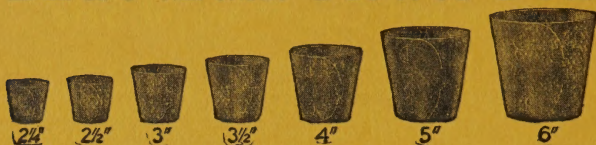

PRICES in this list cancel all previous lists and are subject to change without notice. All prices quoted herein are f. o. b. our nurseries or cars at Westminster, Md. Additional charge is made when customer selects extra specimen plant material. New customers are requested to use printed stationery or enclose business card with first order. No order should be less than \$1.00. All orders are booked subject to prior sale or shipping restrictions.

TERMS are usual to those of established credit or whose responsibility is known to us. All open account invoices are payable 2%-10 days, 1%-30 days unless otherwise agreed. Cash, security or satisfactory references required from unknown parties. Interest at the rate of 6% per annum shall be charged on accounts from maturity. No stock will be sold directly or indirectly on consignment.

SHIPPING instructions are required with each order, whether by freight or express, stating route if you have a preference. In the absence of definite instructions, we will forward shipment the way we think best, without assuming responsibility. We are on the Western Maryland Railway which connects with the Pennsylvania and B. & O. Railroads and steamship lines in Baltimore. Freight Truck transportation is available direct from our nurseries. All shipments travel at risk and expense of purchaser. A Certificate of Inspection accompanies each shipment.

PACKING, boxing or baling is charged at actual cost. When cash accompanies order, please allow sufficient extra to cover packing; otherwise, same will be billed to purchaser collect. The cost of packing is naturally greater on certain bulky items such as Privet, B & B Evergreens, etc. No packing charge is necessitated where stock is placed on cars or trucks in bulk.

CLAIMS for any cause must be made in writing within five days after arrival of stock. We give no guaranty, express or implied, as to description, quality, productiveness or any other matter of any nursery stock or bulbs we sell, and we will not be in any way responsible for the crop. All agreements and contracts are made subject to crop losses through unavoidable causes.

ORDERS are always individually filled with fresh dug stock. Our customers appreciate the fact that we do not ship them stock that has dried out in the storage house.

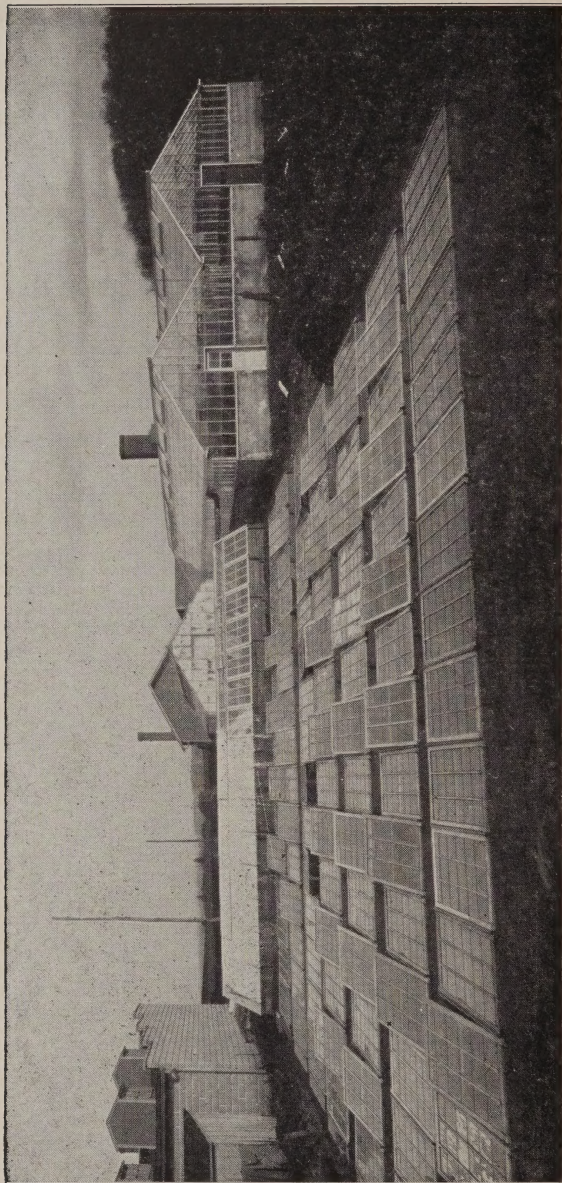
