SIZE OF GLADIOLUS BULBS—We offer Gladiolus bulbs in three sizes.

LARGE size, 1¼ to 2 inches in diameter. The best blooming size. We recommend this size for immediate results.

LARGE bulbs are designated by the letter "L".

MEDIUM size ¾ to 1¼ inches in diameter. This size will give good bloom, but a little later than the large size.

MEDIUM bulbs are designated by the letter "M".

SMALL size 3/8 to 3/4 inches. These will make good blooming bulbs for another season, though some will bloom the first year, if planted early.

SMALL bulbs are designated by the letter "S". When there is a figure before the price of a variety, as 2-10c or 4-10c, it means 2 bulbs for 10c, or 4 bulbs for 10c, etc.

OUR GUARANTEE. We guarantee our stock to be true to name, clean, vigorous and healthy, free from thrips and disease. Should any error occur in labeling or otherwise and any stock shipped eventually prove untrue, we will replace with true stock and you may keep the stock first sent.

TERMS. Full remittance should accompany all orders. However, we will ship C. O. D. on request, when 25 per cent of the amount of the order is paid in advance.

TRANSPORTATION. We pay all delivery charges unless quoted otherwise.

DISCOUNTS. We allow the following cash discounts, when payment is made in full before shipment except on bulbs at wholesale prices.

10 per cent on orders of \$5 to \$25.

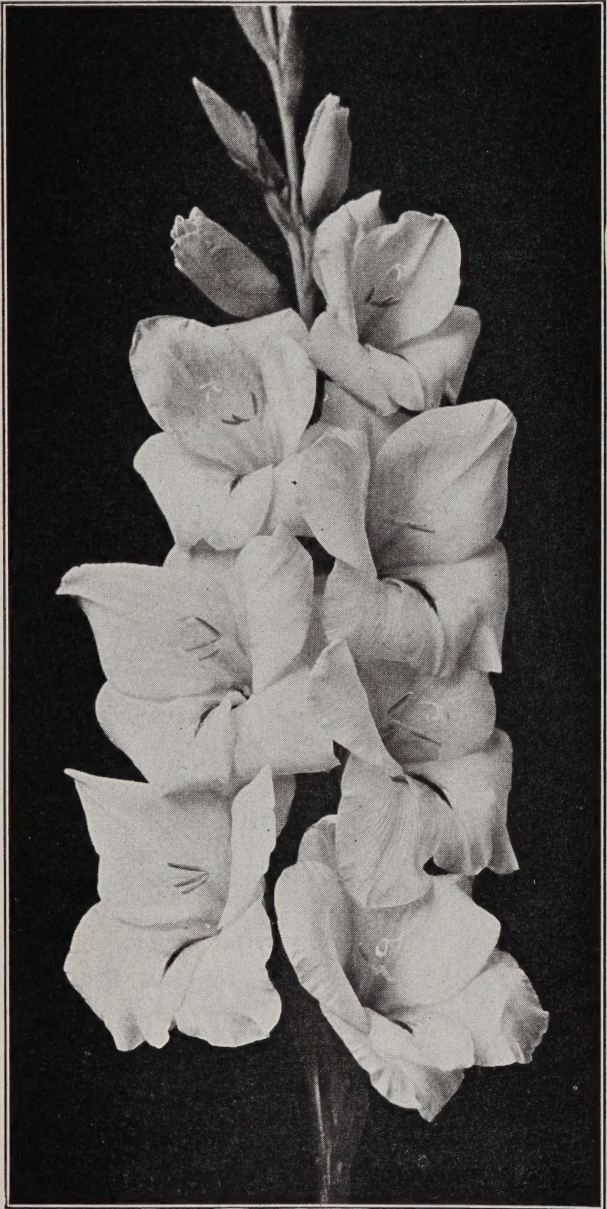
15 per cent on orders of \$25 to \$50.

BULBLETS — We are offering bulblets of nearly all varieties. It is a cheap way to get started in the high priced varieties, if you will give them the extra care needed. They should be cracked or better still, peel a strip of the hard shell from the side of the bulblet, but be careful not to injure the bulblet in peeling. Bulblets also require plenty of moisture to germinate. We do not guarantee bulblets to grow, so do not expect us to replace any which fail to germinate. We will send you the largest bulblets available, but some varieties never make large bulblets, so if you get bulblets which are small, it will be for the reason that variety produces small bulblets. We always give extra count when stocks are available.

A package of bulblets will contain about 100 bulblets.

We cannot fill orders for bulblets after May 1st.

Apache

Alice Reid La France pink, overlaid with geranium pink. Long straight spikes of well placed flowers, which open perfectly to the last one. Very early. Large 2-10c, M 4-10c, S 8-10c, pkg. blts. 10c.

Apache Ground color, orange, heavily overlaid with smoky purple and streaked with very dark purple, almost black. Large yellow blotch in throat. A very odd color combination. Good healthy grower with tall spikes and many good sized flowers open at a time. L 15c, M 10c, S 2-10c.

Appeal Tall graceful plant with several very large butterfly like flowers open at one time. Color, beautiful shade of geranium pink with conspicuous yellow lip. Rapid propagator. L 2-10c, M 4-10c, pkg. blts. 10c.



Empress

Daffodil Prim. Grand. The deepest clear yellow Gladiolus we have ever grown. Tall, straight slender spikes, with plenty of 4½ inch florets open at one time. Winner of several first prizes at the State Shows. Greatly admired by florists. L 2-12c, M 2-10c, S 3-10c.

Empress Rose pink with edges of petals streaked deeper pink. Large, conspicuous greenish yellow blotch in throat. 12 or more large, well placed flowers open at a time with unopened buds all showing color. One spike makes a good bouquet. A good exhibition novelty. L 20c, M 15c, S 10c, 25 blts. 15c.

Flor-Rico Rhodamine purple, upper petals and throat light mallow purple. Intensely ruffled and fluted with three to four large flowers of extra heavy substance open at one time. A distinct purple gladiolus. L 2-10c, M 4-10c, pkg. blts. 10c.

Honey (Prim. Grand) Color, a soft and pleasing buff pink. Especially attractive in artificial light. Four or five well placed, good sized blooms open at one time on long, slender, stiff stems that always come straight. Large bulbs will send up two or three spikes of bloom. Extra good propagator. Mary Frey Lavender pink with ruby blotch on lower petals. Flowers are of large size, perfectly placed on a long, straight, slender stem with six to nine open at one time. Extra early. K & M's Triumph (K & M) Color, light salmon pink with a creamy blotch. 7 to 8 well placed flowers open at a time on a strong upright stem. Called the best pink so far produced. L \$3.00, M \$2.00, 1 blt. 50c.

Koala (Errey) Ground color creamy pink overlaid with a golden sheen. Throat yellow, powdered brown. Distinct and attractive. L 75c, M 60c, S 30c, 5 blts. 10c.

GLADIOLUS THRIP

Gladiolus Thrips have caused great damage to Gladiolus during the blooming season in nearly all parts of the U. S. the past two years.

The Thrip is a very small insect about 1/20 of an inch in length and not easily seen, except when numerous. Thrips do not overwinter outdoors, where the ground freezes. The main source of infection is from planting bulbs infected with the insects. If your gladiolus did not blossom as good as in former years, it may have been due to the Thrip and you should treat your bulbs before planting.

For treating a small number of bulbs, the simplest and most convenient method is by the use of NAPHTHALENE FLAKES. This material intermixed with the bulbs at the rate of 1 oz. to 100 large bulbs, in a paper bag or box gives complete control. After 2 or 3 weeks all insects should be dead. Crushed moth balls can be used if the flakes cannot be obtained.

We believe that all bulbs offered for sale should be treated to eliminate Thrip, as they may be present without being known. We have accordingly treated our bulbs with the best known methods and we can state with confidence, that our bulbs are free from Thrips.

Iris

Iris may be planted successfully at any time, when the ground is not frozen. The best time is during July and August, as this gives the plant sufficient time to obtain a good root growth before freezing weather.

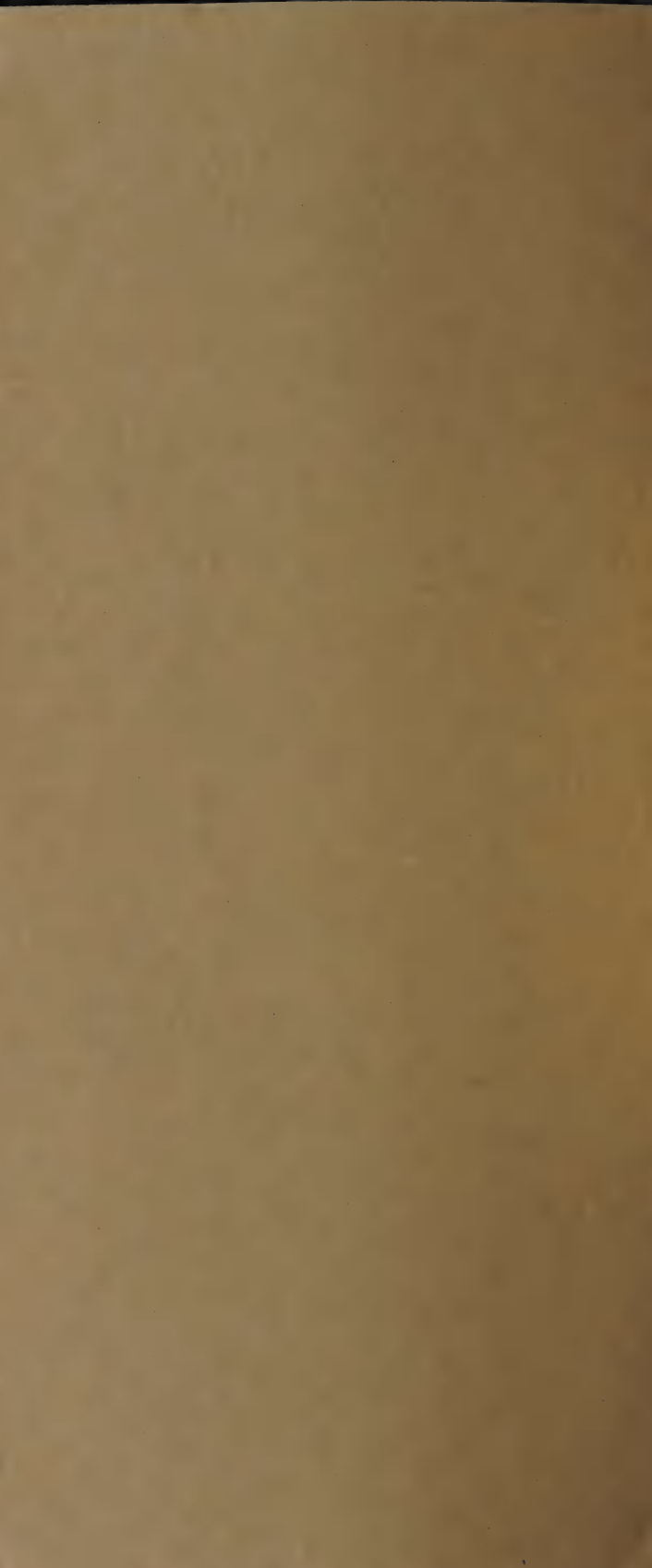

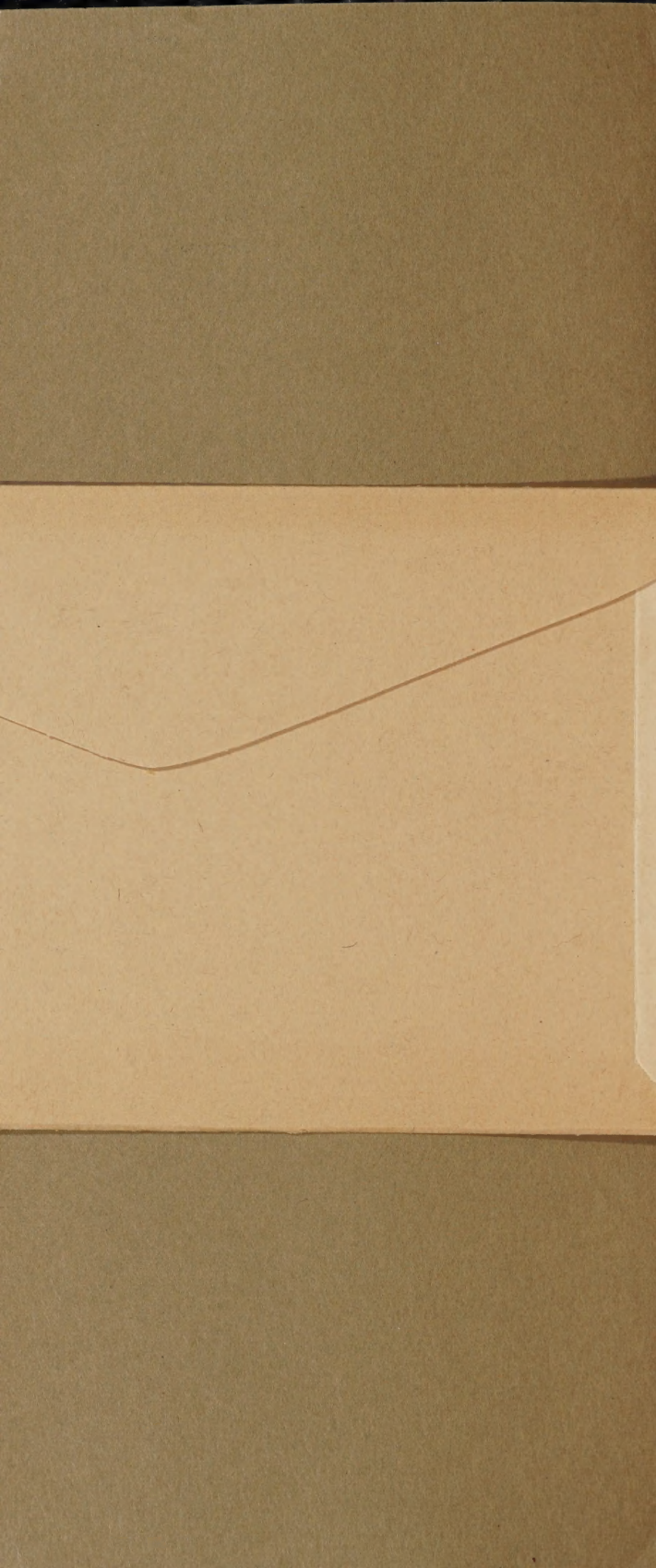
