

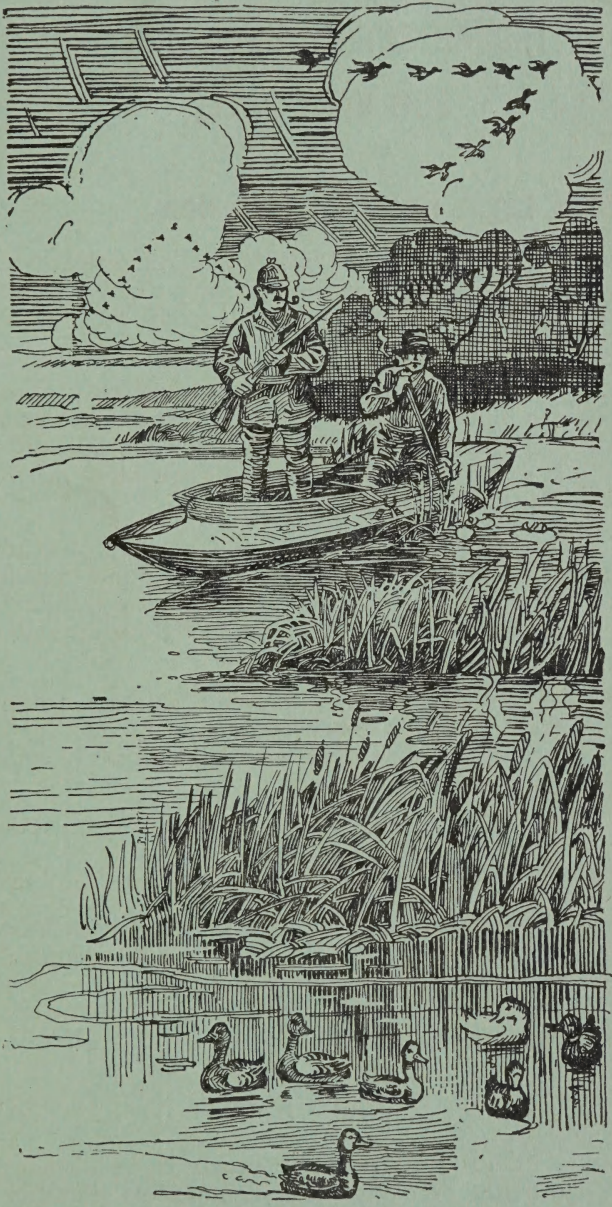

### **Plant Legal Natural Foods Now.**

The number of wild ducks that you can have at your favorite shooting place will be governed by the natural foods that grow there.

Whether the Wild Ducks will stay over the entire season depends upon that food supply. Will it last throughout the season? If not, plant more now and have more growing next fall.

Did you ever try to drive a group of sparrows away from a good meal and watch them fly to the wires or a near-by building and await till all was quiet before they return to continue their meal.

It's the same with Wild Ducks. Drive them out of a good feeding place and they will slyly work their way back in pairs and trios for more.

### **Also Improve Fishing.**

Many of the same plants that are the best wild duck coaxers have equal value as food and cover plants for Game Fish. The fish life is dependent upon plant life for its existence.

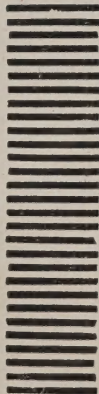

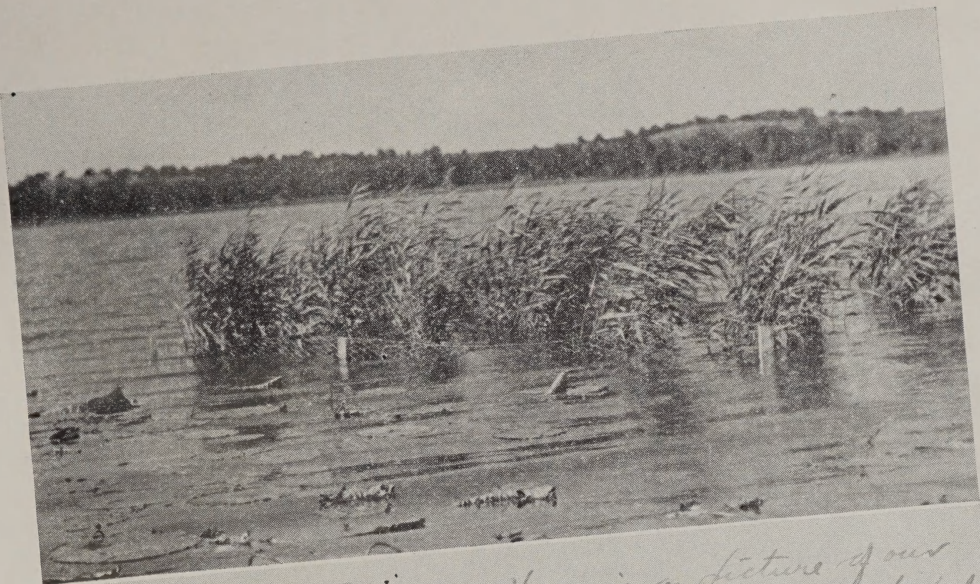

Thanks to the combined efforts of State Fish and Game Departments, and the efforts of many sportsmen, we had the best flight of ducks last year of any time over the past 15 years. If they did not stop on your favorite waters it was because they were devoid of sufficient feed to entice them. Countless thousands of wild ducks invaded our aquatic nurseries and would have liked to eat up our stock of salable duck foods for planting, had we not driven them away. Over the entire country there was a concentration of wild ducks on the good feeding grounds, while other waters devoid of food reported few birds.

There is but one way to keep up this supply of migratory water fowl and that is, not to ease up one bit on our conservation development programs. Keep up the present feeding and breeding grounds for Wild Ducks. Plant that pond, lake, marsh or slough nearby within convenient distance of home. It's what you and thousands of others like you do that will "Keep 'Em Flying," so when our boys come home, they may again partake of their favorite sport.

A Spring planting of Natural Wild Duck Foods provides for next Fall's flight and makes a permanent stand for years to follow. Many of the same plants that are the best wild duck foods have equal value as food and cover plants for game fish. One planting improves both the hunting and fishing.

Let's welcome our sons back to a land of sports where they can enjoy the freedom of the Great Out-of-Doors that makes America what it is -- and is, in part, what our boys are fighting to preserve.
