
A.B.C. Seed Production . . .



 Light wooden rollers drawn by a team are passed over the harvested seed pods to separate the seed and force them onto an underlying canvas.



Suspended sieve trays separate the coarse material from the seed and fine chaff allowing the seed to fall on clean canvas.



A SEED IS such an infinitesimal piece of life it hardly seems possible that it could be backed by much of a story. But from plant breeder to seed bin courses a series of events equal in interest and novelty to those occurring in any production line. Seed harvesting itself is an example.

Nearly every seed has its peculiar harvesting problem which must be overcome to insure its arrival at your greenhouse in an acceptable condition. On the one hand you have phlox, which promiscuously throws seed from its pods, so that paper or canvas must be placed on the ground to catch the seed. On the other hand you have stocks or sweet peas, which are more inclined to retain their seeds.

In the case of the latter, the pods must be broken either by passing through an adapted alfalfa cutting machine or through use of large but light wooden rollers drawn by horses, as in (1).

The bulkier chaff is next removed by the movable tray in (2). Cleaning finer seed such as petunia and begonia is a very tedious task, requiring the use of specially designed trays.

Your seed still is not "presentable" and must go through further processing as is shown in (3), a seed cleaning mill. The seed, nicely cleaned, is now ready for shipment—but first a sample is taken for germination test and for flower trial to be certain that it conforms with the requirements of A. B. C. "Supreme Quality."

A number of months may pass before you will need your seeds. Hence, each bag must be carefully labelled and

stored as in (4). Our modern, brick and concrete warehouse and office building in Chicago is ideal for seed storage. A year-round cool atmosphere surpasses any attempt to date of artificial air conditioning and assures the best possible germination of A. B. C. carefully harvested seed at time of shipment.



GIVE ASTERS ADDITIONAL LIGHT FOR EARLIER FLOWERING

As much as three to four weeks may be gained in the time of flowering of Asters through the use of additional light in the seedling stage—supplied from the time they are flatted, up until they are planted.

An ordinary 25-watt bulb will do. Suspend this two feet above the flats and turn on for four hours each evening, starting say at 6:00 p. m. The usual planting date for the cloth house falls in the first two weeks in May.

HOW MUCH SEED WILL CUSTOMERS NEED?

A difficult situation arises if you are unable to advise your customer how much seed will be required to sow a given area. It should be valuable to keep the following information in mind.

As a general rule you can figure that the average suburban home, walks, gardens, etc., occupies about 1/3 of the area. As a usual practice, clover seed should be sown separately. It is heavier than other seeds in a mixture and will settle to the bottom and gives uneven sowing. If present in the mixture, mix well before sowing.

Asked about prospects for Victory Gardens in '44, Alex Laurie, head of the Department of Floriculture at Ohio State University, stated: "There is no doubt but that Victory Gardens will play an even more important part in the food production this coming season than they did in 1943. Florists who produced plants and sold seeds this year should plan to continue, but instead of using haphazard methods of variety selection or dependence on the old standbys it would be worth while to consider the appended list. This is based not only on quality, but on resistance to disease and general ease of culture as observed throughout Ohio this past season."





GLOXINIA CULTURE

Gloxinias are fit companions for the tuberous rooted Begonias and the fancy leaved Caladiums. Their richly colored flowers are most outstanding. Start the tubers in 4-inch pots in a mixture of leaf mold, sand and a little well-rotted cow manure with good bottom heat. Keep shaded and as the leaves appear, be careful with the watering. You cannot do it with the hose, so make use of the old-fashioned way, the watering can, and go over each plant carefully, examine every one and don't apply water unless it is needed, on the other hand, they suffer every bit as much if they don't get water when ready for it, for they want a moist soil. Keep the leaves dry. To get them moist on a hot day early in the morning doesn't hurt, but they soon go if you wet them every time you water the plants. They want most of all a little shade, but if you overdo it you may obtain foliage but no flowers.

TUBEROSES

BEGONIAS TUBEROUS ROOTED BEGONIAS

With its bright colors, richness of foliage and easy culture it has become a favorite with the public in gardens and homes.

EMPLACEMENT. The begonia prefers partial shade and not too warm a place where they will give best results specially in we summers. For the cultivation in greenhouses, shade is necessary.

CULTIVATION. Forcing can be started in February, March or April, depending on the time they should be in flower. The bulbs are placed in boxes, on light porous soil close together, and then covered with earth to a depth of one inch above the bulb. The earth should be kept just moist, too much water will rot the bulbs.

When the plants begin to develop they are placed in pots.

PLANTING OUTSIDE. In May-June (according to climate) they can be planted outside, preferable in loose soil, and shaded for some days after planting. The distance between the plantis should be about 8 inches. A teaspoonful of ammonium phosphate around each plant added in July will stimulate growth and flowers.





SPECIFIC RECOMMENDATIONS FOR SHADING MUMS

- 1. Plant early, not later than June 1.
- 2. Use black shades covering tops and sides (64 x 104 thread count or lightweight rubberized cloth.) Best results are obtained when the light intensity under cloth is 2 foot candles or less. If greater than 2 foot candles, blooming is delayed and may be uneven.
- 3. Cover from 5 P. M. until 7 A. M.
- 4. Treatment started July 15 and followed in weekly succession of the same variety will result in a succession of bloom
- 5. Remove cloth on pompons after buds show color; this is usually from 35 to 40 days after treatment starts. (Extreme heat during the treatment will increase the time of application.)
- 6. Standards should be treated for 30 to 35 days or when buds are at least ½ inch in diameter.
- 7. The early and midseason varieties should be used and only those that have been tried sufficiently to warrant their use. Best results are obtained when

- varieties of the same blooming period are used for one particular shading.
- 8. Treated late varieties will flower with midseason varieties grown under normal treatment.
- 9. Pompons grown under aster cloth and covered with black cloth from 5 P. M. to 7 A. M. produce very satisfactory growth and deeper colors than when grown in the greenhouse. Without the use of aster cloth only soft growing varieties are advised, otherwise short, stubby growth will result. Occasionally during cloudy, moist seasons, good growth is secured without aster
- 10. Standards grown under aster cloth may be damaged by rains in the fall; therefore, the practice is subject to heavy losses. If provisions are made to protect the flowers by means of sash, the practice is satisfactory.
- 11. To save cloth, it may be used from 3 P. M. until darkness and then shifted to another bench and the plants covered until 10 A. M. the next morning. Only cloth which eliminates the light entirely is suitable for this purpose.






