





This is also offered as Wisconsin Copenhagen and is a very important mid-season yellows-resistant sort of Cabbage for kraut manufacture and market. This variety has prominent globular heads which approach those of Glory of Enkhuizen in size, and it produces a heavy yield on yellows-infested soil where ordinary varieties fail.



EARLY FLAT DUTCH

One of the oldest varieties. The head is usually large and flat, tender and fine grained. My strain of this Cabbage is of the best to be had. It is excellent for a tonnage crop because of the large heads.

WISCONSIN ALL SEASON

This is a yellows-resistant strain developed at the Wisconsin Experiment Station by selection of healthy plants out of standard All-Seasons grown on infested land. Wisconsin All-Season is a very valuable, heavily productive, hard-headed variety of particular merit for use in yellows-infested localities and it is well adapted for kraut and for winter use.




GEORGIA BLUE STEM COLLARD PLANTS





All seed is treated before planting and plants are sprayed during the growing period and thus you are assured of good, healthy, strong plants. Because they are grown in the open field and are subject to light frosts during the growing period, they are Genuine Frost-Proof plants and will stand temperatures as low as 18 to 20 degrees above zero without injury. Onions grown from Fulwood's Genuine Frost-Proof Onion plants are also an excellent

money crop, as they can be marketed at least two weeks in advance of Onions grown from sets and way ahead of Onions grown from seed. Furthermore, my plants will make much better Onions than those grown from sets, the Onions being larger and they do not run to seed. They will also keep much better when cured and stored.

My Onion plants should be set out the same time as my Cabbage plants, and you can order them for shipment at the same time. My Onion plants are not to be confused with cheap Texas plants kept on storage. Order my fresh pulled plants for a bumper crop on Onions.



The plants are sprayed continuously to prevent disease, and when ready for shipment, plants are pulled one at a time and the roots are well wrapped in damp moss. These Tomato plants can be shipped successfully to all parts of the United States.

DESCRIPTION OF VARIETIES OF TOMATO PLANTS

GREATER BALTIMORE is similar to the Stone, heavily productive and very valuable for canning. Fruits are scarlet-red, large, commonly weigh six ounces; deep but flat; smooth, very firm and solid.

MARGLOBE is a splendid type for earliness and uniformity; particularly valuable for shipping; definite disease-resistance recommends this type for use in sections infested with Fusarium Wilt and Nailhead Rust. Plants thrifty and heavily productive, of long bearing period. Fruits uniform deep scarlet; large; uniformly globe shaped; smooth, solid and of distinct quality.

BONNIE BEST is unexcelled as a general purpose Tomato; very valuable as a canning and shipping variety in northern sections. Fruits evenly colored bright deep scarlet-red; medium large; flattened globe shape; smooth and firm.

The plants make a slow but steady growth and when eight or ten weeks old they are extremely tough and hardy. In this condition they can be shipped to territory farther north and be planted in the open

fields there a month or six weeks earlier than home-grown, hot-bed, or cold frame plants.

These Frost-Proof plants will stand temperatures of 18 to 20 degrees above zero without injury. Freezing of the soil or covering of the plants with ice, sleet or snow after they have been planted will not it are them unless the temperature gets below 18 to 20 degrees.

 Because my plants are so strong and healthy, and because they can safely be planted considerably in advance of home-grown plants, is the reason for their being able to make large, extra early crop-all ready for market during the time prices are high. Many unreliable growers are selling plants and calling them "Frost-Proof." In many instances these growers are located where they do not have frosts during the growing period and, therefore, the plants they are offering have never been subjected to the frosts.

In planting, pack soil well around the roots, pouring water in the hole after the plants are set out. Throw loose dirt around the plants after watering to keep the wet soil from drying out. 
