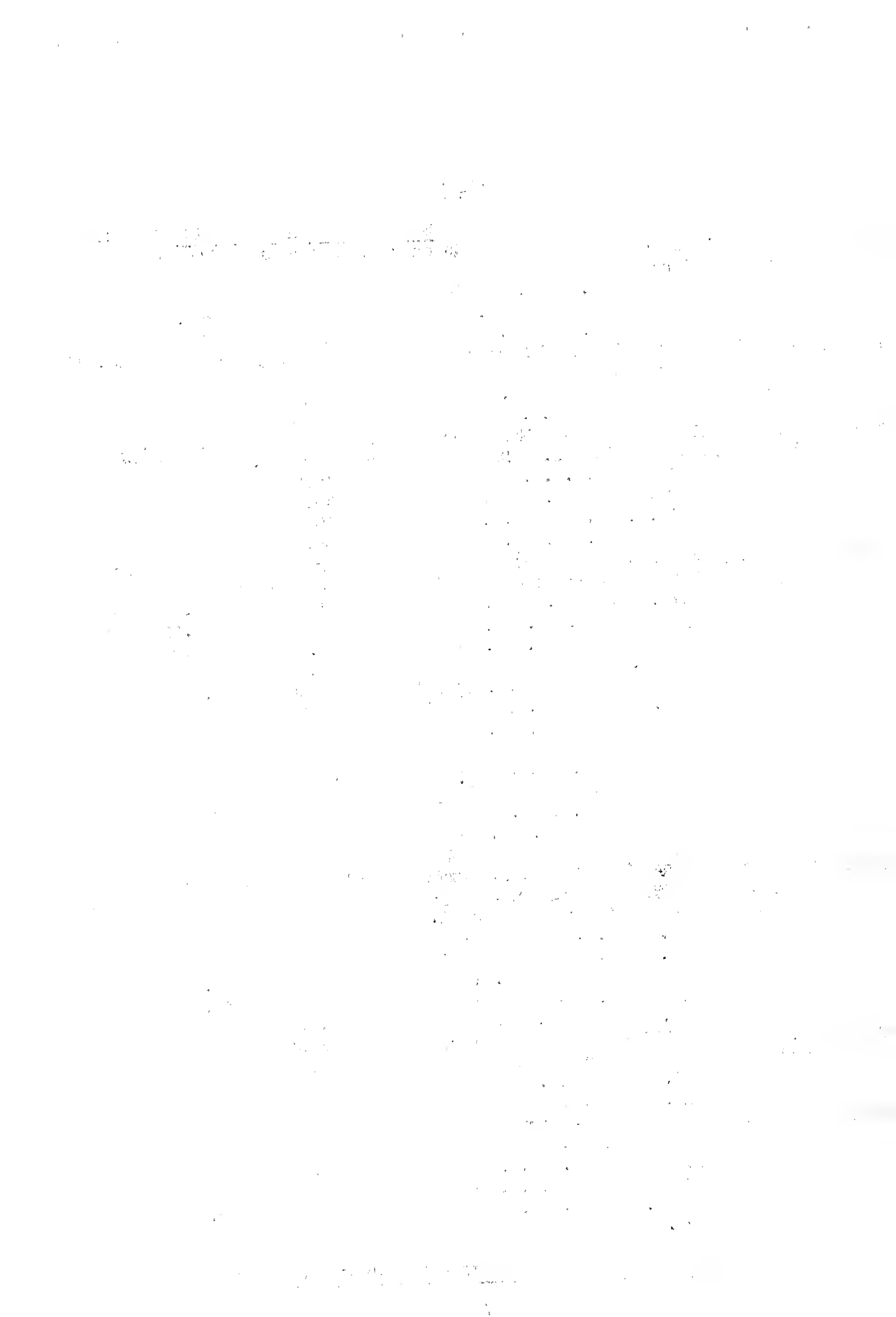

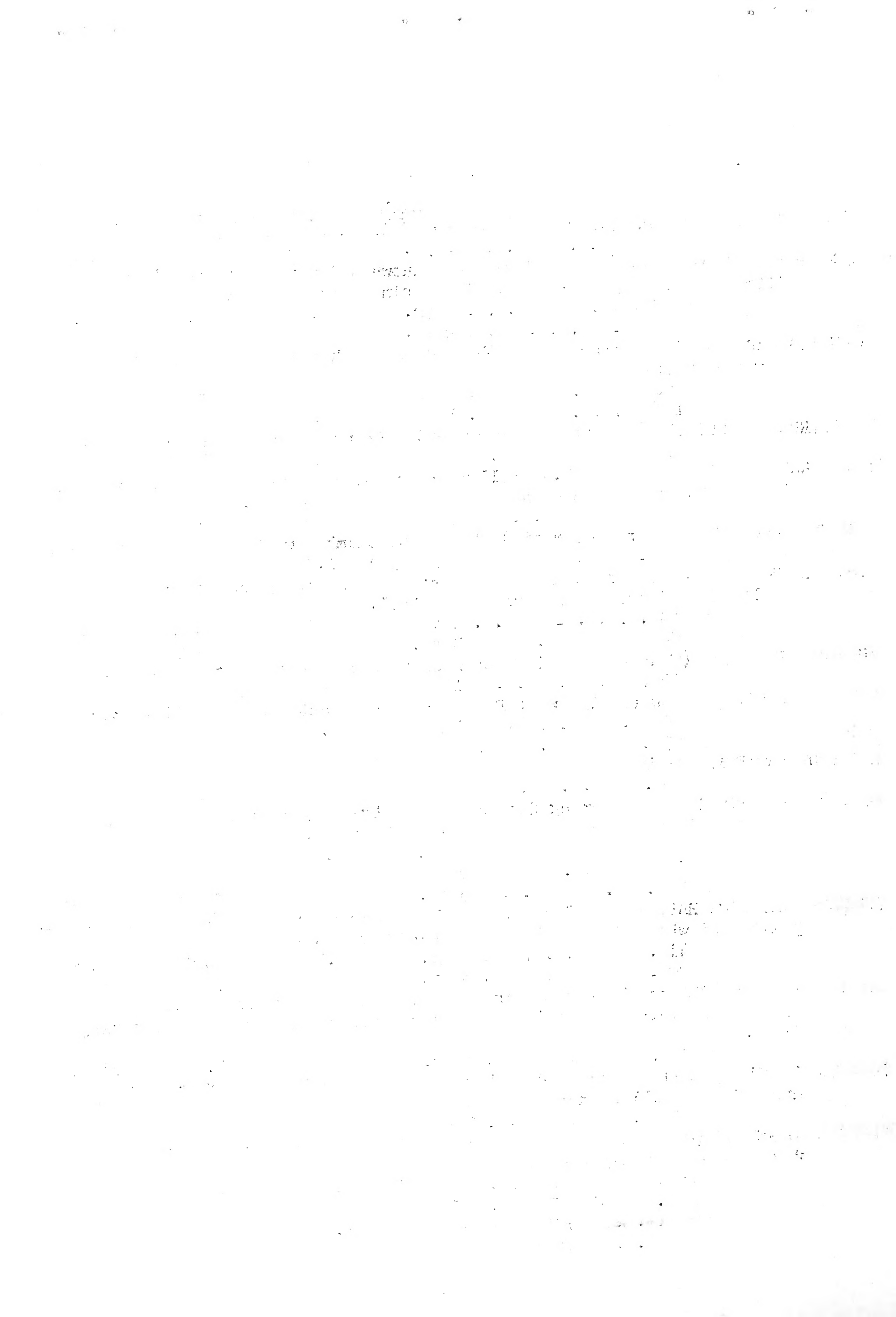
