cobra of the jungles of India, and is one of the few carnivorous plants known to science. The plant has no leaves, the stalks are
twisted and funnel shape, small at the bottom, growing larger with a rounded hood at the top from which hang two crimson and green appendages which have the appearance of feelers or whiskers.
The hood is beautifully colored, and mottled by white translucent areas through which the interior is lighted. Both hood and appendages bear many honey glands, the excretion from which sects toward the mouth, an orifice on the under side of the hood, and are lured inside the funnellike stem from which they can not come back, as the stem is lined with innumerable little hair-like prongs all pointing downward, and once they get below a few of these points they have to conin the digestive fluid or liquid in the bottom of the stem.
