Morton's Pasture Mixture

The Colorado State College of Agriculture and Mechanical Arts recommends the following ratio for a well-balanced permanent pasture mixture and gives these quantities as the proper amounts to sow per acre, reseeding the clover every two years:

Orchard Grass	15 lbs.
Brome Grass or Bromus Inermis	15 lbs.
Meadow Fescue	10 lbs.
Timothy	6 lbs.
Yellow Blossom Sweet Clover	4 lbs.

Mixture For Alkaline Lands

Experiments conducted under supervision of the Department of Botany of the Colorado Agriculture College have shown that the following mixture gives fine results on land infested with alkali:

- Yellow Sweet Clover (*Melilotus officinalis*) 6 lbs.
- Slender Wheat Grass or Western Grass (*Agropyrum tenerum*) 8 lbs.
- Meadow Fescue or English Blue Grass 6 lbs.
- Brome Grass or *Bromus inermis* 6 lbs.
- Red Top 4 lbs.

Mixtures
 Under 10 lbs. 35c; Under 100 lbs. 29c; Over 100 lbs. 28c

Sow the grass seeds separately from the timothy and clover. The better the quality of the seeds used in the mixture, the better the stand obtained.

Most of our grain, corn and potato seed is grown in an altitude from 6,000 to 7,500 feet, and gives very satisfactory results when planted here or in lower altitudes.

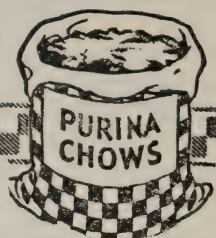
