Freight, express or parcel post shipping charges are not included in our selling price. On *express* and *freight* shipments, *customer pays the transportation charges* upon arrival of their order.

On *parcel post* shipments we include the postage with the customer's bill.

To include transportation charges in our prices is positively impossible as we cannot determine the size or weight of each order until it is completely packed for shipment. In addition—quicker arrival in better condition is assured the customer if charges for service rendered is collected at destination. Because extra time is required at our local freight and express office to bill out prepaid shipments when thousands of orders are going forward each day.

Complete customer satisfaction is assured as *we include with each customer's order of \$5.00 or more extra Nursery Stock of equal or greater value to cover transportation charges.*

Transportation charges on Retail Orders are usually from 25¢ to 95¢ depending on varieties and sizes ordered. Should your customer prefer to select some item for shipping charges, please write same on the order. Otherwise we will select and ship with each order of over \$5.00 an item that we believe will please your customer.

Fall Planting

In most sections everything can be planted with perfect safety in the Fall and fine results obtained.

In extremely cold sections we recommend Spring planting for Perennials, Privet Hedging, Evergreens, Everblooming Roses, Peach Trees, Raspberries and Strawberries and recommend Fall planting of everything else. This refers to Maine, New Hampshire, Vermont, Northern New York, Northern Michigan and Northern Wisconsin.

We urge Fall orders because experience shows our customers are well pleased with results when they plant in the Fall.

Important Notice

No advance payment is required on orders of \$2.00 or over.

Due to the cost of bookkeeping and handling small accounts, *orders for less than \$2.00 should be sold for cash*, to be paid by the customer at the time the order is booked.

Leader Removal, that is the cutting out of part of the main branch or leader, is a type of pruning essential in the case of many varieties. It retards natural growth to obtain a heavy, well-branched, well-shaped tree or plant.

In other varieties, tests have demonstrated that heavy, bushy, shapely specimens are best obtained by Multiple Top Pruning, at predetermined intervals, throughout the growing period at the Nursery Farms.

Scientific Pruning develops an unusually heavy, compact root system, that permits transplanting with a minimum degree of shock and a consequent minimum interruption to natural growth.

That is why it is possible to offer our customers the protection of an exceptionally liberal replacement guarantee.—“IT GROWS OR WE REPLACE IT FREE OF EXTRA CHARGE.”

ENTIRE ROOT-WRAP MOISTURE CONTROL

Superior Quality Nursery Stock, handled and packed by the New Moisture Control, Entire Root-Wrap Method, insures arrival at customers' homes in the same field-fresh, ready-to-grow condition as when dug at the Nursery Farms.

Nursery Stock that is allowed to get too dry becomes permanently damaged and results in stunted, scrawny specimens, which never develop their natural beauty and productiveness.

If packed too wet, stock may become soft—premature growth may start and overheat in transit. When planted, unnatural growth may result in lack of root nourishment to keep pace with top development—and the plant withers and dies.

The new MOISTURE CONTROL ENTIRE ROOT-WRAP METHOD eliminates all these troubles. Each shipment—each individual piece of stock—receives *exactly the right amount of moisture* for delivery as Mother Nature intended, in ideal condition for successful planting. That means satisfied customers.

OFFICIAL INSPECTION

Every year the nursery stock in our big complete line is thoroughly inspected by the New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets. A certificate of inspection is issued to us after inspection, upon finding our stock free from injurious insects and plant diseases. It is our permit to sell and ship such stock in and out of New York State. A copy of this Certificate is filed with the Department of Agriculture in every State where we do business, and a copy of this Certificate is attached to every customer's shipment of stock.

But that's only a routine procedure, required by law. We go further. At great expense, Dr. Shaw or a member of his staff inspects all apple, pear, plum and cherry trees to make sure the trees are true-to-name. Humans, with the best of intentions, makes mistakes. Mistakes may be made even after the greatest care. We check finally on that human weakness to prevent disappointment to our customers.

This, too, is one of the extras—just another of our “Points of Superiority”.

Only the plants that develop close to the Mother plant are used. Weak, inferior quality plants that grow at the end of the runners are not used in filling our orders.

Compare these rigid methods with what could be used if our aim or motto was, "Not how good, but, how cheap."

Suppose the mother plant was allowed to produce fruit—Sold the fruit for profit, then later sold the plants to the unsuspecting public. Naturally, we could sell such plants at low price and still be ahead.

Good Trees Are Great Money Makers

By SAMUEL FRAZER

(From The American Agriculturist)

Think of the time and energy which the planter and his children will waste growing a scrub tree when they might be reaping dollars by caring for a good one! We never get something for nothing. It costs more to grow a tree right than to grow a scrub.

The public can get what it pays for and no more. The fruit grower who wants a tree well-grown on first-class roots, propagated with care will have to pay enough to reimburse for the additional expense in propagating.

GETTING YOUR MONEY'S WORTH

The possibility of the tree repaying the expenditure depends to an enormous extent upon the judgment used in the first purchase. If a cheap, poorly grown tree is planted, one may never get the reward.

It is interesting to note that the yield of the bearing trees of the United States is frequently one-tenth of a barrel per tree; in other words, there are a lot of drones in the orchards. For the live producers the important question is: Am I going to plant a drone tree or a producer?

PEDIGREED TREES PAY BIG

There are apple orchards which are averaging 10 barrels a tree. These orchards for a term of years will run in a gross revenue from \$20.00, to as high as \$40.00 a tree; in other words, one single apple tree will turn in as much money as an acre of beans or wheat or as much revenue as the average cow and have to feed her three times a day and milk her twice.

The same farmer who is going to buy an apple tree, when he contemplates purchasing a horse will always prefer and pay more for a well-bred, well put up, close-coupled work horse, because he can do more work. If he is well-bred he is worth more than a scrub.

He will pay more for a cow capable of producing 10,000 pounds of milk than for one whose maximum is 4,000. Why not use the same judgment in buying trees?

SHIPPING INFORMATION COVERING STRAWBERRY PLANTS

Many people have the mistaken idea that August is the best time to plant Strawberry Plants. The fact is, the only plants which could possibly be planted in August are either Old Plants which have borne one or more crops of Fruit, or Pot Plants. The first are not satisfactory and the second are impractical.

The plants we sell are field grown New Plants, have never borne fruit and under normal growing conditions it is impossible to develop a rugged, heavy, fibrous-rooted new plant for August shipment. They are not fully developed until late September, but because of their vitality and ruggedness will become established in their new home before Winter sets in.
